**THAT,** aware that the Constitution and the Kenya Gtizenship and Immigration Act, 2011 provide that every citizen is entitled to any document of registration or identification issued by the State to citizens including a birth certificate; further aware that, Artide 53(2) of the Constitution of Kenya provides that a child's best interests are of paramount importance in every matter concerning the child; cognizant of the fact that, issuance of birth certificates during civil registration associated with children is a challenge across the country due to a mong other issues, missing information for the parents and children as a result missing and improper documentations, damaged manual documents, and lack of registration of children born outside hospital environments; deeply concerned over the delays and long queues at civil registration centres and the challenges affecting registration of children by the Ministry of Education using the National Education Management Information System (NEM S) in the Country; **this House urges** the Government to establish database centres in all Givil Registration Centres for purposes of storing all the necessary information required
