- 3. COMMUNICATION FROM THE CHAIR ON THE REPORT BY THE NATIONAL TREASURY ON ALL NEW LOANS BY THE GOVERNMENT FROM 1<sup>ST</sup> APRIL 2021 TO 31<sup>ST</sup> AUGUST, 2021

The Speaker conveyed the following Communication from the Chair-

"Honourable Senators,

Vide a letter referenced DMD4/264 'B', dated 27<sup>th</sup> September, 2021, the National Treasury and Planning submitted a report on all new loans contracted by the Government from 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2021 to 31<sup>st</sup> August, 2021. This report contains details on all new loans signed between the National Government and various creditors for the stated period.

Section 31 (3) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 states that-

"At the end of every four months, the Cabinet Secretary shall submit a report to Parliament stating the loan balances brought forward, carried down, drawings and amortizations on new loans obtained from outside Kenya or denominated in foreign currency, and such other information as may be prescribed by regulations, specifying—

- (a) the names of the parties to the loan;
- (b) the amount of the loan and the currency in which it is expressed and in which it is repayable;
- (c) the terms and conditions of the loan, including interest and other charges payable and the terms of repayment;
- (d) the amount of the loan advanced at the time the report is submitted;

(e) the purpose for which the loan was used and the perceived benefits of the loan; and such other information as the Cabinet Secretary may consider appropriate".

Honourable Senators,

This report is submitted to the Senate for information. However, the Standing Committee on Finance and Budget may scrutinize the contents of this reportand make observations and recommendations thereon.

### 6. **STATEMENTS**

### a) Pursuant to Standing Order 47 (1)

Nominated Senator (Sen. Isaac Ngugi Githua, MP) made a Statement, his maiden speech, on the important role played by the youth in the development of the country.

In the Statement, the Senator averred that the place of the youth in any society could never be underestimated. He argued that in Kenya there is a very youthful population whose energy remains untapped. He stated that the Senate had the opportunity to rectify this by encouraging counties to grant the youth more opportunities and to mobilize and constructively engage them and designing policies that improve their welfare.

The Senator indicated that, while serving as a Senator representing the youth, he would do his best to articulate the needs of all the youth in the country, including the minority populations where communities such as the Ogieks, Dorobo, Elmolo, Waata, Makonde and many others fall. The Senator also stated that he would endeavor to work with the youth by encouraging them to desist from habits such as irresponsible use of drugs and alcoholism, which are harmful to them.

The Senator acknowledged the successes and challenges of past Parliaments and honored those who heroically struggled to bring freedom and justice in the first and second liberation struggles. He pledged to further the aspirations of Kenyans for a responsive government based on essential values for equality, social justice, shared prosperity and rule of law.

### b) Pursuant to Standing Order 51 (1) (a)

The Vice-Chairperson, Standing Committee on National Security, Defence and Foreign Relations issued a statement concerning a fact finding mission to Laikipia County, concerning the incessant banditry attacks in the County by the Committee.

Thereupon, the Chairperson informed the House that following a Statement made by the Senator for Laikipia County, Sen. John Kinyua, concerning the incessant banditry attacks in Laikipia County, the Committee undertook a fact-finding mission to Laikipia County which was undertaken on 13th September, 2021.

The Chairperson reported that during the visit, the Committee held three meetings in Matuiku Shopping Centre, Wangwachi Anti-Stock Theft Camp and Olomoran Shopping Centre. At the meetings, the Committee established that the Kuki Gallman Conservancy was one of the identified dens of bandits who had been harassing and attacking the residents of Laikipia. The residents thereby recommended to the Committee that the Conservancy be taken up by the Government and be placed under the management of the Kenya Wildlife Services. The Committee also observed that learning institutions in the three locations had not resumed, thereby affecting education for children in the areas.

The Chairperson also reported that the Committee established that while there were National Police Reservists engaged by the Government, there was need to recruit more police officers to improve surveillance and facilitate prompt responses during attacks and raids in the county.

The Chairperson informed the Senate that there was cessation of hostility owing to the fact that the National Government had intervened and intensified security operations in the county. However, the residents requested that the intensified operation be sustained with better coordination from the national command center.

The Chairperson submitted that the Standing Committee would pursue the matter and hold another meeting with stakeholders in order to find a lasting solution to the security situation in Laikipia County and to table a comprehensive report thereon.
