**THAT**, taking into consideration the findings of the Select Committee on Implementation on its Report on *Examination of the Implementation Status of the Resolution of the House of 6<sup>th</sup> June, 2019 regarding the conditional Approval of Ms. Mwendu Mwinzi for Appointment as Ambassador of Kenya to Seoul, South Korea, laid on the Table of the House on November 27, 2019*, which takes cognizance of the determination of the High Court of Kenya of 14<sup>th</sup> November, 2019, (*Nairobi Constitutional Petition No. 367 of 2019*) particularly paragraphs 104 and 105 that, while Ms. Mwendu Mwinzi **cannot be coerced** to renounce her citizenship of the United States of America (USA), a person holding dual citizenship **ought not** be an ambassador unless the person renounces the citizenship of the foreign state as *dual citizenship may jeopardize the national interest of the Republic of Kenya against the interest of the foreign state*; this House **rejects** the appointment of Ms. Mwendu Mwinzi as an Ambassador.

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# NOTICES

## The House resolved on Tuesday, February 18, 2020 as follows:-

- I. **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on any **Motion, including a Special motion** shall be limited in the following manner:- A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and ten (10) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order.
- II. **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in debate on **Reports of Committees**, including a Report of a Joint Committee of the Houses of Parliament or any other Report submitted to the House for which limitation of time has not been specified, shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of sixty (60) minutes for the Mover in moving and thirty (30) minutes in replying, and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order.
- III. **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in a debate on **Bills sponsored by a Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party or the Leader of the Minority Party** shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of forty five (45) minutes for the Mover, in moving and fifteen (15) minutes in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Bill is not sponsored by the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each (if the Bill is not sponsored by either of them); and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that order.
- IV. **THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4), each speech in debate on **Reports of Constitutional Commissions and Independent Offices** shall be limited as follows:- A maximum of four hours with not more than thirty (30) minutes for the Mover in moving and ten (10) minutes in replying, a maximum of thirty (30) minutes for the Chairperson of the relevant Committee (if the Report is not moved by the Chairperson of the relevant Committee), and a maximum of ten (10) minutes for any other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes each; and that priority shall be accorded to the Chairperson of the relevant Committee, the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, in that order.
