- 1. The Senate assembled at thirty minutes past Two O'clock.
- 2. The Proceedings were opened with Prayer said by the Speaker.

3. <u>COMMUNICATION FROM THE CHAIR - VISITING STUDENTS FROM</u> SOUTH EASTERN KENYA UNIVERSITY AND KENYATTA UNIVERSITY

The Speaker issued the following Communication from the Chair-

"Honourable Senators,

I would like to acknowledge the presence, in both the Speaker's and Public Gallery, this afternoon, of visiting students from South Eastern Kenya University and Kenyatta University (Kitui Campus).

5. **STATEMENTS**

(i) Statements pursuant to Standing Order 45 (2) (b)

(a) The Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Labour and Social Welfare issued a Statement on the collection of levies by Music Copyright Society of Kenya (MCSK), Kenya Association of Music Producers (KAMP) and

Performers Rights Society of Kenya (PRISK) from business premises and public transport vehicles for playing music.

Thereupon, the Chairperson informed the Senate that, once music was played to the "public", especially where it enhances the business of the person playing, a license fee must be paid to the representative of the rights holder since they could not individually monitor and collect on their own.

The Chairperson also informed the House that this was what created the need for the "collecting societies" known as MCSK (for composers and publishers), KAMP (for producers and sound recorders) and PRISK (for performers of music).

The Chairperson further informed the House that the three societies were entitled to collect royalties for exploitation of music in public and that the societies are covered by section 46 of the Copyright Act, Chapter 130 of the Laws of Kenya.

The Speaker directed the Chairperson to provide further information on the statement on 22nd November, 2016.

(b) The Vice Chairperson of the Standing Committee on Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries issued a Statement regarding farmers' preparedness for the planting season and supply of fertilizer and other farm inputs to farmers.

Thereupon, the Vice Chairperson informed the House that the Ministry had put in place measures to ensure adequate seed and fertilizer supply and distribution to farmers while seed companies in the country had 48,000 metric tons of maize seed against an annual demand of 35,000 metric tons; and enough seed (wheat, sorghum, millet) to meet farmers' requirement to plant 492,515 hectares, as well as 1.69 million hectares of pulses (beans, green grams and cowpeas).

Regarding fertilizer supply and distribution, the Vice Chairperson informed the House that the Ministry was implementing a national subsidy fertilizer programme, which was part of the 3-Tier Fertilizer Cost-Reduction Strategy, a flagship project of the Kenya Vision 2030, and the fertilizer was accessible to registered farmers through the National Cereals and Produce Board depots across the country.

The Speaker directed that the Cabinet Secretary appears before the Committee on 22nd November, 2016 and the Chairperson provide further information on the statement thereafter.

(c) The Chairperson of the Standing Committee on National Security and Foreign Relations issued a statement on the alleged killing by police of Edna Osoro and Irene Kerubo at Daraja Mbili Market in Kisii County.

Thereupon, the Chairperson informed the House that, as Administration Police officers from the Quick Response Team (QRT) were clearing hawkers

and *boda boda* riders who had obstructed the free flow of traffic at Daraja Mbili Market, a *boda boda* rider attempted to wrestle a gun from one of the officers.

The Chairperson informed the House that, in the ensuing melee, a rifle accidentally discharged ammunition, resulting in the accidental shooting of the two women, Irene Kerubo (aged 36 years) and Edna Osoro (aged 21 years).

The Speaker directed that the Chairperson provides further information on the matter on Thursday, 1st December, 2016.

19. MOTION - COUNTRYWIDE AUDIT ON THE DISTRIBUTION OF TEACHERS IN ALL PUBLIC SCHOOLS

WHEREAS Article 43(1)(f) and 53(1)(b) of the Constitution guarantees every citizen a right to education and every child a right to free and compulsory basic education, respectively;

NOTING that the Teachers Service Commission is mandated to handle employment, deployment, remuneration and discipline of teachers in public schools in Kenya;

CONCERNED that there are great disparities in the distribution of teachers in public schools across the country leading to oversupply in some schools and undersupply in others and ultimately leading to major teacher shortage especially in rural and marginalized areas;

APPRECIATING efforts made by the national government to improve the teacher pupil ratio to international standards in all public schools through yearly employment of teachers;

FURTHER CONCERNED that the statistics on the number and distribution of teachers in public schools is not readily available;

NOW THEREFORE, the Senate directs the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology to conduct a countrywide audit on the distribution of teachers in all public schools indicating the requisite establishment per school and the corresponding number of teachers who are in-post and further that the Ministry submits a report to the House on the matter within ninety (90) days.

20. MOTION - CREATION OF THE OFFICE OF AN AUDITOR TO SPECIFICALLY AUDIT THE BASIC EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS' FUNDS

THAT, whereas Article 53 (1)(b) of the Constitution provides that every child in Kenya has the right to free and compulsory basic education;

RECOGNIZING the importance of education in the alleviation of the main challenges facing Kenya's sovereignty identified at independence, namely; poverty, illiteracy and disease;

APPRECIATING the gains made following the implementation of the free primary education program in 2003 and cognizant of the principles set out in the Basic Education Act of 2013 whose objectives include promotion and regulation of free and compulsory basic education besides providing for accreditation, registration and management of basic education institutions;

NOTING the substantial resources invested by the national and county governments, parents, sponsors and development partners in the provision of basic education;

FURTHER NOTING that pursuant to the Basic Education Act, the County Director of Education is vested with numerous responsibilities including facilitation of auditing of all basic educational institutions in the respective county thereby leaving fundamental gaps of governance especially in the management of the available resources;

NOW THEREFORE, the House recommends to the Cabinet Secretary for Education to facilitate the creation of the office of an auditor to specifically audit the basic education institutions' funds to enhance transparency and accountability and improve governance in the management of these institutions.

21. MOTION - INSTALLATION OF CCTV CAMERAS IN POLICE STATIONS.

Motion made and Question proposed;

THAT,

CONCERNED about the numerous reports of the arbitrary arrests of innocent people by the police;

FURTHER CONCERNED that a large number of those arrested are allegedly locked up in police cells without being recorded either in the Occurrence Book or elsewhere;

DEEPLY CONCERNED that some of the arrested people disappear without a trace and that many who are subsequently traced are found dead away from where they were known to have been locked up;

ALARMED by the recent incident where three young men were locked up for hours at Syokimau Police Post without any record indicating they had been at the police post, only for them to be found days later, in another area far from the police post, having been brutally killed;

APPRECIATING that the Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) system installed by the Government in Nairobi has helped a lot in criminal investigations;

NOW THEREFORE the Senate calls upon the National Government to-

- a) install CCTV cameras in all police stations and police posts in order to record each and every person going in and out of the station;
- b) have the CCTV system designed in such a way that it is capable of capturing the Occurrence Book entries every twelve hours; and
- c) ensure the CCTV system is connected to a central depository in order to minimize chances of subsequent tampering.
