**WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 5, 2016**

1. The House assembled at thirty minutes past Nine O'clock.
2. The Proceedings were opened with Prayer.
3. **PRESIDING** – the Hon. Deputy Speaker.

There being no quorum to commence proceedings, the Deputy Speaker ordered that the Quorum Bell be rang for ten minutes.

And quorum not being present after ten minutes, the Deputy Speaker ordered that the Quorum Bell be rang for a further five minutes;

And Quorum being present proceedings commenced.

4. **PETITIONS**

Rising in his place on a Point of Order, the Member for Chuka Igambang'ombe (Hon. Muthomi Njuki, MP) raised a concern over the delay by the Departmental Committee on Labour and Social Welfare to table its report on a Petition he presented on 24<sup>th</sup> November, 2015 regarding alleged mismanagement and misappropriation of funds by the Kenya Swimming Federation, yet the Standing Orders require Committees to consider and report on Petitions within sixty (60) days.

The Deputy Speaker directed that the Committee should expeditiously apprise the House on the status of the said Petition.

That, the Kenyatta Mausoleum Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 11 of 2016) be now read a Second Time;

7. MOTION – DEPLOYMENT OF CHAPLAINS TO LEARNING INSTITUTIONS

Motion made and Question proposed;

**THAT**, aware that cases of unbecoming conduct among young people has been on the rise as exemplified by runaway drug abuse and addiction, drunkenness, sexual orgies and general irresponsibility; and deeply concerned that these incidents of loose morals have been worsened in the recent past by emerging radicalization of the youth leading to inclination towards terrorism and lawlessness, this House **urges** the National Government to consider deploying chaplains to all secondary schools and tertiary institutions in order to instill desired morals, social virtues, national values and a sense of responsibility, to address and root out moral decadence at an early age, and to supplement the work of guidance and counseling departments operating in these institutions.
