Honourable Senators,

As you may recall, on Thursday 21st April, 2016, this House debated and passed the Anti-Doping Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 6 of 2016) without amendments. The Bill was subsequently assented to within the deadline as set by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA). However, the World Anti-Doping Agency later indicated, to the Government, the need to align various provisions of the Act with the United Nations Education Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) Convention Against Anti-Doping in Sports. This is what this Bill is addressing.

Honourable Senators,
