8. MOTION - RECRUITMENT OF SCHOOL BURSARS TO ENSURE PRUDENT UTILIZATION/MANAGEMENT OF FREE PRIMARY EDUCATION FUNDS

Motion made and Question proposed –

THAT, aware that Free Primary Education is an important milestone to economic and social development in the country; further aware that since the introduction of Free Primary Education (FPE) in 2002, the Government has spent huge amount of money on the programme; noting that the recent Report by the Ministry of Education submitted to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC) indicated that the Government could be losing millions of capitation funds in public schools through inflated enrollment figures, fraudulent deals that include irregular allocation of funds, procurement of goods and questionable expenditure by Head teachers; concerned that the spirit of FPE was to provide a chance to every student in the country to acquire free education, giving effect to Article 43(1)(f) of the Constitution; noting that most Head teachers do not possess requisite financial management skills to proficiently handle FPE funds; this House **urges** that the Government, through County Education Boards to recruit School Bursars to ensure prudent utilization/management of FPE funds disbursed to various schools in the county.
