THAT, aware that the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC) is currently conducting country wide mass voter registration; **further aware** that this activity forms an integral component of democracy and specifically the exercise of universal suffrage; **appreciating** the fact that as elected national leaders, Members of Parliament are key stakeholders in the process; **concerned** that unlike in the previous dispensation where the Executive, as part of the House, would regularly apprise the House on progress of such

activities; **also concerned** that Parliament is oblivious of the current progress; **further concerned** of reports of low voter turnout in the current enlisting; **noting** the need for the deployment of a persuasive mechanism to encourage voter registration and participation in election of all identity card holders in the country; **further noting** that this would go a long way in the furtherance of Article 38 of the Constitution; this House **instructs** the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs to urgently formulate and propose persuasive and compelling mechanisms, for consideration by Parliament, to motivate and encourage all unregistered citizens to register.
