6. STATEMENTS PURSUANT TO STANDING ORDER 45(2)(b)

a) The Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Health (Sen. (Dr.) Machage) issued a statement regarding conditional allocations to County Governments for leasing of medical equipment.

In the statement, the Chairperson informed the Senate that the Managed Equipment Services (MES) Program entailed equipping 98 hospitals countrywide, that is two hospitals in each county and 4 national hospitals, with specialized medical equipment. The National Government had signed five contracts for the supply of medical equipment and related services under the MES Program and allocated Kshs.4.5 billion each in the 2015/2016 and 2016/2017 financial years towards the Project.

Thereafter, the Chairperson informed the House of the counties that had received the equipment and the dates of commissioning, the cost of each equipment lot, the working conditions of the equipment (post-supply), and the number of hospitals that had functioning Intensive Care Units following supply of equipment under the MES Program.

Following supplementary questions received from Hon. Senators, the Chairperson undertook to provide further information on the MES Program at a later date.

- b) The Vice-Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Education issued a statement on the lecturer's strike that had since been called off following successful conclusion of negotiations between the lecturers and their employers. The Vice-Chairperson informed the Senate that a lot of progress had been made regarding the implementation of the Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) between lecturers and their employers and that the government had committed Ksh10 billion for the implementation of the CBA.
- c) A member of the Standing Committee on Education (Sen. (Dr.) Agnes Zani) issued a statement on delay by the Teachers Service Commission (TSC) to promote teachers in Isiolo County.

In the statement, the Senator informed the House that the number of teachers submitting Diploma and Degree certificates to TSC had surpassed the funded establishment, which had rendered promotion on attainment of higher qualification financially unsustainable. The decision to delay promotions in recognition of higher qualifications therefore affected all teachers in the country and not only those from Isiolo.

Furthermore, the Senator informed the House that, since 2014, the TSC required that for one to be registered, employed or promoted as a Graduate Teacher, he or she must have scored a mean grade of C+ (Plus) and above in KCSE.
