THAT, aware that the Kenya Police Medical Examination (P3) form is a legal document that is produced in a court of law as evidence in cases which involve body injury; noting that victims are required to have the P3 form completed by a certified public medical officer; further aware that the victims are charged a fee for this service by the hospitals attending to this particular service; concerned that most citizens are financially challenged hence the medical fee charged by the hospitals, is in contravention of Article 48 of the Constitution on access to justice; deeply concerned that if the situation is left unchecked, it may lead to continued abuse of the poor, delayed justice and possible incidents of unrest; this House urges the Government to ensure that completion of P3 forms is offered free of charge at all public healthcare facilities.

THAT, aware that there are many talents amongst the youth of this country; having noted that this talents have been severally displayed through various inventions and innovations by the youth in platforms such as the Science Congress and the Annual Youth

Innovation Week; concerned, that most of these discoveries do not go beyond making sensational newspaper and electronic media stories; noting that most of these innovations are aimed at addressing the problems that afflict us as Kenyans on a daily basis; further concerned that there is inadequate enabling legislation and administrative measures to support these innovations; cognizant of the fact that the Kenya Vision 2030 seeks to make our country an industrialized middle-income economy in the next 14 years; aware of the immense potential for wealth creation and job opportunities that such innovations would generate if well-developed and commercialized; also recognizing that our imports are well in excess of Kshs. 1.3 billion shillings, a gap that would be narrowed if we had our own local production, this House urges the Government to support youth innovation by creating an innovation fund and a national incubation system, among other measures.

THAT, aware that the Government banned the importation of Genetically Modified Organisms (GMO) imports in 2012; further aware that the Ministry of Health which initiated the ban has consistently maintained that GMO foods are not safe for human and animal consumption; considering that no tangible evidence on the same has been provided; cognizant of the fact that local and international scientific institutions and stakeholders have consistently endorsed the use of GMO foods as a necessary measure for the present and future food security in the Country; concerned that the National Bio-Safety Authority (NBA) established under Bio-Safety Act was not involved in the decision to ban the use of GMO foods in the country; concerned that the Country continues to lose millions of shillings monthly in lost business opportunities related to GMO products; further concerned that research on bio-technology and bio-safety has stalled; this House Resolves to establish a Select Committee to comprehensively investigate and inquire into all matters relating to GMOs, consider and review all related research findings and make recommendations and table its report within ninety (90) days and approves the following Members to constitute the Committee:

THAT, aware that Free Primary Education is an important milestone to economic and social development in the country; further aware that since the introduction of Free Primary Education (FPE) in 2002, the Government has spent huge amount of money on the programme; noting that the recent Report by the Ministry of Education submitted to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC)indicated that the Government could be losing millions of capitation funds in public schools through inflated enrollment figures, fraudulent deals that include irregular allocation of funds, procurement of goods and questionable expenditure by Head teachers; concerned that the spirit of FPE was to provide a chance to every student in the country to acquire free education, giving effect to Article 43(1)(f) of the Constitution; noting that most Head teachers do not possess requisite financial management skills to proficiently handle FPE funds; this House urges that the Government, through County Education Boards to recruit School Bursars to ensure prudent utilization/management of FPE funds disbursed to various schools in the country.

