## (b) Regarding the proposed Senate - KEPSA Round Table Meeting

"Honourable Senators,

I wish to inform you that the Office of the Speaker of the Senate has organized a meeting between the Senate and the Kenya Private Sector Alliance (KEPSA) to deliberate on public - private sector engagement especially on legislative matters and its effects on the economy.

The Kenya Private Sector Alliance (KEPSA) is the apex body of the Private Sector in Kenya with a membership drawn from various sectors of the economy. KEPSA advocates on behalf of the Private Sector in respect of high-level national cross – cutting issues. It also coordinates the Private Sector's engagement on public – private sector dialogue with the various arms of government, with the overarching goal of creating an environment conducive to business, which makes Kenya a globally competitive investment destination.

## Honourable Senators,

During the 11<sup>th</sup> Parliament, KEPSA established a relationship with the Senate and held a number of forums that provided an engagement platform for the Senate and the private sector on matters regarding devolution, ease of doing business in the counties and ensuring that the legislative environment was supportive of socioeconomic growth across Kenya. Such forums included the Liaison Committee - KEPSA Retreat held in September, 2014, and the Senate – KEPSA Round Table Meeting held in July, 2016.

### Honourable Senators,

This year's engagement will be a continuation of our partnership with KEPSA and the first one in the life of the 12<sup>th</sup> Parliament. The theme for the 2018 Speaker's Round Table retreat with KEPSA is "Re-Imagining Kenya's Political Economy".

The meeting will focus on the following broad objectives-

- i. To outline recommendations and a strategy for the conclusion of list of policies, laws and regulations in the areas of revenue generation, debt management, effective taxation, quality of policy and governance which will facilitate a conducive business environment, jobs, wealth creation, and inclusive prosperity;
- ii. To engage on key private sector recommendations on the legislative agenda; and to increase coordination between the Legislature and the Private Sector on Legislative agenda needed to drive the Big Four development agenda and to unlock private sector investment in the same; and

iii. Enhance engagement between the Senate and the private sector through collaboration with Standing Committees.

## 8. STATEMENT PURSUANT TO STANDING ORDER NO. 47 (1)

The Senator for Vihiga County (Sen. George Khaniri) made a statement on an issue of general topical concern regarding the alarming rates of teenage pregnancies.

In his Statement, the Senator informed the House that from the start of the 2018 Primary and Secondary Schools' National examinations, there have been many cases of pregnant school girls reported. He stated that several girls had failed to sit their examinations due to pregnancies, with some missing the examinations due to giving birth.

Sen. Khaniri highlighted statistics by the United Nations Population Fund (UNFP) which indicated that between June 2016 and July 2017, 378,397 adolescents in Kenya aged between 10 and 19 year got pregnant. He further stated that a local newspaper had featured alarming teen pregnancy statistics.

The Senator expressed concern that there was need to acknowledge that there were many cases of child defilement, leading to underage pregnancies and that when the girl in question was a minor, the case needed to be thoroughly investigated and the perpetrators involved prosecuted. The Senator urged the public to take its place to bring up a better-informed, equipped and empowered generation that makes the right decisions and choices for its children.

Puruant to Standing Order No. 47 (3) the Deputy Speaker referred the Statement to the Standing Committee on Labour and Social Welfare for consideration.
