- 1. The Senate resumed at thirty minutes past Three O'clock.
- 2. The Proceedings were opened with Prayer said by the Speaker.

3. <u>HEARING AND DETERMINATION OF THE PROPOSED REMOVAL FROM OFFICE, BY IMPEACHMENT, OF HON. JAMES NDERITU GACHAGUA, THE GOVERNOR OF NYERI COUNTY</u>

The Senate resumed its consideration of the matter of the proposed removal from office, by impeachment, of Hon. James Nderitu Gachagua, the Governor of Nyeri County, as follows –

a) Presentation of the case of the Governor of Nyeri County

Counsel for the Governor resumed his presentation of the case of the Governor, by leading the following witnesses in presenting their testimony before the Senate –

i) Mr. Eliud Muchoki Mureithi, - Vice Chaiperson, Nyeri County Public Service Board

The witness took oath and was led in his testimony by Counsel for Governor, touching mainly on appointments of public officers in Nyeri County and circumstances leading to many officers holding positions in acting capacities.

The witness was subsequently cross-examined by Counsels for the County Assembly and re-examined by Counsel for the Governor.

Senators also sought clarifications from the witness, following which the witness was discharged.

ii) Mr. Patrick Mwiti Gitobu - Director of Procurement, Nyeri County Government

The witness took oath and was led in his testimony by Counsel for Governor, touching mainly on matters relating to procurement and refurbishment of Karsons Building and the alleged splitting of Tenders by the County Government of Nyeri.

The witness was subsequently cross-examined by Counsels for the County Assembly and re-examined by Counsel for the Governor.

Senators also sought clarifications from the witness, following which the witness was discharged.

b) Closing submissions by Counsels of the County Assembly

Mr. Charles Njenga and Mr. George Ng'ang'a, Counsels for Nyeri County Assembly, made their closing submissions and urged the Senate to find all the three charges against the Governor substantiated. They further argued that the Counsel for the Governor and his witnesses had not been able to remove the culpability of the Governor from the charges of impeachment.

They pleaded with the Senate to resolve to remove the Governor from Office.

c) Closing remarks by Counsel of the Governor.

The Governor and his Counsel, Mr. Peter Wanyama, made their closing submissions by stating that the County Assembly had failed to prove their case on the three grounds for impeachment as the threshold for impeachment was so high that the violations if any that were committed could not meet the threshold. They further argued that the Governor was not given a chance to be represented in the County Assembly to answer to the charges.

The Governor and his Counsel also urged the Senate to exercise their constitutional mandate by voting to reject the proposed impeachment of the Governor as all the three charges had not been substantiated.

4. <u>WITHDRAWAL OF ALL MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC AND THE MEDIA</u> PERSONNEL FROM THE CHAMBER AND THE GALLERIES

The Deputy Speaker ordered the withdrawal of all members of the public, the Governor of Nyeri County and the parties to the impeachment case, and the media personnel to withdraw from the chamber and the galleries.

The Deputy Speaker then ordered that the Senate holds its deliberations in camera.

Motion made and Question proposed-
