5. <u>PETITION ON THE MANAGEMENT AND OPERATIONS OF THE NANDI</u> COUNTY EXECUTIVE AND COUNTY ASSEMBLY

- **i.** The Senator for Meru County (Sen. Kiraitu Murungi) sought a Statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on National Security and Foreign Relations concerning banditry attack at Kithiorone area of Meru County.
- **ii.** The Chairperson of the Standing Committee on National Security and Foreign Relations issued a Statement concerning rising insecurity within Nandi County, sought by the Senator for Nandi County (Sen. Stephen Sang).

Thereupon, the Chairperson informed the Senate that the Government was not aware of the increased incidents of insecurity in Nandi County but was aware of isolated cases of motor-cycle thefts and burglary reported in Kapsabet and Mosoriot towns which have been investigated and appropriate action taken accordingly.

The Senate was also informed that on the night of 12th August, 2015, three suspects were apprehended by members of the public for house breaking and stealing of a television set in Ndaptabwa area and that the suspects were booked at Mosoriot Police Station and processed for court.

The Chairperson noted that on the following night, the three suspects escaped from police custody and investigations into the escape were initiated vide Inquiry File No. 2/2015.

The Chairperson further reported that the Government was not aware of collusion between the County Government officials and suspected criminals to issue fake boda-boda operating licenses and stickers to unsuspecting law abiding operators.
