CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWARD

The Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill, 2020 was passed by the National Assembly on **Wednesday**, 6th **May**, 2020. The Bill was seeking to amend the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 to empower the Parliamentary Service Commission to establish a fund for Parliament or a House of Parliament. It also sought to amend the Act to require the approval of the National Assembly on borrowing and guaranteeing of loans by the National Government.

In line with the powers conferred by Article 115 of the Constitution, H.E. the President expressed his reservation to assent to the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill, 2020. Consequently, the Memorandum was sent to the National Assembly on **Thursday**, 11th **June**, 2020 detailing the reasons for his reservations. Thereafter, H.E. the President's Memorandum was referred to the Departmental Committee on Finance and National Planning for consideration.

H.E the President recommended the deletion of section 2A of the Bill as proposed by the House and replacing it with the following new section, "(2A) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), the Parliamentary Service Commission may, with the approval of the National Assembly, establish the following public funds; (a) Parliamentary Mortgage (Members) Scheme Fund; (b) Parliamentary Mortgage (Staff) Scheme Fund; (c) Parliamentary Car Loan (Members) Scheme Fund; (d) Parliamentary Car Loan (Staff) Scheme Fund; and (e) Parliamentary Catering Fund; for purposes of Parliament or a House of Parliament."

The Committee proceeded to consider H.E. the President's Memorandum during a meeting held on Wednesday, 1st July, 2020. The deliberations formed the basis on which the Committee made its decision.

The Committee thanks the Offices of the Speaker and the Clerk of the National Assembly for the technical support extended to it in the process of considering the President's reservations to the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill, 2020. In addition, I thank Members of the Committee and the Secretariat for their sacrifice and commitment in considering the reservations to the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill, 2020.

Hon. Speaker, the Committee having considered H.E the President's Memorandum and recommendations therein **ADOPTS** the reservations to the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill, 2020.

1 PREFACE

1.1 ESTABLISHMENT OF THE COMMITTEE

- 1. The Departmental Committee on Finance & National Planning is one of the fifteen Departmental Committees of the National Assembly established under *Standing Order 216* whose mandates pursuant to the *Standing Order 216 (5)* are as follows:
 - i. To investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;
 - ii. To study the programme and policy objectives of Ministries and departments and the effectiveness of their implementation;
 - iii. To study and review all the legislation referred to it:
 - iv. To study, access and analyze the relative success of the Ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
 - v. To investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned Ministries and departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the House;
 - vi. To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order No. 204 (Committee on appointments);
 - vii. To examine treaties, agreements and conventions;
 - viii. To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation;
 - ix. To consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
 - x. To examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.

1.2 MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

- 2. In accordance with the Second Schedule of the Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to consider, public finance, monetary policies, public debt, financial institutions (excluding those in securities exchange), investment and divestiture policies, pricing policies, banking, insurance, population revenue policies including taxation and national planning and development.

2 THE PRESIDENT'S RESERVATIONS TO THE PUBLIC FINANCE MANAGEMENT (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2020

In his Memorandum, H.E the President submitted that:-

2.1 REASONS FOR REFUSAL TO ASSENT TO THE BILL

- 6. Clause 2 of the Bill was seeking to amend section 24 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 as passed by the House was inserting the following subsection-
 - 2A. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), the Parliamentary Service Commission may, with the approval of the National Assembly, establish any other fund for the purpose of Parliament or a House of Parliament.
- 7. When the Bill was referred to the H.E the President for assent, he declined to assent based on the fact that the said section 24(1) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 establishes a Parliamentary Fund, while section 24(4) empowers the Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury to establish public funds with the approval of the National Assembly. As such the proposed subsection (2A) would amount to duplication of funds for Parliament since one has already been established. Furthermore, the proposed amendment, if enacted in its current form would lead to the duplication of roles with respect to the creation of public funds leading to an adverse impact on the principal of separation of powers between the Executive and the Legislature regarding their respective roles in the management of public monies.

