3. **COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CHAIR**

(a) welcome remarks on convening of the special sitting

Honourable Senators,

Let me take this opportunity to welcome you back for this Special Sitting during the Fifth Session of the Senate and thank you for finding time from your busy schedules to attend the sitting. I am aware of the busy schedules each of you has at such a critical time as this in our election calendar.

Honourable Senators,

By a letter dated 5th June, 2017, and pursuant to Standing Order 29 (1) of the Senate, the Senate Majority Leader and Senate Minority Leader supported by the requisite number of Senators, requested the Speaker to convene a Special Sitting of the Senate to conclude consideration of the following business.

(a) The Division of Revenue Bill, 2017 and other Bills pending before the Senate; and

(b) Petitions due for presentation or reporting to the Senate.

Honourable Senators,

Following consideration of the request by the Senate Majority Leader and the Senate Minority Leader, I was satisfied that it met the requirements of Standing Order 29 (2). It is in this respect that I convened this special sitting of the Senate via *Gazette Notice* No. 5338 dated 7th June, 2017.

Honourable Senators,

As required by Standing Order 29 (5), the Gazette Notice specified the business to be transacted at this sitting and it is the business scheduled in today's Order Paper. Indeed, as specified and in accordance with standing order 29(5) of the Senate, the business listed shall be the only business before the Senate during this Special Sitting.

Honourable Senators.

Although this special sitting comes at a time when we have officially entered into the official campaign period for the August, 2017 general elections, the Senate has to discharge its mandate up to the end of its term. I am glad that you all heeded to the call of your constitutional duty and came. I would like to reiterate that in accordance with Article 123 of the Constitution and standing order 71, for the Senate to approve some of the business scheduled in today's Order Paper, the support of a majority of all delegations (that is 24 delegations) is required.

I therefore urge you all to remain in the Chamber for the transaction of business as scheduled and until its conclusion.

(b) <u>Kamukunji</u> on the Report of the Procedure and Rules Committee on the proposed amendments to the Senate Standing Orders

Honourable Senators.

As you may recall, the Procedure and Rules Committee has, since September 2016, been undertaking a comprehensive review of the Senate Standing Orders. This is in line with its mandate under Standing Order 249 requiring the Committee to carry out such a review 'at least once in every term of Parliament.'

In undertaking this exercise, the Committee invited and received submissions from Hon. Senators, the Office of the Clerk, and members of the public.

Honourable Senators,

The Committee has since concluded this exercise and prepared a Report, which is due to be tabled in the Senate next week when the House resumes from recess.

It is in this regard that a *Kamukunji* has been scheduled to enable the Committee take Hon. Senators through the proposed amendments, before the Report is tabled in the House.

The Kamukunji will be held in the Senate Chamber on Tuesday, 13th June, 2017 at 11.00 am.

I invite and urge all Senators to attend this important briefing.

WHEREAS, the Division of Revenue (No.2) Bill (National Assembly Bill No.22 of 2017) was published *vide* the Kenya *Gazette* Supplement No. 69 of May 12, 2017 to provide for the equitable division of revenue raised nationally between the national and county governments in the 2017/2018 financial year;

WHEREAS, on Tuesday, May 30, 2017, the National Assembly considered and **passed** the said Bill **with amendments** and in the form attached hereto;

NOW THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Article 110(4) of the Constitution and Standing Order 41 of the National Assembly Standing Orders, I hereby refer the said Bill to the Senate for consideration."
