I. QUESTIONS UNDER THE DEPARTMENTAL COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORT PUBLIC WORKS AND HOUSING

Questions to the Cabinet Secretary for Transport, Infrastructure, Housing and Urban Development:

(i) Question No. 057/2018 by the Member for Ikolomani Constituency (Hon. Benard Shinali, MP):-

Is the Cabinet Secretary aware that the temporary bridge in Litambiza, Ikolomani Constituency is too narrow therefore posing risks to users? Could the Cabinet Secretary apprise the Committee on the status of the construction of the main bridge and the expected date of completion?

In addition, could the Cabinet Secretary apprise the Committee on the measures the Ministry has put in place to ensure that such projects are completed within the projected period?

Further, could the Cabinet Secretary inform the Committee whether there are plans to have farmers whose farms were destroyed by flooding as a result of lack of a proper the bridge compensated?

(ii) Question No. 075/2018 by the Member for Githunguri Constituency (Hon. Gabriel Kago, MP):-

Aware that Tatu City in Kiambu County is aligned to the vision of the Nairobi Metro 2030 Strategy, and part of Kenya Vision 2030; further aware that the project targets residents who wish to live, work and play in a planned urban development; and concerned that in the recent past, the project has faced numerous legal battles that occasioned formation of a Multi-Agency Taskforce to look into the matter; could the Cabinet Secretary apprise the Committee on the following; who formed the Taskforce and when; its membership; its Mandate; the terms of reference; whether the Taskforce has concluded its report; and if so, what were the findings and recommendations, if any?

(iii)Question No. 080/2018 by the Member for Mvita Constituency (Hon. Abdullswamad Sherrif Nassir, MP):-

Aware that some foreign shipping companies operating in Kenya have allegedly been identified as having contravened provisions of the Merchant Shipping Act by hiring large number of foreigners at the expense of locals, could the Cabinet Secretary apprise the Committee on the number and length of service of foreigners employed by foreign shipping companies in Kenya; and state the reasons for the Kenya Maritime Authority not enforcing the relevant provisions of the Merchant Shipping Act in regard to employment of locals. Could the Cabinet Secretary give an undertaking that the Ministry will resolve this matter?

(iv) Question No. 081/2018 by the Member for Mvita Constituency (Hon. Abdullswamad Sherrif Nassir, MP):-

Is the Cabinet Secretary aware that driving tests and related matters such as issuance of driving licenses and setting of curriculum in driving schools are now handled by the National Transport and Safety Authority (NTSA); could he explain to the Committee the role of NTSA and that of Police vis-à-vis Traffic Act?

(v) Question No. 084/2018 by the Member for Lamu County (Hon. (Capt.) Ruweida Mohamed Obo MP):-

Could the Cabinet Secretary apprise the Committee on the policy in place regarding operations, management and regulation of taxis at airports in the Country; and state the requirements for both vehicles and operators to conduct business at the airports. Further, would the Cabinet Secretary explain why the said policy has not been effective in ensuring maximum order at airports by taxi operators especially when calling for customers.

II. QUESTIONS UNDER THE DEPARTMENTAL COMMITTEE JUSTICE AND LEGAL AFFAIRS

Questions to the Attorney General:

Question No. 060/2018 by the Member for Kiharu Constituency (Hon. Ndindi Nyoro, MP):-

Aware that the High Court of Kenya on 16th August 2017 awarded the late Hon. Kenneth Stanley Njindo Matiba, a renowned second liberation hero a total of Kshs 504 million as compensation from the state as damages for torture and cruelty meted on him during his detention in 1990s and for financial losses and other damages suffered, an amount that now stands at over Kshs 1, 834, 151, 170.71 inclusive of interest, could the Attorney General inform the Committee on why there has been reluctance by the State to pay the compensation, and further state when the said compensation would be paid.