2.2 RECOMMENDATION

- 8. For the foregoing reasons, H.E. the President recommended that the Bill should be amended in clause 2 by deleting the proposed section 2A and substituting therefor the following new section:-
 - (2A) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), the Parliamentary Service Commission may, with the approval of the National Assembly, establish the following public funds-
 - (a) Parliamentary Mortgage (Members) Scheme Fund;
 - (b) Parliamentary Mortgage (Staff) Scheme Fund;
 - (c) Parliamentary Car Loan (Members) Scheme Fund
 - (d) Parliamentary Car Loan (Staff) Scheme Fund; and
 - (e) Parliamentary Catering Fund,

for purposes of Parliament or a House of Parliament.

3 CONSIDERATION OF THE PRESIDENT'S MEMORANDUM ON THE PUBLIC FINANCE MANAGEMENT (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2020

9. The Committee held a meeting on Wednesday, 1st July, 2020 to deliberate on H.E the President's reservations to the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill, 2020. In considering the Memorandum, the Committee noted that the H.E the President's reasons for refusal to assent the Bill were valid and his recommendations were specifying the Funds that the Parliamentary Service Commission can establish. With that in mind, the Committee agreed to support the recommendation and the reasons advanced therein.

4 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

10. The Committee having considered the H.E the President's reservations to the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill, 2020 and pursuant to Article 115 of the Constitution, recommended that the House fully **adopts** H.E the President's recommendations as follows:-

THAT, the Bill be amended in Clause 2 by deleting the proposed section 2A and substituting therefor the following new section:-

- (2A) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), the Parliamentary Service Commission may, with the approval of the National Assembly, establish the following public funds;
- (a) Parliamentary Mortgage (Members) Scheme Fund:
- (b) Parliamentary Mortgage (Staff) Scheme Fund;
- (c) Parliamentary Car Loan (Members) Scheme Fund;
- (d) Parliamentary Car Loan (Staff) Scheme Fund; and
- (e) Parliamentary Catering Fund;

for purposes of Parliament or a House of Parliament.

THE CONSTITUTION OF KENYA

REFUSAL TO ASSENT TO THE PUBLIC FINANCE MANAGEMENT (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2020

MEMORANDUM

By His Excellency the Honourable Uhuru Kenyatta, President and Commander-in-Chief of the Kenya Defence Forces.

Submitted to the Speaker of the National Assembly.

WHEREAS a Bill entitled "A Bill for An Act of Parliament to amend the Public Finance Management Act, 2012", the short title of which is "The Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill, 2020", was passed by the National Assembly on the 6th May, 2020;

AND WHEREAS the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill, 2020, was presented to me for

assent in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, on the 28th May, 2020;

NOW THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Article 115 (1) (b) of the Constitution, I refuse to assent to the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill, 2020, for the reasons set out hereunder:

CLAUSE 2

Clause 2 of the Bill seeks to amend section 24 of the Act by inserting the following new subsection—

(2A) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), the Parliamentary Service Commission may, with the approval of the National Assembly, establish any other fund for the purpose of parliament or a House of Parliament.

Section 24 (1) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, establishes a Parliamentary Fund, while section 24

(4) empowers the Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury to establish public funds with the approval of the National Assembly. The proposed subsection (2A) shall lead duplication of Funds for Parliament since one has already been established. Furthermore, the proposed amendment, if enacted in its current form, shall lead to the duplication of roles with respect to the creation of public Funds. This shall have an adverse impact on the principle of separation of powers between the Executive and the Legislature regarding their respective roles in the management of public monies.

RECOMMENDATION:

For the foregoing reasons, I recommend that the Bill be amended in clause 2 by deleting proposed section 2A and substituting therefor the following new section—

(2A) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), the Parliamentary Service Commission may, with the approval of the

National Assembly, establish the following public funds—

- (a) Parliamentary Mortgage (Members) Scheme Fund;
- (b) Parliamentary Mortgage (Staff) Scheme Fund;
- (c) Parliamentary Car Loan (Members) scheme Fund;
- (d) Parliamentary Car Loan (Staff) Scheme Fund; and
- (e) Parliamentary Catering Fund,

for purposes of Parliament or a House of Parliament.
