(The Hon. (Dr.) Victor Munyaka, M.P.)

THAT, aware that many innocent Kenyans have been victims of crime attributable to stolen and illegally acquired firearms; concerned that, despite the proliferation of small arms, there has not been efforts to track location, movement and use of firearms held by licensed persons and the disciplined forces; acknowledging the need to adopt a mechanism for providing real-time geophysical location and movement of firearms to facilitate recovery of stolen firearms and forensic identification of guns used in crime scenes; cognizant of the fact that a number of countries continue to implement modern technologies to regulate, monitor and track use of firearms; further aware that use of electronic tracking technologies, including the Global Positioning Systems (GPS) has been used to track and record location and movement of firearms; this House **urges** the Government to fit all guns held by licensed persons and the disciplined forces with electronic tracking devices and ensure the proper and comprehensive registration of all firearms in the country in order to curb insecurity.

14*. **MOTION - DECLARATION OF CATTLE RUSTLING AS A NATIONAL DISASTER & ESTABLISHMENT OF A SPECIAL FUND FOR VICTIMS**

(The Hon. William Cheptumo, M.P.)

THAT, aware that cattle rustling is a major menace and security threat in the South and North Rift regions and other regions in the country; noting that cattle rustling leaves behind destruction of property and loss of lives; deeply concerned that the menace has since left irreparable and negative socio-economic impact which include but are not limited to increased number of widows, widowers, orphaned children, poverty, displacement of people leading to the emergency of Internally displaced persons (IDPS), disruption of educational programmes and other economic activities owing to the destruction and/or closure of educational, health and other institutions; deeply concerned that the people living in the affected regions have been denied the enjoyment of their social, economic and political rights as guaranteed to them under the Bill of Rights as enshrined in Chapter Four of the Constitution; this House **urges** that the National Government declares cattle rustling as a national disaster and establishes a Special Fund to be used in mitigating the losses suffered by and in compensating all victims of cattle rustling and resettle all Internally displaced persons across the country created by the menace.

**15*. MOTION - DEVELOPMENT OF A NATIONAL CURRICULUM FOR
EMERGENCY TRAINING OF MEDICAL PERSONNEL**

(The Hon. Dr. Susan Musyoka, M.P.)

THAT, aware that Article 43 (1) (a) and (2) of the Constitution provides for the right to the highest attainable standard of health for every person; further aware that emergency health care is an important component of standard health services; concerned that many lives continue to be lost due to lack of adequate emergency health care and poor response to emergencies in the country; noting that only 13% of public health facilities in the Country have basic components to support emergency cases; deeply concerned that emergency patients are exposed to untrained personnel and/or good Samaritans who in most cases worsen the situation; cognizant of the need for the Country to have a well-coordinated emergency care system; this House **resolves** that the Government immediately develops and implements a national curriculum for emergency training of all medical personnel in the Country.

**16*. MOTION - ENGAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL YOUTH SERVICE
IN CONSTRUCTION OF DAMS**

(The Hon. Joe M. Mutambu, M.P.)

THAT, aware that Article 43(1)(c) of the Constitution provides that every person has the right to be free from hunger and to have adequate food of acceptable quality; further aware that Kenya's food production is heavily dependent on rain-fed agriculture; cognizant of the fact that counties such as Kitui, Makueni and Machakos in semi-arid and arid lower Eastern part of the country experience perennial food shortages due to inadequate rainfall; noting that these counties however receive seasonal rainfall whose water can be harnessed and stored for irrigation; appreciating that the Government has invested heavily in the National Youth Service in terms of machinery and technical training; this House **urges** the Government to consider engaging the labour force and machinery of the National Youth Service to construct earth-dams for harnessing water for irrigation with a view to enhancing food production and alleviating hunger among the residents of the said counties and other semi-arid and arid regions of this country.

CLAUSE 4**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 4 of the Bill be amended by deleting sub-clause (2) and substituting therefor the following new sub-clause-

(2) The Authority shall establish offices in each county.

CLAUSE 8**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 8 of the Bill be amended-

(a) in sub-clause (1) by inserting the following new paragraph immediately after paragraph (d)-

(da) one person who shall be nominated by the Council of County Governors.

(b) in sub-clause (5) by inserting the words “and (1)(da)” immediately after the words subsection (1)(d).

- II. THAT,** notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on any **Motion**, including a Special motion shall be limited in the following manner:- A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that Order.

