3. <u>COMMUNICATION FROM THE CHAIR ON THE SPECIAL SITTING OF</u> PARLIAMENT

The Speaker conveyed the following communication from the Chair-

"Honourable Senators,

As you may be aware, Article 132(1)(b) of the Constitution and Standing Order 22(1) of the Senate Standing Orders, requires the President to address a Special Sitting of Parliament once every year and at any other time.

By a letter Ref. No. OP/CAB.1/40 dated 16th March, 2015, addressed to the Clerks of Parliament, the office of the President requested Parliament to set a date for the Presidential address to Parliament. Upon the Speaker consulting the Speaker of the National Assembly, it was resolved that H.E the President addresses Parliament on Thursday 26th March, 2015.

Honourable Senators,

This is therefore to inform you that a Special Sitting of Parliament will be held on Thursday, 26th March, 2015 at 2.30 pm, in the National Assembly Chamber. H.E the President will also use the occasion, pursuant to Article 132(1)(c) (i) to report, on all the measures taken and the progress achieved in the realization of the national values set out in Article 10 of the Constitution. Further, pursuant to Article 240 (7) of the Constitution, H.E the President will also report on the state of security of Kenya.

I therefore urge all Honourable Senators to attend the Special Sitting which is an important occasion in the calendar of Parliament that provides the opportunity for H.E the President, to deliver the State of the Nation Address and to address the Legislature and the people of Kenya on critical matters concerning the country.

Honourable Senators,

Due to limited sitting space, Senators and Members of the National Assembly will be at liberty to invite one guest each for the occasion and you are hereby requested to provide the names of such guests at the Senate reception to facilitate the preparation of formal invitation cards.

Honourable Senators,

The Special Sitting has necessitated a re-arrangement of parking. Consequently, the current Senators' parking area here at the Main Parliament Building will be unavailable for parking on Thursday, 26th March, 2015. Please do also note that access to Parliament through the parking area formerly known as the Ministers Gate will remain restricted from tomorrow, 25th March, 2015, to facilitate the pitching of tents for refreshments for that particular day.

Alternative arrangements have been made for parking at the COMESA Grounds of the KICC and I urge Hon. Senators to bear with the situation.
