N O T I C E SThe House resolved on Wednesday, February 18, 2015 as follows:-

- I. **THAT**, notwithstanding the resolution made by the House on Wednesday, February 11, 2015, each speech in the debate on **The Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 40 of 2014)** shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the mover, in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying and a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of forty five Minutes (45) each; and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, and the Leader of the Minority Party in that Order.

The House resolved on Wednesday, February 11, 2015 as follows:-

- II. **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on **Bills sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party** shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen minutes (15) in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that Order.
- III. **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on a **Report of a Committee**, including a Report of a Joint Committee of the Houses of Parliament, a Sessional Paper or any other Report submitted to the House, shall be limited as follows: - A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that Order.

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I. Questions under the Departmental Committee on Lands

Questions to the Cabinet Secretary for Land, Housing and Urban Development:

- (i) **Question No. 039/2014 by the Member for Kibwezi East Constituency (Hon. Jessica N. K. Mbalu, M.P.):**-

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee on measures in place to conduct and conclude the demarcation and survey of unregistered settlement schemes and issuance of title deeds thereof, together with plans if any to scrap or reduce levies and land registration

costs particularly for poor landless Kenyans such as those in Kibwezi East Constituency who are required to pay Settlement Fund Trust Levies of up to Ksh 2,500 per acre yet the schemes were created to re-settle the landless or those reallocated by government for game reserves and conservancy lands?

(ii) Question No. 040/2014 by the Member for Matayos Constituency

(Hon. Geoffrey Odanga, M.P.):

Could the Cabinet Secretary apprise the Committee on the progress of land adjudication in the country, and in particular the rightful ownership of the public land referred to as *Nasewa Nucleus Estate L.R. No. Bukhayo/Nasewa/1500* as well as the status of the implementation of the recommendations of the Report of the Joint Committees on Agriculture, Livestock and Cooperatives; Environment and Natural Resources; & Lands of the Tenth Parliament on the Petition regarding the illegal acquisition of the said public land by Busia Sugar Company Limited?

Could the Cabinet Secretary apprise the Committee on the management of sports stadia in the country, and in particular inform the Committee on who is in charge of the maintenance of City Stadium in Nairobi; the amount of funds allocated for maintenance and rehabilitation of the Stadium in the recent past, whether there are plans to allocate funds to the Stadium in the next budgetary allocation and any mechanisms in place to ensure that such allocated funds are put into good use?
