## 4. **STATEMENTS**

## Statements Pursuant to Standing Order 45(2)(b)

- i.) The Senator for Bomet County (Sen. (Prof.) Wilfred Lesan) sought a statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Education regarding the publication and distribution of books and other educational materials to public primary and secondary schools.
- ii.) The Senator for West Pokot County (Sen. (Prof.) John Lonyangapuo) sought a statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Education regarding the status of the new technical colleges initiated by the Kenya Government for the period 2013-2017.
- iii.) The Vice-Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries, (Sen. Ole Ndiema) issued a statement regarding preparedness for planting season and supply of fertilizers and other farm inputs to farmers.

In the statement, the Vice-Chairperson informed the Senate that the Ministry in collaboration with the National Cereals and Produce Board (NCPB) concluded procurement of fertilizers for year 2017 long rains in December 2016. He further informed the Senate that contracts for 238, 000 metric tonnes were signed and distribution has started to various NCPB depots country-wide.

In addition, the Ministry procured 749 metric tonnes of assorted seeds of drought tolerant crops such as sorghum, cow peas and pigeon peas worth Ksh 133 million for distribution to the counties from the first week of March 2017, which will benefit about 104,000 farmers countrywide. The Vice-Chairperson stated that as of 26<sup>th</sup> February, 2017, 260,000 bags had been distributed and exercise was ongoing. He asserted that to avert future delays in the supply of fertilizer and other farm inputs, the Ministry of Agriculture has signed a two year contract for supply and delivery of fertilizers and other farm inputs. Further, fertilizers and other farm inputs now have a budget line and so there will be ease of planning, acquisition and distribution. Other measures include; irrigated seed production by Kenya Seed Company and implementation of the National Subsidy Fertilizer Programme.
