4. <u>COMMUNICATION FROM THE CHAIR</u>

The Speaker conveyed the following Communications -

(a) <u>Demise of the Hon. Soita Shitanda, EGH, former Member for Malava Constituency</u>

"Honourable Members,

It is with deep sorrow that I have learnt of the demise of the Hon. Peter Soita Shitanda, EGH, MP. The late Hon. Shitanda, a former Member for Malava Constituency, passed on, on Tuesday, 24th May 2016 while undergoing treatment.

Honourable Members, the late Hon. Shitanda was born on 9th November 1958 in Malava, Kakamega County. He attended Malava Boys High School before joining Kenya Polytechnic where he trained as an accountant. In 1979, he joined the Civil Service as an Accounts Trainee in the Ministry of Finance, where he rose through the ranks to become an Accountant I. The late Hon. Shitanda joined politics in 1997 and was elected as Member for Malava Constituency, which he represented in the 8th, 9th and 10th Parliaments successively. Before his appointment to the Cabinet, he was a good debater, an astute Member of various House Committees, among them being the Committee on Legal Affairs and a charismatic chair of the Public Accounts Committee and the Finance Committee.

Honourable Members, in 2004, the late Hon. Shitanda was appointed to the Cabinet as an Assistant Minister for Public Service in the Office of the President. He was later elevated to the position of Minister for Housing in 2005, a portfolio he held till March 2013. The late Hon. Shitanda will be remembered for instituting various strategic reforms regarding housing for Civil Servants while at the helm of the Ministry of Housing. He introduced a housing scheme for civil servants and also streamlined and re-organizing the National Housing Corporation to enable it undertake more housing projects with a view to bridging the housing deficit for civil servants. He also foresaw

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implementation of the National Housing Policy and the Kenya Slum Upgrading Programme in various parts of the country. Until the time of his demise, the late Hon. Shitanda was the Chairman of the Agricultural Development Corporation (ADC).

Honourable Members, on behalf of all Members of the National Assembly, that of the Parliamentary Service Commission and indeed on my own behalf, I wish to convey our condolences to his family, family friends and the people of Malava Constituency for the great loss. As the National Assembly, we assure the family of our support during this period of grief. In honour of the exemplary and illustrious service rendered to the nation and society by the late Hon. Shitanda, I now request that we all stand to observe a minute of silence.

May his soul rest in eternal peace.

(b) Special Sitting of the National Assembly on Thursday, May 26, 2016

"Honourable Members,

"I wish to welcome you back from your briefly-interrupted Recess. This Special Sitting has been necessitated by urgent emerging issues regarding which this Honourable House needs to address itself.

Honourable Members, you may recall that on 19th April 2016, this House passed the Anti-Doping Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 6 of 2016) aimed at giving effect to the UNESCO Convention Against Doping in Sport, to protect athletes' health by regulating sporting activities free from use of prohibited substances, and to establish the Anti-Doping Agency. The Bill was subsequently assented to by H.E. the President on 22nd April 2016.

However, new developments have since emerged necessitating the need to review the Anti-Doping law. As a result, this House needs to deliberate on amendments to the Anti-Doping Act so as to align it to international best practice as agreed upon with the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), particularly in view of the upcoming Olympic Games in Rio, Brazil.

To this end, I did notify Members of the National Assembly concerning this Special Sitting vide Kenya Gazette Notice No. 3570 on 19th May 2016. This Special Sitting is therefore properly convened. I wish Members fruitful deliberations in the two sittings today as the House considers the crucial Anti-Doping (Amendment) Bill given the time constraints pertaining to its enactment, and Nominees to various Constituency Development Fund Committees.

Further to this, Honourable Members, I have received a request from the Departmental Committee on Labour and Social Welfare seeking leave to convene and consider proposed amendments to the Anti-Doping (Amendment) Bill by the Leader of the Majority Party. I am aware that the Chairperson of the Committee was recently part of a high-powered Delegation that met senior WADA officials in Montreal, Canada. He is therefore well apprised with the issues that have occasioned the review of the Anti-Doping Act.

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For these reasons, I will allow the Committee to meet from 10.30am today with a view to confirming that the final version of the Bill fully accommodates WADA's concerns. This will give the House an opportunity to consider any recommendations of the Committee during Committee of the Whole House Stage this afternoon.
