THAT, taking into consideration the findings of the Select Committee on Implementation on its Report on Examination of the Implementation Status of the Resolution of the House of 6th June, 2019 regarding the conditional Approval of Ms. Mwende Mwinzi for Appointment as Ambassador of Kenya to Seoul, South Korea, laid on the Table of the House on November 27, 2019, which takes cognizance of the determination of the High Court of Kenya of 14th November, 2019, (Nairobi Constitutional Petition No. 367 of 2019) particularly paragraphs 104 and 105 that, while Ms. Mwende Mwinzi cannot be coerced to renounce her citizenship of the United States of America (USA), a person holding dual citizenship ought not be an ambassador unless the person renounces the citizenship of the foreign state as dual citizenship may jeopardize the national interest of the Republic of Kenya against the interest of the foreign state; this House rejects the appointment of Ms. Mwende Mwinzi as an Ambassador.

NOTICES

I. THE KENYA ROADS BOARD (AMENDMENT) BILL (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILLS NO.77) OF 2019)

Notice is given that the Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Transport, Public Works and Housing intends to move the following amendments to the Kenya Roads Board (Amendment) Bill, 2019 at the Committee Stage—

CLAUSE 1

THAT, Clause 1 of the Bill be amended by inserting the words "and shall come into force upon assent" immediately after the expression "2019".

CLAUSE 3

THAT, Clause 3 of the Bill be amended by deleting the proposed new subsection (6) and substituting the following new subsections—

- "(6) Every annual roads programme funded out of any monies whether borrowed or appropriated by the National Assembly shall be managed as approved by the National Assembly.
- (7) The Board shall manage the annual roads programme under sub-section (6) under the directions of the Cabinet Secretary."

CLAUSE 4

THAT, Clause 4 of the Bill be deleted and substituted therefor the following new clause-

- 4. Section 31 of the principal Act is amended
 - (a) in subsection (2) by inserting the following new paragraph immediately after paragraph (d)-
 - (e) such monies as may be appropriated by the National Assembly for the development, maintenance and rehabilitation of roads;
 - (b) by inserting the following new subsection immediately after subsection (2)-
 - "(2A) The National Assembly shall ensure that-
 - (a) not more than ten percent of the monies appropriated under subsection (2)(e) are allocated for maintenance of roads to be administered by the Kenya Rural Roads Authority; and
 - (b) not more than eighteen percent of the monies appropriated under paragraph (a) are allocated for research and standardization, capacity building and monitoring and evaluation, to be administered by the Principal Secretary responsible for matters relating to roads."

- **THAT,** Clause 5 of the Bill be amended in the proposed new section 32A-
 - (a) in sub-clause (1), by inserting the expression "(1)" immediately after the expression 32A;
 - (b) in sub-clause (2), by deleting the words "road development, rehabilitation and maintenance" and substituting therefor the words "maintenance, development and rehabilitation of roads" appearing immediately after the words "demand for";
 - (c) by deleting sub-clause (3) and substituting therefor the following new sub clause—
 "(3) The Cabinet Secretary shall make regulations for the better carrying out of this section."

The House resolved on Wednesday, February 13, 2019 as follows:-

- **II. THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on any **Motion**, including a Special motion shall be limited in the following manner:- A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order.
- THAT, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on Bills sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen minutes (15) in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen Minutes (15) each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order.
- THAT, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in debate on Reports of Committees, including a Report of a Joint Committee of the Houses of Parliament or any other Report submitted to the House for which limitation of time has not been specified, shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority shall be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order.

- (iii) What linkages, collaboration and support systems has the Ministry established with the Non-Governmental Organisations in addressing Female Genital Mutilation in the said counties?
