## N O T I C E S

### The House resolved on Wednesday, February 11, 2015 as follows:-

- I. **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on a **Report of a Committee**, including a Report of a Joint Committee of the Houses of Parliament, a Sessional Paper or any other Report submitted to the House, shall be limited as follows: - A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that Order.
- II. **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on **Bills sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party** shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen minutes (15) in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that Order.

#### **I. Questions to the Cabinet Secretary for Interior and Coordination of National Government:**

- (i) Question No. 032/2014 by the Member for Marsabit County (Hon. Nasra Ibren, M.P.): -**

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee on the measures the Government has put in place to protect the religious rights of all citizens, and in particular the plans to address perceived discrimination against members of the Muslim faith applying for

passports which range from undergoing rigorous processes to the demand for the removal of veils by Muslim women during photo-taking?

**(ii) Question No. 033/2014 by the Member for Homa Bay Town Constituency (Hon. Peter Kaluma, M.P.):**

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee on the policy provisions in place with regard to the handling of sensitive security information by officers serving in state security organs, with focus on measures in place both to keep confidential the information on firearms held by civilians in the country and to prevent undue exposure of persons licensed to hold firearms.

**(iii) Question No. 035/2014 by the Member for Kiambu County (Hon. Annah N. Gathecha, M.P.):**

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee on the Government's blueprint for social order in urban areas, particularly in light of the alleged rounding-up and subsequent killings of hawkers in towns by security apparatus, including County *Askaris*, the measures the Government has put in place to safeguard the lives of hawkers in urban areas and the arrangements in place to prosecute the culprits?

**(i) Question No. 050/2014 by the Member for North Horr Constituency (Hon. Chachu Ganya, M.P.):**

What is the status of actualization of the Equalization Fund provided for in Article 204 of the Constitution, and in particular, the planned implementation framework and timelines, considering that over Kshs. 7.1 billion allocated in the last two years has not been utilized?

**(ii) Question No. 051/2014 by the Member for Kakamega County (Hon. Rachel Ameso, M.P.)**

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee on the efforts being made by the Government to ensure the involvement of women, youth and persons with disabilities in economic development activities, and in particular, explain why the online system of company registration has been defective and unresponsive and plans, if any, towards reducing the corporation tax payable by these vulnerable groups?

**III. Question to the Cabinet Secretary for Education, Science and Technology:**

**(i) Question By Private Notice No. PVT/4/2014 by the Member for Kibra Constituency (Hon. Kenneth Okoth, M.P.):**

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee on the implementation status of the free and subsidized education programmes in the Country, and in particular,

apprise Members on implementation status of the 'Eddah Gachukia' Report of 2009 and 'Kilemi Mwiria' Task Force Report of 2014; when the Ministry plans to publish Statutory Instruments/ Regulations to bring into full effect the Basic Education Act, 2013; and the plans in place to ensure access to secondary education considering access to education is envisaged to be free and compulsory by both Article 26 of the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights and Articles 43 and 53 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010?

**(ii) Question By Private Notice No. PVT/6/2014 by the Member for Kandara Constituency (Hon. Alice Muthoni Wahome, MP):**

Could the Cabinet Secretary apprise the Committee on the circumstances that informed the decision by the Technical University of Mombasa to expel Benmark Ng'ang'a of Student Admission Number BEBC/020J/2011 vide letter dated 24<sup>th</sup> October 2014 without being accorded an opportunity for a hearing by the Disciplinary Committee.

**(iii) Question By Private Notice No. PVT/7/2014 by the Member for Nyeri Town Constituency (Hon. Esther Murugi Mathenge, MP):**

Could the Cabinet Secretary apprise the Committee on the circumstances surrounding persistent students' unrest at the Dedan Kimathi University of Science and Technology and whether there are plans to reinstate all students who were suspended or expelled on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2014?

**(iv) Question No. 060/2014 by the Nominated Member (Hon. Isaac M. Mwaura, M.P.):**

Could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee the measures put in place to ensure that the education and training needs of mentally handicapped persons are accorded sufficient attention, and in particular, explain the rationale for the reduction of budgetary allocation for Karatina Special School for the Mentally Challenged and Komothai Special School for the Mentally Challenged in Nyeri and Kiambu Counties, respectively from Ksh. 536,000 to Ksh. 432,000 that has led to austerity measures including retrenchments and laying off of personnel; the timeline for increasing the number of teachers under the Teachers Service Commission to these special institutions; and reasons behind failure to disburse of funds for students with mental disabilities since September 2013?