James Lusweti, UTILIZATION/MANAGEMENT OF FPE FUNDS MP (Kabuchai THAT, aware that Free Primary Education is an important milestone to economic Constituency) and social development in the country; further aware that since the introduction of Free Primary Education (FPE) in 2002, the Government has spent huge amount of money on the programme; noting that the recent Report by the Ministry of Education submitted to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC)indicated that the Government could be losing millions of capitation funds in public schools through inflated enrollment figures, fraudulent deals that include irregular allocation of funds, procurement of goods and questionable expenditure by Head teachers; concerned that the spirit of FPE was to provide a chance to every student in the country to acquire free education, giving effect to Article 43(1)(f) of the Constitution; noting that most Head teachers do not possess requisite financial management skills to proficiently handle FPE funds; this House urges that the Government, through County Education Boards to recruit School Bursars to ensure prudent utilization/management of FPE funds disbursed to various schools in the country. 15. MOTION – ESTABLISHMENT OF A COMPREHENSIVE POLICY TO GUARANTEE Hon. Joyce CAREER ADVANCEMENT, PROMOTIONS AND SECURITY OF TENURE FOR Emanikor, MP **PUBLIC SERVANTS** (Turkana County) THAT, aware that a sufficiently skilled and trained workforce is an essential pillar for attainment of Kenya's Vision 2030; further aware that the number of doctors, accountants, engineers, teachers, nurses, lecturers, scientists and other professionals in the public sector undertaking further studies of specialized skills within or outside the country is on the increase: deeply concerned that quite a number of professionals seemingly get demoralized by the fact that on returning from studies abroad or after undertaking further studies locally they are either deployed to lower positions, placed below supervisors whose skills they exceed or stagnate in the same position they were before furthering their skills; further concerned by the fact that most of them thereafter opt to leave the public service for the private sector, civil society or Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) or even migrate abroad in search of greener pastures leading to regrettable brain drain; this House resolves that the Government establishes a comprehensive policy to guarantee career advancement, promotions and security of tenure for public servants and officers who undertake to refine their skills through further studies. MOTION - INSTALLATION OF CLOSED CIRCUIT TELEVISION (CCTV) CAMERAS 16. Hon. Robert Mbui, IN PUBLIC BOARDING SECONDARY SCHOOLS MP (Kathiani THAT, aware that incidences of buildings in public boarding secondary schools being Constituency) torched by unruly students are on the rise; concerned that most perpetrators of the dastardly acts of arson in schools go unpunished due to the difficulty in establishing a nexus between them and the acts; deeply worried that students behind arson in various schools evade responsibility by seeking admission in other schools where

they transfer similar vices; afraid that if left unabated, this trend will turn dormitories

in public boarding secondary schools to death traps for innocent students and expose school properties to the risk of arbitrary destruction by riotous students; cognizant of the duty to preserve the lives of innocent students and school properties from the incessant threat of arson; appreciating the role of Information and Communications Technology (ICT) in enhancing security surveillance; this House urges that the Government speedily rolls out installation of Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) cameras in strategic locations in all public boarding secondary schools as an enhanced security mechanism for surveillance of students' activities; makes provisions for regular and mandatory checks to confirm compliance and enforcement of the mechanism; and enforces strict admission criteria, including maintenance of a profile of alleged perpetrators of arson to ensure that they do not escape liability by transferring to other schools without proper screening.

2. PARTY - SPONSORED MOTION -ESTABLISHMENT OF A SELECT COMMITTEE TO INQUIRE INTO THE BETTING AND GAMBLING INDUSTRY IN KENYA

(The Deputy Leader of Minority Party)

THAT, aware that the betting and gambling industry in Kenya has attracted a lot of public interest in the recent past, leading to its exponential growth; further aware that the services of betting companies like Sportpesa, Elibet, Betway, Betin Kenya and mCheza, among many others are now easily accessible via online and mobile platforms; deeply concerned that the industry is facing a myriad of challenges such as weak and insufficient regulatory and institutional frameworks, proliferation of betting and gambling activities and attendant negative societal impacts; also cognizant of claims of malpractices in some of the betting, gaming and casino businesses in form of tax evasion, tax avoidance, money laundering, manipulated disclosures and misrepresentation of information; appreciating the fact that the Government has a role in strengthening the licensing and collection of tax revenues from the industry while ensuring its sustainability; further noting that while the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution has devolved the functions of betting and gambling to the county governments, Articles 95(2), 189(2) and 191(1) and (2) of the Constitution obligate the national Government, through Parliament, to resolve issues of concern to the people and pass law to ensure uniformity of action across the country; mindful of the fact that in several developed jurisdictions, betting and gaming activities are regulated in the same manner as other financial sectors such as insurance, banking and stock exchange with regard to disclosures of information, conflict of interest, enforcement of age limits of participants, audit, regular financial reporting, licensing and taxation; this House resolves

- (i) establish a Select Committee to inquire into all the activities of the betting, gaming and gambling industry with regard to tax compliance, claims of financial impropriety, identifying the common irregularities and lacunas in regulation, benefits to the society and the Country; identify best practices from other jurisdictions on the management of proceeds from betting activities; and report its recommendations to the House, including and proposals for remedial measures and legislation, within a period of sixty (60) days; and,
