

CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

Pursuant to section 201(1)(a) and (2) of the Fisheries Management and Development Act (No 35 of 2016) and in accordance with sections 3 and 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, No. 33 of 2011, His Excellency the President nominated **Hon. Ochieng G. Mbeo** for the position of Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Kenya Fish Marketing Authority. The nomination was conveyed to the Speaker of the National Assembly through a letter Ref. No. OP/CAB.1/10A dated 9th July, 2019 (*Annexure1*). The nominee's Curriculum Vitae and Testimonials were enclosed in the reference letter.

On 23rd July, 2019, the Speaker of the National Assembly pursuant to Standing Order 42(1), read the message from H.E. the President communicating the name of the nominee for the position of Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Kenya Fish Marketing Authority to the House. Pursuant to section 4 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and Standing Order 45(1)&(4), the name of the nominee was committed to the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock for approval hearing and reporting to the House within fourteen (14) days.

The Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Friday, 26th July, 2019 (Annexure 2) inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee in conformity with section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. The advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received by Thursday, 1st August, 2019 at 5.00 pm. By close of the submissions' deadline, the Committee had not received any submission on the suitability or otherwise for appointment to the position of Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.

The nominee appeared before the Committee on Tuesday, 6th August 2019 for vetting in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and the National Assembly Standing Orders on his suitability or otherwise for appointment to the position of Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.

Following the vetting, the Committee observed that:

(1) The nominee possesses a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science and history from the Guilford College, North Carolina, USA, and a master's degree in international management from American graduate school of international Management thunderbird Arizona USA. His academic credentials and experience meet the standard required under section 6 (7) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, No. 33 of 2011.

(2) The nominee exhibited knowledge and understanding of the fish sector in which he is expected to serve as the Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.

(3) The nominee satisfies the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity. The Committee observed that the DCI, HELB and EACC had sent clearance letters with respect to the nominee. The nominee has not been charged in a Court of Law in the last three years. However, the Kenya Revenue Authority in its letter indicated that the nominee was not tax compliant.

(4) As stipulated under Clause 12(1) of the Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003, the nominee submitted that he has potential conflict of interest between his personal interests and his public or official duties if approved.

May I take this opportunity to thank all the Members of the Committee for their input and valuable contributions and time during the deliberations and vetting exercise. The Committee also takes this opportunity to thank the Offices of the Speaker and of the Clerk of the National Assembly for the logistical support accorded to it during the exercise.

On behalf of the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock section 8(1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and the provisions of Standing Order 199(6), it is now my singular duty and privilege to present to the House, this Report of the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock on the vetting of the nominee for the position of Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Kenya Fish Marketing Authority Hon. 1.0 PREFACE

ESTABLISHMENT AND MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

The Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock is one of the Departmental Committees of the National Assembly established under Standing Order 216 and is mandated to:

- investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;
- (b) study the programme and policy objectives of ministries and departments and the effectiveness of the implementation.
- (c) study and review all legislation referred to it.;
- study, assess and analyse the relative success of the ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
- (e) investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned ministries and departments as they may deem necessary and as may be referred to them by the House;
- (f) vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 204 (Committee on Appointments); and

- (g) make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.
- (h) consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of article 245 of the Constitution; and
- (i) examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.

The Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock deals with matters concerning; Agriculture, Livestock, Irrigation, Fisheries, Development, Production and Marketing. In discharge of its mandate, the Committee oversights the following: -

- a) The State Department for Crops Development
- b) The State Department for Livestock
- c) The State Department for Fisheries, Aquaculture and the Blue Economy
- d) The State Department for Irrigation
- e) The State Department of Agricultural Research Services

2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 LEGAL FRAMEWORK

In accordance with the provisions of section 201(1)(a) and (2) of the Fisheries Management and Development Act (No 35 of 2016) and sections 3 and 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, No. 33 of 2011, His Excellency the President forwarded to the National Assembly, the notification of nomination, curriculum vitae and testimonials of Hon. Ochieng G. Mbeo vide a letter dated 9th July, 2019 and reference number OP/CAB.1/10A (*Annexure1*) for the approval of National Assembly before appointment to the position of the Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.

2.2 Committal to the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock

The Committee on Agriculture and Livestock being one of the Departmental Committees of the National Assembly under Standing Order 216(6) is mandated to vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve.