THAT, aware that following the 2007 post-election violence, various state and non-state agencies carried out independent investigations, either on their own motion or in the exercise of their statutory functions; **Further aware** that, some of those agencies, including the Commission appointed by the then President to inquire into the matters pertaining to the Post Election Violence (*the Waki Commission*), either submitted or publicized their findings and/or reports, which are yet to be discussed by the National Assembly; **Cognizant** of the fact that the matter of possible compromise and allegations of skewed investigations has been of concern to the People of Kenya, including allegations that some of the witnesses who testified before the Commission and other agencies may have been procured; **Recalling** that Article 95 of the Constitution provides that the National Assembly deliberates on and resolves issues of concern to the people; **Further recalling** that, in 2010, Parliament amended the Commission of Inquiry Act (CAP. 102) to accord the National Assembly an opportunity to receive and discuss such findings or reports; this House –

- (a) **resolves** to establish a select Committee to inquire into and report on the allegations of the skewed and compromised investigations by the various state and non-state agencies on the matter of the 2007-Post Election Violence;
- (b) **also resolves** that the Committee elects its chairperson and vice-chairperson from amongst its Members;

(c) **further resolves** that the Committee submits its report to the House within ninety (90) days, to inform the debate on the subsequent motion for noting the contents of *the Report of the Commission of Inquiry into the Post Election Violence (CIPEV)* which was tabled in the House on 4th December 2008; and,

I. SENATE AMENDMENTS TO THE MINING BILL (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 9 OF 2014)

(As passed by the Senate on Wednesday, 16th September, 2015)

CLAUSE 5

Senate Amendment

THAT, clause 5 of the Bill be amended by inserting the words “and the principles of leadership and integrity set out under Chapter Six of the Constitution” immediately after the words “of the Constitution”.

CLAUSE 7

Senate Amendment

THAT, clause 7 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (2) by inserting the words “in consultation with the Mineral Rights Board” immediately after the words “in the Gazette”.

CLAUSE 9

Senate Amendment

THAT, clause 9 of the Bill be amended by inserting the following new sub-clause immediately after sub-clause (1) –

(1A) The Cabinet Secretary shall, immediately upon receipt of a report under subsection (1) issue to the person an acknowledgement in writing of the receipt of the report.

CLAUSE 16

Senate Amendment

THAT, clause 16 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (3) by inserting the words “in consultation with the Mineral Rights Board” immediately after the words “Cabinet Secretary shall”.

CLAUSE 20**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 20 of the Bill be amended by inserting the following new sub-clause immediately after sub-clause (4) –

(5) A person whose land or property is damaged as a result of the exercise of the powers of the Director of Mines under subsection (1) is entitled to fair, prompt and full compensation for such damage in accordance with this Act.

CLAUSE 21**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 21 of the Bill be amended by inserting the following new sub-clause immediately after sub-clause (2) –

(3) In exercising the powers under subsection (2), the Director or a duly authorised officer shall ensure that as little damage or inconvenience as possible is caused to the legitimate owner or lawful occupier of the land in respect of which the powers are exercised.

(4) A person whose land or property is damaged as a result of the exercise of the powers of the Director of Geology under subsection (1) shall be entitled to fair, prompt and full compensation for such damage in accordance with this Act.

CLAUSE 30**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 30 of the Bill be amended by deleting sub-clause (2) and substituting therefor the following new sub-clause (2) –

(2) The Mineral Rights Board shall comprise of –

- (a) a chairperson with demonstrable knowledge and experience of the minerals and mining sector, who shall be appointed by the President;
- (b) the Principal Secretary responsible for matters relating to mining;
- (c) the Principal Secretary responsible for the National Treasury;
- (d) one person who shall be nominated by the Council of County Governors from amongst the Governors;
- (e) the Chairperson of the National Land Commission;
- (f) the Director of Mines who shall be the secretary to the Mineral Rights Board;
- (g) the Director of Geological Surveys; and
- (h) two persons with professional qualifications and experience in the mining industry who shall be appointed by the Cabinet Secretary.

CLAUSE 33**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 33 of the Bill be amended by deleting sub-clauses (7) and (8).

CLAUSE 34**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 34 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (4) by deleting paragraph (a).

CLAUSE 37**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 37 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (1) by deleting the words “A prospecting and” appearing at the beginning of the sub-clause.

CLAUSE 38**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 38 be amended in sub-clause (1) by deleting the word “un-alienated” appearing at the end of paragraph (b) and substituting therefor the word “unregistered”.

