<u>Questions to the Cabinet Secretary for Interior and Coordination of National</u> <u>Government:</u>

(i) Question No. 032/2014 by the Member for Marsabit County (Hon. Nasra Ibren, M.P.): -

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee on the measures the government has put in place to protect the religious rights of all citizens, and in particular the plans to tackle discrimination against members of the Muslim faith applying for passports which range from undergoing rigorous processes to the demand for the removal of veils by Muslim women during photo-taking?

#### II. Questions under the Departmental Committee on Land

#### Questions to the Cabinet Secretary for Land, Housing and Urban Development:

(i) Question No. 039/2014 by the Member for Kibwezi East Constituency (Hon. Jessica N. K. Mbalu, M.P.):-

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee on measures in place to conduct and conclude the demarcation and survey of unregistered settlement schemes and issuance of title deeds thereof, together with plans if any to scrap or reduce levies and land registration costs particularly for poor landless Kenyans such as those in Kibwezi East Constituency who are required to pay Settlement Fund Trust Levies of up to Ksh 2,500 per acre yet the schemes were created to re-settle the landless or those reallocated by government for game reserves and conservancy lands?

### (ii) Question No. 040/2014 by the Member for Matayos Constituency (Hon. Geoffrey Odanga, M.P.):-

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee on land adjudication progress in the country, and in particular the rightful ownership of the public land referred to as *Nasewa Nucleus Estate L.R. No. Bukhayo/Nasewa/1500* as well as the status of the implementation of the recommendations of the Report of the Joint Committees on Agriculture, Livestock and Cooperatives; Environment and Natural Resources; & Lands of the Tenth Parliament on the Petition regarding the illegal acquisition of the said public land by Busia Sugar Company Limited?

#### III. <u>Questions under the Departmental Committee on Transport, Public Works and</u> <u>Housing</u>

#### **Questions to the Cabinet Secretary for Transport and Infrastructure:**

# (i) Question No. 041/2014 by the Member for Wajir East Constituency (Hon. Abass S. Mohamed, M.P.):-

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee on measures the Government is implementing to ensure regional balancing of infrastructure development, and in particular the criteria used to distribute 2,000km of road that led to Wajir County, which is historicaly a marginalized and an underdeveloped area without even a kilometre of bitumen road, being allocated only forty-seven (47) kilometres of road for the Garissa-Wajir Highway (B9) under the Contractor-Facilitated Annuity Financing Mechanism indicated in the Revised Schedule dated August 22, 2014, together with reasons behind the locking out of Wajir from the Kenya Rural Roads Authority (KeRRA)'s slotted allocation yet KeRRA is meant for development of roads in rural areas such as Wajir?

# (ii) Question No. 043/2014 by the Member for Matayos Constituency (Hon. Geoffrey Odanga, M.P.):-

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee the plans the Government has put in place to facilitate people living with disabilities in crossing highways?
