NOTICES

The House resolved on Tuesday, November 03, 2020 as follows-

**Limitation of Debate on Bills, Motions (including Special Motions),
Sessional Papers and Committee Reports**

- I. THAT**, pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 97(1) and notwithstanding the resolution of the House of February 18, 2020, during the Sittings of the House of November 3, 2020 up to and including December 3, 2020, each speech in debate on **Bills, Motions (including Special Motions), Sessional Papers and Committee Reports**, shall be limited as follows:- a maximum of two and half hours with not more than ten (10) minutes for the Mover in moving and five (5) minutes in replying and a maximum of five (5) minutes for any other Member speaking, except for the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Committee who shall be limited to a maximum of ten (10) minutes, and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and Chairperson of the relevant Committee, in that order.

The House resolved on Tuesday, February 18, 2020 as follows-

Limitation of Debate on Address by the President

- II. THAT**, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 97(4) and in furtherance to the provisions of Standing Order 24(6), this House orders that, debate on the Motion on the **Address by the President** be limited to no more than thirty (30) minutes for the Mover in moving, twenty (20) minutes for the Leader of the Minority Party, and ten (10) minutes each to the Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs to speak on the Report submitted under Article 132(1)(c)(i) of the Constitution relating to the realization of the national values and principles of governance; the Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Defence and Foreign Relations to speak on the Report submitted under Article 132(1)(c)(iii) of the Constitution relating to the progress made in fulfilling the international obligations of the Republic; and the Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Administration and National Security to speak on the Report submitted under Article 240(7) of the Constitution relating to the state of the security of the Country; and five (5) minutes for any other Member speaking, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover shall be called upon to reply.

328/2020

The Member for Nyandarua County (Hon. Faith Wairimu Gitau, MP) to ask the Cabinet Secretary for Interior and Coordination of National Government-

- (i) What measures has the Ministry put in place to ensure that information that may not have been captured during the *Huduma* Number Registration exercise in 2019 is included on the *Huduma* Card before it is rolled out?
- (ii) What measures has the Ministry put in place to ensure that persons who may not have registered for various reasons, such as the elderly, majority of whom were not able to reach registration centres during the registration exercise are registered?
- (iii) Could the Ministry consider using information available in the current National Identification Cards (IDs) for citizens above 18 years and subsequently upgrading to *Huduma* Cards to save the country the colossal amount of money being spent in the *Huduma* Number exercise?

- (iii) What is the status of implementation of the Bilateral Labour Agreements between the Government of Kenya and Countries in the Middle East Region regarding safety of Kenyan migrant workers?
