John Oroo Oyioka) regarding the number of university and colleges graduates with degrees, diplomas and certificates have secured internship opportunities in the public service since the enactment of the National Employment Authority Act, No.3 of 2016 and measures the Ministry is putting in place to facilitate Kenyans in securing internship and attachment opportunities in public service;

b) Ordinary Question No. 026/2019 by the Member for Matungu (Hon. Justus M. Murunga) regarding increased incidences of insecurity in Matungu Constituency of Kakamega County in the last few months where more than twelve (12) people have been killed including two (2) students and measures the Ministry is putting in place to end these killings and improve security in Matungu Constituency;

c) Ordinary Question No. 227/2019 by the Member for Keiyo North Constituency (Hon. (Dr.) James Kipkosgei Murgor, MP) regarding payment of retirement benefits and gratuity dues to Mrs. Philomena Chebiwot Chemitei, of Personal No. 21617 who retired from Public Service in February 1990 where she worked since 1971;
