A Bill for

AN ACT of Parliament to provide for the equitable division of revenue raised nationally between the national and county governments in 2019/20 financial year, and for connected purposes

ENACTED by Parliament of Kenya, as follows-

Short title.	<b>1.</b> This Act may be cited as the Division of Revenue Act, 2019 and shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1 <sup>st</sup> July 2019.		
Interpretation.	2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—		
No. 16 of 2011.	"revenue" has the meaning assigned to it under section 2 of the Commission on Revenue Allocation Act, 2011.		
Object and purpose of the Act.	<b>3.</b> The object and purpose of this Act is to provide for the equitable division of revenue raised nationally between the national and county levels of government for the financial year 2019/20 in accordance with Article 203(2) of the Constitution.		
Allocation to national and county governments.	4. Revenue raised by the national government in respect of the financial year 2019/20 shall be divided among the national and county governments as set out in the Schedule to this Act.		
Variation in revenue.	<b>5.</b> (1) If the actual revenue raised nationally in the financial year falls short of the expected revenue set out in the Schedule, the shortfall shall be borne by the national government.		
	(2) If the actual revenue raised nationally in the financial year		

(2) If the actual revenue raised nationally in the financial year exceeds the projected revenues set out in the Schedule, the excess revenue shall accrue to the national government, and may be used to reduce borrowing or pay debts.

#### The House resolved on Wednesday, February 13, 2019 as follows:-

- **II. THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in debate on **Reports of Committees**, including a Report of a Joint Committee of the Houses of Parliament or any other Report submitted to the House for which limitation of time has not been specified, shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order.
- **III. THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on any **Motion**, including a Special motion shall be limited in the following manner:- A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order.
- **IV.** THAT, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on Bills sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen minutes (15) in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Committee, in that order.
