#### 4. STATEMENTS

### (a) Statements Pursuant to Standing Order 45(2) (b)

- i) The Senator for Homa Bay County (Sen. Moses Otieno Kajwang') sought a statement from the Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Land and Natural Resources on the water hyacinth menace in Lake Victoria.
- ii) The Chairperson, Standing Committee on Health issued a statement regarding the safety and security of Mr. Bernard Muchere, Head of Audit at the Ministry of Health.

In the statement, the Chairperson stated that he had spoken with Mr. Muchere who confirmed that he had not received any threats to his life nor had he reported any matter to the police concerning his safety and security. The Chairperson further informed the Senate that the Committee had written to the Cabinet Secretary for Interior and requested that Mr. Muchere's security be ensured.

The Chairperson undertook to issue a substantive statement on the alleged loss and pilferage of public funds at the Ministry of Health, in a week's time.

iii) The Chairperson of the Standing Committee on National Security and Foreign Relations issued a Statement on the plight of Kenyans who had sought refuge in Uganda, who had been camping at the gate of Parliament since 10<sup>th</sup> October, 2016.

In the Statement, the Chairperson informed the Senate that the Government was aware of the group of returnees camping along Parliament road. The Senate was informed that a taskforce had been put in place with a mandate to facilitate repatriation of refugees to Kenya and that the team and executed their mandate. He added that 246 persons were cleared to be repatriated and further that all of them had since been compensated in cash.

The Chairperson further informed the House that on closer scrutiny of the list provided by the leader of the returnees, the government had noted a discrepancy between the list provided by the returnees and that held by the Government. Consequently, the UNHCR was helping the Government to sort out the discrepancies to avoid situations where some people may take advantage of the process.

The Chairperson informed the House that the returnees had since been moved from the gate of Parliament Buildings and that he would report to the House where they had been relocated to on Tuesday, 8<sup>th</sup> November, 2016.

iv) The Chairperson of the Standing Committee on National Security and Foreign Relations issued a Statement on the current status of the National Security Communication Network and Surveillance System for the National Police Service.

In his statement, the Chairperson stated that the National Security Communication Network and Surveillance System for the National Police was a high security matter which could only be released to vetted persons in a meeting held in *camera*. The Chairperson undertook to issue a substantive statement in a meeting that will be held *in camera*.
