- 1. The Senate assembled at thirty minutes past Two O'clock.
- 2. The proceedings were opened with Prayer said by the Speaker.

3. **PETITIONS**

Pursuant to Standing Order 230(2)(1), the Speaker presented to the Senate a Petition by Mr. Wilson Amge Arap Langat, a resident of Baringo County, on alleged corruption, land historical injustices, abuse of human rights, fraudulent use of office for personal gain and oppression of individual rights.

Pursuant to Standing Order 231, the Speaker invited Senators to make comments, observations or seek clarification in relation to the Petition and, subsequently, committed it to the Standing Committee on Justice, Legal Affairs and Human Rights pursuant to Standing Order 232(1).

5. **STATEMENTS**

a) Pursuant to Standing Order 47 (1)

i.) The Senator for Vihiga County (Sen. George Khaniri, MP) made a statement regarding export of raw bananas and broccoli to South Korea.

Whereupon the Senator stated that Kenya is known for its agriculture and agricultural products all over the world including tea, coffee, avocadoes and many other produce and,

The Senator informed the Senate that in 2018, South Korea's Prime Minister, Lee Nak-Yeon pledged to support the key regions that produce broccoli and raw bananas in Kenya, especially during the rapidly increasing demand of these items in South Korea and that the South Korea animal and plant quarantine agency would exempt raw bananas and broccoli from Kenya from undergoing stringent pest risk tests and measures. These tests usually lead to goods worth insurmountable goods worth millions being destroyed, returned to the exporter or banned from the country in totality in the event that the required standards are not met.

The Senator observed that South Korea had thus waived these tests and only requires that the products be accompanied by a phyto-sanitary (plant health) certificate issued by the Kenya plant health inspectorate service (KEPHIS) and yet, in spite of this waiver and three years down the line, exporters are yet to increase their sales to South Korea and production of the two still remains the same.

The Senator noted that this is an opportunity that would help boost the socio-economic development of Kenyans particularly during these COVID-19 pandemic and urged leaders to encourage their constituents to take advantage of this opportunity.

ii.) Nominated Senator (Sen. (Arch.) Sylvia Kasanga, MP) made a statement regarding the activities of the Forum of Parliaments of Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region (FP-ICGLR) for 2020.

The Senator informed the Senate that Kenya is a Member State of the Forum of Parliaments of Member States of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region (FP-ICGLR), which brings together the National Parliaments of the twelve ICGLR Member States, with a view to incorporating a parliamentary dimension in addressing the root causes of conflicts, as well as constraints to development, in the Great Lakes region.

The Senator noted that during the 2020 session, the Forum, like many other parliamentary organizations, was greatly affected by the effects of the prevailing COVID-19 global pandemic. However, the Forum was able to move above and beyond the challenges of the pandemic by utilizing technology to implement its programmes and activities. Virtual meetings of the Forum's committees discussed among others - the effects of the pandemic on peace and security in the region; the case of Member States; the role of Parliament in Promoting Good Governance; the Impact of COVID-19 on Economic Development in the Great Lakes Region; Social Challenges Faced by Households due to COVID-19, and Focus on Domestic Violence.

The Senator further noted that during the 10th Ordinary Session of the Plenary Assembly of the FP-ICGLR, held in Bujumbura on 4th to 7th December, 2019, the General Secretariat undertook an assessment on "Managing cross-border conflicts in the Great Lakes Region". The Forum further undertook an assessment on "the role of Parliament in promoting good governance in the Great Lakes Region", in line with the FP-ICGLR mission to facilitate effective engagement of Parliaments in the implementation of the Pact, plans, through its Committee on Democracy and Good Governance.

The Senator commended the Rt. Honorable Speaker of the Senate, Senator Kenneth Lusaka, EGH, MP, for being elected as the President of the FP-ICGLR during the 11th Ordinary Session of the Plenary Assembly of the Forum that took place virtually on 7th May, 2021.
