



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CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

This report contains the proceedings of the Departmental Committee on Finance and National Planning on its consideration of the Provident Fund (Repeal) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 30 of 2021) which was published on 18th June 2021.

The Bill went through the First Reading on 10th August 2021 and was thereafter committed to the Departmental Committee on Finance and National Planning pursuant to Standing Order 127.

Following placement of adverts in the print media on 19th August 2021 requesting for comments on the Bill from members of the public and relevant stakeholders pursuant to Article 118(1)(b) of the Constitution and Standing Order 127(3), the Committee received no memorandum.

The Bill has four (4) clauses and seeks to repeal the Provident Fund Act in light of the enactment of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012.

On behalf of the Departmental Committee on Finance and National Planning and pursuant to provisions of Standing Order 199(6), it is my pleasant privilege and honour to present to this House the Report of the Committee on its consideration of the Provident Fund (Repeal) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 30 of 2021). The Committee is grateful to the Offices of the Speaker and Clerk of the National Assembly for the logistical and technical support accorded to it during its sittings. I wish to express my appreciation to the Honorable Members of the Committee and the Committee Secretariat who made useful contributions towards the preparation and production of this report.

It is my pleasure to report that the Committee has considered the Provident Fund (Repeal) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 30 of 2021) and have the honour to report back to the National Assembly with the recommendation that the Bill be **approved with amendments** as contained in the report.

1 PREFACE

1.1 ESTABLISHMENT OF THE COMMITTEE

- 1. The Departmental Committee on Finance & National Planning is one of the fifteen Departmental Committees of the National Assembly established under *Standing Order 216* whose mandates pursuant to the *Standing Order 216* (5) are as follows:

 - vi. To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order No. 204 (Committee on appointments);
 - vii. To examine treaties, agreements and conventions;
 - viii. To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation;
 - ix. To consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
 - x. To examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.

1.2 MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

- 2. In accordance with the Second Schedule of the Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to consider, public finance, monetary policies, public debt, financial institutions (excluding those in securities exchange), investment and divestiture policies, pricing policies, banking, insurance, population revenue policies including taxation and national planning and development.

2 OVERVIEW OF THE PROVIDENT FUND (REPEAL) BILL (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 30 OF 2021)

2.1 INTRODUCTION

6. The main objective of the Bill is to repeal the Provident Fund Act in light of the enactment of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012.

2.2 ANALYSIS OF THE BILL

- 7. The Bill repeals the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 and has 4 clauses. It proposes the following amendments:
- 8. Clause 1 of the Bill provides for the short title.
- 9. Clause 2 of the Bill provides for the interpretation of terms.
- 10. Clause 3 of the Bill provides for the repeal of CAP 191.
- 11. Clause 4 of the Bill provides for the transitional provisions.
- 12. The Bill does not delegate legislative power or limit any fundamental rights and freedoms.
- 13. The enactment of this Bill shall not occasion additional expenditure of public funds.

4 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

In considering the Bill, the Committee observed that:

- 15. The Bill seeks to close the Provident Fund that vested pension for Government employees during the colonial era.
- 16. There is a need for the Auditor General to submit an audit of the Fund to establish any liabilities and assets thereof.

5 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

17. The Committee having considered the Provident Fund (Repeal) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 30 of 2021) recommends that the House approves the Bill with amendments as proposed in the schedule in Part 6.

6 SCHEDULE OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS
