GUIDANCE REGARDING VOTING ON THE CONSTITUTION OF KENYA (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) BILL (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 5 OF 2018)

Honourable Members, I wish to give guidance relating to the voting anticipated tomorrow afternoon on the Constitution of Kenya (Amendment) (No. 2) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 5 of 2018) sponsored by the Hon. Chrisantus Wamalwa, MP.

Honourable Members, as you may recall from my communication last week, the Second Reading of the Bill requires two-thirds of Members in the National Assembly voting in the affirmative, as contemplated under Article 256 of the Constitution.

In this regard, may I remind you that Standing Order 70(1) provides, and I quote-

"Unless the Speaker, for the convenience of the House otherwise directs, voting on a division in the House shall be by electronic voting."

I therefore wish to remind all those desiring to vote on the Bill tomorrow, to carry their cards with them to facilitate this process.