CLAUSE 40**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 40 of the Bill be amended by deleting sub-clause (1) and substituting therefor the following new sub-clause –

(1) The Cabinet Secretary may submit a request under section 107 of the Land Act for the compulsory acquisition of land or rights or interests in land, to vest the land or area in question, or rights or interests in such land or area, in the Government or on behalf of the Government, where the consent required under sections 36, 37 or 38 is—

(a) unreasonably withheld; or

(b) the Cabinet Secretary considers that withholding of consent is contrary to the national interest.

CLAUSE 41**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 41 be amended in sub-clause (2) by deleting the words “which recognise the uniqueness of procurement and tendering process of minerals” appearing at the end of the sub-clause.

CLAUSE 46**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 46 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (3) by deleting the words “number of expatriates per capital investment” appearing immediately after the words “shall serve”.

CLAUSE 47**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 47 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (1) by inserting the words “members of the community and” immediately after the words “in employment to”.

CLAUSE 49**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 49 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (2) by deleting the word “four” appearing immediately after the words “exchange within” and substituting therefor the word “three”.

CLAUSE 50**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 50 of the Bill be amended in paragraph (b) by inserting the words “members of the community and” immediately after the words “offered by”.

CLAUSE 51**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 51 of the Bill be amended –

- (a) by deleting sub-clause (2) and substituting therefor with the following new sub-clause –

(2) The Cabinet Secretary shall not unreasonably withhold consent to assign, transfer, mortgage or trade a mineral right and shall inform an applicant of the decision within thirty days of receipt of an application to assign, transfer, mortgage or trade a mineral right.

- (b) By inserting the following new subsection immediately after subsection (8)–

(8A) The Cabinet Secretary shall, in consultation with the Mineral Rights Board, prescribe a criteria for the conditions required to be met by an applicant for an assignment, mortgage or trade in a mineral right.

CLAUSE 53**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 53 of the Bill be amended –

- (a) in sub-clause (1) by inserting the words “and the Kenya Revenue Authority” immediately after the words “the Cabinet Secretary”; and
- (b) inserting the following new sub-clause immediately after sub-clause (1) –

(1A) The Cabinet Secretary shall submit to the National Assembly and the Senate, an analysis of the audited annual financial statement submitted under subsection (1).

CLAUSE 67**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 67 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (1) by deleting paragraph (e) and substituting therefor the following new paragraph –

- (e) inform and consult on an ongoing basis with the national and county government authorities and communities about the reconnaissance operations that require physical entry onto the land within their jurisdiction;

CLAUSE 77**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 77 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (2) by deleting the words “by the Cabinet Secretary” appearing at the end of the sub-clause and substituting therefor the words “Regulations made under this Act”.

CLAUSE 106**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 106 of the Bill be amended by inserting the following new paragraph immediately after paragraph (i) –

- (j) such other information as the Cabinet Secretary may consider necessary.

CLAUSE 117**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 117 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (5) by deleting the word “Parliament” appearing immediately after the words “submitted to” and substituting therefor the words “the National Assembly and the Senate”.

CLAUSE 120**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 120 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (2) by deleting the word “Parliament” appearing immediately after the words “submitted to” and substituting therefor the words “the National Assembly and the Senate”.

CLAUSE 149**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 149 of the Bill be amended by deleting sub-clause (3) and substituting therefor the following new subclauses –

(3) All immovable assets of the holder under the mining licence shall vest in the County Government from the effective date of the surrender or termination of the licence upon payment of the book value of the assets by the County Government.

(3A) Where the County Government is unable to pay for the assets under subsection (3), the assets shall vest in the National Government from the effective date of the surrender or termination of the licence upon payment of the book value of the assets by the National Government.

CLAUSE 4**Senate Amendment**

THAT, clause 4 of the Bill be amended –

- (a) by deleting the definition of the word “community” and substituting therefor the following new definition –

“community” means a people living in a ward or wards within which minerals are situated and who are affected by the exploration of the minerals or mining operations with respect to the minerals;

- (b) by inserting the following new definition immediately after the definition of the word “corporation” –

“Council of County Governors” means the Council of County Governors established under section 19 of the Intergovernmental Relations Act;

- (c) by deleting the definition of the word “strategic minerals” and substituting therefor the following new definition –

“strategic minerals” means minerals declared as such by the Cabinet Secretary with the approval of the Cabinet and by notice in the *Gazette*;

The House resolved on Wednesday, February 11, 2015 as follows:-

- II. THAT,** notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on **Bills sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party** shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen minutes (15) in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that Order.

THAT,** notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on any **Motion**, including a Special motion shall be limited in the following manner:- A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that Order.