Pursuant to section 4 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and Standing Order 204, the name and curriculum vitae of the nominee: was committed to the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock for vetting. The Committee is required to report to the House within fourteen (14) days.

2.3 Invitation of Memoranda

Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011, provides that "any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated".

Pursuant to this provision, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Friday, 26th July, 2019 (Annexure 2) informing the general public of the intention of the Committee to conduct approval hearings, as provided for by Article 118 (1) (a) (b) and (2) of the Constitution and Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, (No.33 of 2011), which allow public participation in Committee proceedings. The notification invited the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) with supporting evidence contesting the suitability of the nominee in conformity with section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011.

By close of business on Thursday, 1st August, 2019 at 5.00 pm the Committee had not received any submissions against the nomination and approval for appointment of Hon Ochieng Mbeo for the position of Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.

Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 provides that "any person may, prior to the approval hearing and by a written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated".

2.4 Notification to the Nominee

On Thursday, 25th July, 2019, pursuant to 6(3) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the Clerk of the National Assembly officially invited the nominee for the approval hearing indicating the time and place (*Annexure 3*).

2.5 Clearance requirements

In a letter dated 25th July, 2019, the Clerk of the National Assembly wrote to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI) and the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), (Annexure 4) requesting for reports with respect to the nominee on the following matters:

- (a) ethics and integrity;
- (b) tax compliance; and,
- (c) loan repayments, if any.

Responding to the request, the Higher Education Loans Board confirmed *vide* a letter Ref. No. HELB/RR/112009/V/VOL2 dated 31st July, 2019 (Annexure 5), that the nominee, Hon. Ochieng G. Mbeo, was not a beneficiary of the HELB Loans Scheme.

With regard to matters on tax compliance, the Kenya Revenue Authority *vide* a letter Ref. No. NA/DCS/A&L/2019/38 dated 1st August, 2019, (*Annexure 6*) that the nominee had outstanding issues.

Tax Compliance Certificate (Annexure 7) from 05/07/2018 valid to 04/07/2019 was issued by the Kenya Revenue Authority confirming that Gilbert Ochieng Mbeo, of Personal Identification Number A000122092C had filed the relevant tax returns and paid taxes due as provided by law. This was in conformance to item 25 to the schedule in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act no. 33 of 2011. It stated that tax obligations to the state are up to the end of the financial year immediately preceding the nomination for appointment.

On matters of ethics and integrity, the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission *vide* a letter Ref. No. NA./DCS/A&L/2019/37 and dated 2nd August, 2019, (*Annexure 8*) confirmed that there were no outstanding issues or ongoing investigations against the nominee.

The Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI) through a letter Ref. No. DCI/IB/SEC/4/3/1/VOL.XII/108 dated 30th July, 2019 (*Annexure 9*) confirmed that there were no outstanding investigations against the nominee.

2.6 Issues for consideration during the approval hearing

The following statutes/provisions guided the Committee as it executed this mandate:

- (i) The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011);
- (ii) Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity;
- (iii) Article 232 of the Constitution on values and principles of public service;
- (iv) Article 10 of the Constitution on the national values and principles of governance;
- (v) The Leadership and Integrity Act (Cap. 182);
- (vi) The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act (No. 1A of 2015)
- (vii) The Public Officer Ethics Act (Cap. 183)
- (viii) The Fisheries Management and Development Act (no. 35 of 2016)

The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011)

Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 provides that the issues for consideration by the relevant House in relation to any nomination shall be:

- (a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;
- (b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
- (c) the suitability of the nominee for appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.

The schedule to the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act provides for the criteria to guide the Committee. These are:

- Education, employment record;
- Public office, political activities and affiliations;
- Deferred income or future benefits;
- Sources of income, tax status, statement of net worth;
- Potential conflicts of interest;
- Pro bono or charity work;
- Whether the nominee has been charged in a court of law or convicted;

Adverse mention in an investigatory report of a Parliamentary Committee or Commission.

During the approval hearing, section 6 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (PAPAA) provides important points, that is:

- An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background (section 6(7), PAPAA)
- The criteria specified in the Schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate (section 6(8), PAPAA)
- Any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated (section 6(9), PAPAA)
- A candidate may, at any time, by notice in writing addressed to the Clerk, withdraw from the approval process and the candidate's nomination shall end (section 6(10), PAPAA).

