- 1. The Senate assembled at thirty Minutes past Two O'clock.
- 2. The proceedings were opened with a prayer said by the Speaker
- 3. **NOTICE OF MOTION** (Sen. Abshiro Halake, MP)

THAT, the Senate notes the Report of the Parliament of Kenya Delegation to the 50th Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA) Africa Region Conference held in Zanzibar, Tanzania from 30th August to 5th September, 2019 and laid on the Table on 27th November, 2019.

4. STATEMENTS

i. Pursuant to Standing Order 47 (1)

a) The Senator for Nairobi County (Sen. Johnson Sakaja, MP) made a statement regarding recent spate of arbitrary killings of innocent young Kenyans by police officers across the Nairobi County City.

He noted that the mission of the National police service is to provide professional and people centered service through community partnership and upholding the rule of law for a safe and secure society. He was however, concerned that here are rogue elements within the police service that have no regard for the sanctity of life or the rule of law itself.

He stated that in the last fifteen months 107 men and women have been killed by police officers, 50% of which taking place in Nairobi and further that 69% of the dead were between 18-35 years of age with less than 10% of these cases leading to arrest and prosecution of suspected officers.

He was further concerned that the number of young people being brutalized and executed by rogue officers is alarming. He asked the Senate to demand that all those responsible be reprimanded, dismissed from the National Police Service and prosecuted in accordance with the Law. He further stated that the Inspector General should be held personally liable and should be summoned to shed more light on the steps taken to bring this to an end and the status of all the prosecutions. He called on the Inspector General of Police to present to Parliament strategy and new regulations that ensure humane, professional and responsible policing during demonstrations and picketing as allowed for under Article 37 and the right to assembly. He further asked him to update the Senate on the state of investigations and prosecution of the four officers mentioned.

b) The Senator for Vihiga County (Sen. George Khaniri, MP) made a statement regarding the delayed release of funds to counties leading to industrial action by county workers, in particular nurses in Vihiga County.

He noted that it is in the public domain that counties have had challenges in terms of settling Pending Bills spanning from as far back as the 2013/2014 Financial Year. He was concerned that it is both constitutionally and morally wrong for the National Treasury to delay or deny counties their fair share of revenue for whatsoever reason on account of non-payment of Pending Bills.

The Senator further stated that the County Government of Vihiga is currently in the middle of the worst labor relations circus in the country, specifically in the Department of Health. He was concerned that currently nurses in Vihiga County are on strike, a common occurrence in the counties. The county referral hospital, the sub-county hospitals and even clinics and health centers managed by the county government did not have no nurses on duty due to the strike.

The Senator urged the National Government to appreciate the spirit of devolution and separation of powers, appreciating that the National Treasury was within its rights to advise counties on financial matters but should not withhold funds entirely.

ii. Pursuant to Standing Order 48 (1)

The Senator for Nandi County (Sen. Samson Cherarkey, MP) sought a statement from the Standing Committee on Finance and Budget regarding the pending payment of casual staff who were engaged to work during the 2019 Kenya Population and Housing Census.

iii. Pursuant to Standing Order 51 (1) (a)

The Chairperson, Standing Committee on Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries issued a statement regarding locust invasion in parts of the country.

In his statement, the Chairperson informed the Senate that a meeting that had been scheduled to take place between the Committee and the Cabinet Secretary for Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Cooperative on 20th February, 2020 at 9.00 a.m. did not take place. This, he informed the Senate was because the Cabinet Secretary had requested that the meeting be rescheduled since he was engaged in other official duties.

The Chairperson further informed the Senate that the Committee had again invited the Cabinet Secretary to a meeting on Monday, 24th February, 2020 at 12.00 noon in the Senate Chamber and that all Senators were invited to attend.

After deliberations, the Speaker of the Senate directed that the Cabinet Secretary for Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Cooperative appears before the Standing Committee on Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries on Monday, 24th February, 2020 at 12.00 noon failing which the provisions of Article 125 of the Constitution shall apply to enforce his attendance.
