**I. THE PARLIAMENTARY PENSIONS (AMENDMENT) BILL
(NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 45 OF 2019)**

Notice is given that the Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Finance and National Planning intends to move the following amendments to the Parliamentary Pensions (Amendment) Bill, 2019 (National Assembly Bill No. 45) at the Committee Stage—

CLAUSE 2

THAT, the Bill be amended by deleting clause 2 and substituting therefor the following new clause-

Amendment of section 8 of Cap. 196.

2. Section 8 of the Parliamentary Pensions Act is amended —

(a) in sub-section (1) (b) by deleting the word “two” and substituting therefor the word “one”; and

(b) by inserting the following new subsection immediately after subsection (2)-

“(3)Notwithstanding subsection (2), a former Member of Parliament who, having served in Parliament between 1st July, 1984 and 1st January, 2001 and is entitled to pension under this section, and whose monthly pension amounts to less than one hundred thousand shillings, shall be entitled, with effect from 1st July, 2010, to a monthly pension of one hundred thousand shilling.”

The House resolved on Tuesday, July 28, 2020 as follows:-

- II.** **THAT**, pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 97(1) and notwithstanding the resolution of the House of February 18, 2020, the House **further Orders** that, during the Sittings of the House of July 28, 2020 up to and including August 13, 2020, each speech in **debate** on **Bills, Motions** (*including Special Motions*), **Sessional Papers** and **Committee Reports**, shall be limited as follows:- a maximum of **two and half hours** with not more than ten (10) minutes for the Mover in moving and five (5) minutes in replying and a maximum of five (5) minutes for any other Member speaking, except for the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Committee who shall be limited to a maximum of ten (10) minutes, and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and Chairperson of the relevant Committee, in that order.