Chapter 6 of the Constitution (Leadership and Integrity)

The Committee, in determining the suitability of the nominee, took into consideration the provisions on leadership and integrity as outlined under Chapter Six of the Constitution. In particular, the Committee took cognizance of the following provisions:

- i) Article 73 (2) of the Constitution which provides that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include
 - a) selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability, or election in free and fair elections;
 - b) objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favoritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices;
 - c) selfless service based solely on the public interest, demonstrated by
 - i) honesty in the execution of public duties; and
 - ii) the declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties;

- d) accountability to the public for decisions and actions; and (e) discipline and commitment in service to the people.
 - i. Article 75(1) of the Constitution that requires a State Officer, whether in public or private life to behave in a manner that avoids conflict between personal interest and public official duties and Article 75(3) of the Constitution that prohibits a State Officer who has been removed from office under that Article from holding any other State Office.
 - ii. Article 77(1) of the Constitution that prohibits a full time State Officer from participating in any other gainful employment.
- iii. Article 77(2) of the Constitution that prohibits an appointed State officer from holding office in a political party.
- iv. Article 78 of the Constitution that disqualifies persons who are not Kenyan Citizens and persons holding dual citizenship from appointment as State Officers.

The Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012

The primary purpose of the Leadership and Integrity Act (No. 19 of 2012) is to ensure that State officers respect the values, principles and requirements of the Constitution. According to the Act, a State officer is obligated to respect the values, principles and the requirements of the Constitution, including the national values and principles provided for under Article 10 of the Constitution; the rights and fundamental freedoms provided for under Chapter Four of the Constitution; the responsibilities of leadership provided for under Article 73 of the Constitution; the principles governing the conduct of State officers provided for under Article 75 of the Constitution; the educational, ethical and moral requirements in accordance with Articles 99(1)(b) and 193(1)(b) of the Constitution; in the case of County governments, the objectives of devolution provided for under Article 174 of the Constitution; and in so far as is relevant, the values and principles of Public Service as provided for under Article 232 of the Constitution.

The Committee, in determining the suitability of the nominee, took into consideration the following provisions of the Leadership and Integrity Act, among others:

(i) Section 8 which provides that a public office is an office of public trust and shall be exercised in the best interests of the people of Kenya;

- (ii) Section 10 which requires public officers to a carry out duties in an efficient and honest manner; transparency; accurate records and documentation; report truthfully on all matters;
- (iii)Section 11 which requires public officers to carry out their duties with utmost professionalism to build public confidence and to exercise courtesy, respect, non-discrimination and high standards of performance;
- (iv)Section 12 which provides for financial integrity: officers should not enrich oneself or another person;
- (v) Section 14 which provides for the receipt of gifts or benefits; state officers are required to declare gifts of any value to the employer;
- (vi)Section 15 which provides that public officers should not use their office wrongfully or unlawfully to influence the acquisition of property;
- (vii) Section 16 which requires state officers to declare conflict of interest in the course of discharge of their duties;
- (viii) Section 23 calls on public officers to exercise political neutrality;
- (ix)Section 24 calls public officers to exercise impartiality in the performance of duties;
- (x) Section 26 requires public officers not to engage in any other gainful employment; Provided for in Article 77 of the Constitution in case of State officers; and
- (xi)Section 32 requires public officers to conduct their private affairs in a manner that maintains public confidence in the integrity of the office.

Article 232 of the Constitution on Values and Principles of Public Service

Article 232 of the Constitution provides for the values and principles of public service which include high standards of professional ethics; efficient, effective and economic use of resources; responsive, prompt, effective, impartial and equitable provision of services; involvement of the people in the process of policy making; accountability for administrative acts; transparency and provision to the public of timely, accurate information; fair competition and merit as the basis of appointments and promotions; representation of Kenya's diverse communities; and affording

adequate and equal opportunities for appointment, training and advancement, at all levels of the public service of men and women; the members of all ethnic groups; and persons with disabilities.

The Committee also took into consideration the requirements provided under Article 232 of the Constitution while it was conducting the approval hearing.

Article 10(2) of the Constitution on national values and principles of governance

Article 10(2) of the Constitution provides for the national values and principles of governance which include patriotism, national unity, sharing and devolution of power, the rule of law, democracy and participation of the people; human dignity, equity, social justice, inclusiveness, equality, human rights, non-discrimination and protection of the marginalized; good governance, integrity, transparency and accountability; and sustainable development.

