7. STATEMENT - STATUS OF GOVERNMENT REGULATIONS

- (i) The Basic Education Regulations, 2015 were published on April 8, 2015 and transmitted to the Office of the Clerk on Wednesday, April 15, 2015 for tabling in the House as required. Therefore, the Committee was yet to consider them.
- (ii) The National Police Service Commission (Recruitment and Appointment) Regulations, 2015: The Committee considered and approved the regulations. Consequently, its resolutions were conveyed to the National Police Service Commission by the Clerk of the National Assembly pursuant to Standing Order 210 (4) (a).
- (iii) The Equalization Fund Regulations, 2015:- The Committee was in the process of considering the regulations.
