*(Thereafter, the House to adjourn without question put)*

**MOTION – (The Leader of the Majority Party)**

**THAT, pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 28, this House adjourns until Tuesday, February 10, 2015 in accordance with the Calendar of the Assembly (Regular Sessions).**

**The House resolved on Wednesday, February 12, 2014 as follows:-**

- II. THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on any **Bill** shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and forty five (45) minutes in replying, a maximum of twenty (20) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that Order.
- III. THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on a **Report of a Committee**, including a Report of a Joint Committee of the Houses of Parliament or any other Report presented to the House, shall be limited as follows: - A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that Order.

**IV. THAT,** notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), the debate on any Motion for the **Adjournment** of the House to a day other than the next normal Sitting Day in accordance with the Calendar of the Assembly, shall be limited to a maximum of three (3) hours with not more than five (5) minutes for each Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of ten (10) minutes each; and that priority be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order.

**Provided that, when the period of Recess proposed by any such motion does not exceed fifteen (15) days, the debate shall be limited to a maximum of thirty minutes (30), and shall be strictly confined to the question of the adjournment.**

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