The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act, 2015

The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act (No. 1A of 2015) gives effect to Article 232 of the Constitution of Kenya. The Committee took into consideration the provisions of the Act and in particular:

- (i) Section 5 which provides that every public officer shall maintain high standards of professional ethics;
- (ii) Section 6 which provides that a public officer shall use public resources in an efficient, effective and economic manner;
- (iii)Section 7 which provides that the public service shall ensure that public services are provided promptly, effectively, impartially and equitably;
- (iv)Section 8 which prohibits a public officer from giving information that the public officer knows or ought to know to be inaccurate; or unduly delays the provision of any information where required to provide that information;
- (v) Section 9 which provides that every public officer shall be accountable for his or her administrative acts;
- (vi)Section 10 which provides that the public service, a public institution or an authorised officer shall ensure that public officers are appointed and promoted on basis of fair competition and merit.

The Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003

The Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003 provides for obligations to be carried out by a public officer. These include professionalism, carrying out duties in accordance with the law, prohibition from unjust enrichment, avoiding conflict of interest, not using office as an avenue for soliciting or collecting harambees; not acting for foreigners; care of property; political neutrality, prohibition of nepotism or favouritism, giving impartial advice, conducting private affairs in a way that maintains public confidence, bar from sexual harassment, submission of declaration of income, assets and liabilities once every two years, among other worthy provisions. The Committee considered the provisions of the Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003 during its approval process.

The Fisheries Management and Development Act

Section 201 (1) (a) of the Fisheries Management and Development Act (No 35 of 2016) provides that -

- (1) There shall be a Board of Directors of the Fish Marketing Authority which shall consists of
 - (a) a chairperson appointed by the President

3.0 APPROVAL HEARING OF THE NOMINEE

The Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock held a sitting on Tuesday, 6th August, 2019 to deliberate on the approval hearing and the following were highlighted:

- (a) That, by the deadline date and time of Thursday, 1st August, 2019 at 5.00 pm, the Clerk of the National Assembly had not received any submissions against the nomination and approval for appointment of Hon. Ochieng G. Mbeo for the position of Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.
- (b) That, the nominee had not notified the Clerk of the National Assembly of the withdrawal from the approval process as outlined under section 6(10) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approvals) Act, 2011.

The Committee therefore resolved to undertake the approval hearing as per the schedule that had been advertised by the Clerk of the National Assembly and which was communicated to the nominee and to the public. In conducting the approval hearing, the Committee examined the nominee against the following criteria, as set out in section 6(8) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and Article 156(3) of the Constitution among others.

- (a) Educational and professional background;
- (b) Work experience;
- (c) Membership to professional bodies;
- (d) Public office and political affiliations held to ascertain whether the nominee does not hold office in a political party in compliance with Article 77(2) of the Constitution that prohibits an appointed State Officer from holding an office in a political party;
- (e) Information on whether the nominee has been removed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution which prohibits a State Officer who has been removed from office under this Article from holding any other State Office;
- (f) Nominee's finances;
- (g) Tax status and net worth;
- (h) Potential conflict of interest Section 12 (1) of the Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003 stipulates that a public officer shall use his best efforts to avoid being in a position in which his personal interests conflict with his official duties;
- (i) Whether the nominee has been charged in a court of law in the past three years; and
- (j) Whether the nominee has been adversely mentioned in a report of Parliament or a Commission of inquiry in the past three years.

3.1 Hon Ochieng Mbeo - Nominee for the position of Chairperson of the Board

Hon. Ochieng G. Mbeo appeared before the Committee on Tuesday, 6th August, 2019 at 9.00 am and was interviewed pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution, Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and the Standing Orders of the National Assembly.

The nominee responded to several questions during the vetting as follows:-

Citizenship, Date and Place of Birth

He is Kenyan, male citizen, Identity Card Number 4859537, born on 5th April, 1948 in Homa Bay County.

Academic and Professional Qualifications

(a) In 1974, he graduated with a Masters degree in International Management from American Graduate School of International Management.

- (b) In 1973, he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science and history from Guilford College, North Carolina, USA.
- (c) Between year 1965 and year 1968 he pursued his secondary school education at the Duke of Gloucester School in Nairobi (current Jamhuri high school). Prior to his secondary education between year 1956 and 1964 he attended Kamagambo Mission School and Ranen mission school in Migori County for his primary education.

