6. STATEMENTS PURSUANT TO STANDING ORDER 45 (2) (b)

a) The Senator for Vihiga County (Sen. George Khaniri) sought a Statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Health regarding the status of the National Government's Kshs. 38 billion project to lease medical equipment for county hospitals.

A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty minutes for the Mover, twenty minutes for the Majority Party Official Responder, twenty minutes for the Minority Party Official Responder and fifteen minutes for each other Senator speaking and that fifteen minutes before the time expires, the Mover shall be called upon to reply.

And there being no Senator wishing to contribute;

Before the Question was put, and pursuant to Standing Order No. 72, the Speaker informed the House that the Motion did not affect Counties.
