- I . **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on **Bills sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party** shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen minutes (15) in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that Order.
  
  - II . **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on a **Report of a Committee**, including a Report of a Joint Committee of the Houses of Parliament, a Sessional Paper or any other Report submitted to the House, shall be limited as follows: - A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that Order.

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#### **I. Questions under the Departmental Committee on Environment and Natural Resources**

#### **Question to the Cabinet Secretary for Environment, Water and Natural Resources:**

**(i) Question No. 054/2014 by the Member for Kakamega County (The Hon. Rachel Ameso, M.P.):**

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee the measures the Government is putting in place, if any, to protect vital water sources and resources, and in particular, the specific actions the Ministry plans to undertake to tackle the continued encroachment of Nairobi Dam by residents of Kibera Slum, the effects of such encroachment, and the long-term solutions to be pursued in safeguarding this dam, other water reservoirs and sources?

**(ii) Question No. 069/2015 by the Member for Laikipia North Constituency (The Hon. Mathew Lempurkel, M.P.):**

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee the measures that her Ministry has put in place to deal with the perennial human-wildlife conflict in the country, and in particular, apprise Members on the compensation plans for victims of these conflicts in Laikipia North Constituency and in particular, in Elpolei, Kimanyu, Waso, Amakurian and other areas for human lives lost, livestock killed, and crops and trees destroyed?

**(iii) Question No. 070/2015 by the Member for Emuhaya Constituency (The Hon. (Dr.) Wilber Ottichilo, M.P.):**

Could the Cabinet Secretary apprise the Committee on when the Ministry intends to enact laws regarding the management of rivers, lakes and water bodies as per Article 62 (1) of the Constitution, and whether or not the Ministry has compiled a comprehensive database on the current status of all rivers, lakes and water bodies including wetlands in the country?

**II. Question by Private Notice under the Joint Departmental Committees on Administration and National Security; and Education, Research and Technology**

**Question to the Cabinet Secretaries for Interior and Coordination of National Security; and Education, Science and Technology:**

**Question by Private Notice No. PVT/1/2015 by the Member for Kitui East Constituency (The Hon. (Maj. Rtd) Marcus Muluvi, M.P.):**

Could the Cabinet Secretaries apprise Members the measures being undertaken by the Government to protect its citizens including students from internal threats, and in particular, explain to Committee the whereabouts of one Ms. Risper Mutindi Kasyoka Mutua of Ndonguni Sub-location, Maluma Location, Chuluni Division, Nzambani District of Kitui County who until her disappearance following the Garissa University's terrorist attack in April 2015 was a Second Year Business Management student at the institution; and provide urgent response including compelling the University administration to assist in the investigation into the matter so as to bring it to closure considering that her psychologically stressed parents have unsuccessfully searched for her since the attack including seeking assistance from Garissa Police Station and the National Disaster Management officials and undertaking DNA testing on bodies flown from the College.

### **III. Questions under the Departmental Committee on Labour and Social Welfare**

#### **Questions to the Cabinet Secretary for Labour, Social Security and Services:**

**(i) Question No. 036/2015 by the Member for Rabai Constituency (The Hon. Kamoti W. Mwamkale M.P.):**

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee on the observance of workers' rights to fair labour practices as provided for in Article 41 of the Constitution in Export Processing Zones (EPZs) in the Country in particular, by the Hantex Garments Company, an EPZ affiliate at Mazeras in Rabai Constituency; the maximum working hours per day; the average minimum wage for workers vis-à-vis the gazetted minimum rate provided for in Legal Notice No. 197 of 2013; and the action by the Government to ensure respect for workers' rights and entitlements in EPZ companies.

**(ii) Question No. 084/2015 by the Member for Mwingi Central Constituency (The Hon. Joe Musyimi Mutambu, M.P.):**

Considering that the Government launched a social protection plan to enable elderly citizens aged above 65 years to receive Ksh 2,000 per month for upkeep in line with Article 57(d) of the Constitution, could the Cabinet Secretary confirm to the Committee whether the stipend is being disbursed fairly or not; provide the statistics of the programme's current coverage vis-à-vis the population of older members across the country, and measures the Ministry is putting in place to ensure that all deserving and eligible members of the society across the country benefit from the funding?

### **IV. Questions under the Departmental Committee on Finance, Planning and Trade** **Question to the Cabinet Secretary for Industrialization and Enterprise** **Development:**

**(i) Question No. 075/2015 by the Member for Emuhaya Constituency (The Hon. (Dr.) Wilber Ottichilo, M.P.):**

Could the Cabinet Secretary list the projects and activities undertaken by the Kenya Industrial Estates (KIE) in the last five years, their economic impact, and reasons behind failure by KIE to construct and operationalize industrial sheds on land that was allocated in Luanda Town, Vihiga County five years ago?

**(ii) Question 076/2015 by the Member for Sirisia Constituency (The Hon. John Waluke Koyi, M.P.):**

Could the Cabinet Secretary explain the circumstances under which the Kenya Bureau of Standards (KEBS) awarded a three-year vehicle inspection tender to Quality Inspection Services Inc Japan (QISI) despite the obvious conflict of interest considering that QISI is a sister company of Jans Company (Japan) which is Kenya's largest second-hand cars importer; the allegations that QISI has no capacity to inspect motor vehicles which could cause Kenya's second-hand car importers billions of shillings in losses; and whether there are any plans to correct this situation considering that there were other qualified and neutral bidders?

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
