The 2nd Annual National Parliamentary Training Symposium will be hosted by **The Centre for Parliamentary Studies and Training (CPST)**. This symposium seeks to provide an opportunity for Parliament, County Assemblies, County Executives, Ethics and Anti-corruption Commission (EACC) and other stake holders to share their experiences in combating corruption on the theme: *'The Role of Legislatures in the Fight against corruption.'* This Symposium is meant to provide an opportunity for the participants to come together and to share knowledge, different experiences and best practices on their mandates, roles and functions based on the theme. The theme will have the following sub themes:

Sub Themes

Submission Guidelines

- The abstracts and/or posters not exceeding 300 words should be submitted online using the following link: centreforparliamentarystudies@gmail.com
- Abstracts should clearly highlight the objective, problem, methodology, key findings/results, conclusions, recommendations and six key words. Also purely theoretical papers focusing on the sub-themes will be accepted.
- Each abstract should include the name of the author(s), affiliation(s), postal address, e-mail, and Telephone Contacts. The length of the abstract should be 300 words.
- Each full paper should **Not Exceed 5,000 words** (excluding abstract, references and footnotes), Single Spacing Font Size 12, Times New Roman, Tables and Figures Inserted where first cited, Ms Word Format.
- The abstract and the full paper should follow the APA format of referencing.
- All references listed should be cited appropriately in the text.