Work and professional experience

1) Political Experience

- (a) In year 2017 and year 2013 National elections he was unsuccessful (ODM) Senatorial Nomination candidate for Migori County.
- (b) Between year 2002 and year 2005 he was a (NARC) Election Board Member and deputy director of elections.
- (c) Between year 2001 and year 2006 he was a Member of East Africa legislative Assembly (EALA). In EALA he was the Chairman of Regional Affairs and Conflict Resolution Committee and a Committee Member of Tourism, Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee.
- (d) Between year 1995 and year 1997 he was the President of Global Parliamentarians on Habitat Africa
- (e) Between year 1994 and year 1997 he was the Member of Parliament for Mathare Constituency (current Kasarani Constituency)

2) Business Experience

- (a) From year 2016 to date he is the Chairman of Aquaculture Round table, Kenya which brings together all the players and stakeholders in fish farming value chain
- (b) From year 2013 to date he was the founder and is chairman of Lakeview fisheries limited.
- (c) From 2008 to date he was the founder and is the Chairman of Kinda Company Limited which engages in social and economic activities in the former Nyanza province through Nyanza consultative and development forum
- (d) Between year 1983 and year 1998 he was the executive Chairman of Olago Pharmaceutical limited in Nairobi.
- (e) Between year 1980 and year 1983 he was the marketing manager, Johnsons Wax (EA)
- (f) Between year 1980 and 1983 he was the Sales and marketing manager, Colgate Palmolive (EA)

Professional Associations

He is a member and Chairman of Aquaculture Round Table Kenya whose vision is to bring together all stakeholders in the fish farming value chain.

Potential Conflict of Interest

There was a potential conflict of interest being the Chairman and founder of Lakeview fisheries limited which was founded in year 2013. The company is a supplier of tilapia fish and other fish products to Nairobi and Eldoret with current annual production of about 500 metric tonnes.

The Nominee informed the Committee that he was willing to relinquish his position as Chairman of Lakeview fisheries limited if his nomination is approved by Parliament.

Sources of Income and Net-worth

His sources of income comprise of rental income; dividends from shares in various listed companies; and Parliamentary pension.

Integrity

The nominee has not been dismissed nor removed from office for contravening the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution. He has also not been adversely associated with practices that depict bias, favoritism or nepotism in the discharge of public duties. He has not been charged in court of law in the last three years or been adversely been mentioned in an investigatory report of Parliament or any other Commission of inquiry in the last three years.

However, the nominee has pending matters with KRA due to non-compliance status from the letter received by the committee from KRA (*annexure 6*). The nominee tabled tax compliance certificate dated 6th July 2018 (*annexure 10*) that indicated he was tax compliant tabling a certificate valid up to 4th July 2019. He acknowledged that between 1994 and 1995 he was informed of outstanding matters which he believed were since resolved and the matter should have been cleared.

Membership to Political Party

The Nominee informed the Committee that he is a life member of ODM party having been a Member of Parliament. However, he dint hold any position in the Party.

4.0 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

The Members deliberated on their interaction with the Nominee and made the following observations taking into consideration the nominee's curriculum vitae, filled questionnaire and having conducted the Vetting hearing: -

- THAT, in the nominee is a Kenyan citizen born in Homa Bay County and does not hold dual citizenship.
- THAT, the nominee possesses a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science and history
 from the Guilford College, North Carolina, USA, and a Master's degree in international
 Management from American graduate school of international Management thunderbird
 Arizona USA.
- 3. THAT, the DCI, HELB and EACC had sent clearance letters with respect to the nominee. The nominee has not been charged in a Court of Law in the last three years.
- 4. THAT, The Kenya Revenue Authority Commissioner of Domestic Taxes, vide letter Ref KRA/CDT/HO/54 dated 1st August 2019 noted that the Nominee was not tax compliant. The Nominee had been alerted of outstanding issues and upon resolution of the same, the status would be reviewed as appropriate.
- 5. THAT, a Tax Compliance Certificate from 05/07/2018 valid to 04/07/2019 was issued by the Kenya Revenue Authority confirming that Gilbert Ochieng Mbeo, of Personal Identification Number A000122092C had filed the relevant tax returns and paid taxes due as provided by law. This was in conformance to item 25 to the schedule in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act no. 33 of 2011. It stated that tax obligations to the state are up to the end of the financial year immediately preceding the nomination for appointment.
- 6. THAT, as stipulated in Article 75(1) of the Constitution, the nominee would resign as Chairman of Lakeview Fisheries Limited prior to his appointment as Chairperson, Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.
- 7. THAT, the nominee does not hold office in any political party and hence satisfies the provisions of Article 77(2) of the Constitution.
- 8. THAT, the nominee had never been dismissed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution for contravention of the provisions of Articles 75(1) (conflict of interest), Article 76 (financial probity), Article 77(restriction on activities of State Officers) and Article 78(2) (dual citizenship) of the Constitution and is therefore fit to hold office as the Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.
- THAT, the nominee has exhibited knowledge of fisheries and fish marketing thus
 making him suitable to serve as the Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Kenya
 Fish Marketing Authority.

5.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

Having conducted the approval hearings for the nominee pursuant to section 201(1)(a) and (2) of the Fisheries Management and Development Act (No 35 of 2016), sections 3 and 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and Standing Order 216 (f), the Committee recommends that the National Assembly approves the appointment of Hon. Ochieng G. Mbeo as Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Kenya Fish Marketing Authority by His Excellency the President of the Republic of Kenya.







- (e) Between 1980 and 1983 he was the marketing manager, Johnsons Wax (EA)

(f) Between 1980 and 1983 he was the Sales and marketing manager, Colgate Palmolive (EA)

Members thereafter sought the following clarifications from the Nominee;

- 1. What his legacy would be as the first Chairperson of the Authority?
- 2. Whether he would relinquish the position held in Lakeview Fisheries Limited?
- 3. Whether he was aware of tax non compliance/outstanding tax issues?
- 4. What measures he would implement to partner with National and County Government

The Committee was informed that the Nominee had no outstanding tax issues and he tabled a certificate to that effect. In addition, the Nominee had vast experience in governance and would attract funding from development partners to grow the fishing industry to great heights while collaborating with all arms of government for the benefit of the fish farmer. Finally, the Members noted that the Nominee was a lifetime Orange Democratic Movement Party Member without holding any office in the political party and was ready to resign from Lakeview Fisheries Limited prior to taking up appointment as Chairman, Kenya Fisheries Marketing Authority.

COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

The Members deliberated on their interaction with the Nominee and made the following observations taking into consideration the nominee's curriculum vitae, filled questionnaire and having conducted the approval hearing: -

- 1. THAT, in the nominee is a Kenyan citizen born in Homa Bay County and does not hold dual citizenship.
- THAT, the nominee possesses a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science and history from the Guilford College, North Carolina, USA, and a Master's degree in international Management from American graduate school of international Management thunderbird Arizona USA.
- 3. THAT, the DCI, HELB and EACC had sent clearance letters with respect to the nominee. The nominee has not been charged in a Court of Law in the last three years.
- 4. THAT, The Kenya Revenue Authority Commissioner of Domestic Taxes, vide letter Ref KRA/CDT/HO/54 dated 1st August 2019 noted that the Nominee was not tax compliant. The Nominee had been alerted of outstanding issues and upon resolution of the same, the status would be reviewed as appropriate.
- 5. THAT, a Tax Compliance Certificate from 05/07/2018 valid to 04/07/2019 was issued by the Kenya Revenue Authority confirming that Gilbert Ochieng Mbeo, of Personal Identification Number A000122092C had filed the relevant tax returns and paid taxes due as provided by law.
- 6. THAT, as stipulated in Article 75(1) of the Constitution, the nominee would resign as Chairman of Lakeview Fisheries Limited prior to his appointment as Chairperson, Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.

- 7. THAT, the nominee does not hold office in any political party and hence satisfies the provisions of Article 77(2) of the Constitution.
- 8. THAT, the nominee had never been dismissed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution for contravention of the provisions of Articles 75(1) (conflict of interest), Article 76 (financial probity), Article 77(restriction on activities of State Officers) and Article 78(2) (dual citizenship) of the Constitution and is therefore fit to hold office as the Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.
- THAT, the nominee has exhibited knowledge of fisheries and fish marketing thus
 making him suitable to serve as the Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the
 Kenya Fish Marketing Authority.

COMMITTEE RESOLUTION

Having conducted the approval hearings of the Nominee, pursuant to section 201(1)(a) and (2) of the Fisheries Management and Development Act (no. 35 of 2016) sections 3 and 5 of the Public Appointments Parliamentary Approval Act, and Standing Order 216(f) the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock Committee after deliberations resolved that: -

i. The House Approves the Nomination of Hon. Ochieng G. Mbeo, for the position of Chairperson, Board of Directors of the Kenya Fisheries Marketing Authority.
