#### 8. STATEMENTS

#### a) Pursuant to Standing Order 47 (1)

The Senator for Nandi County (Sen. Samson Cherarkey, MP) made a statement concerning the brutal murder of athlete Agnes Jebet Tirop.

Thereupon he informed the Senate that Agnes Tirop was born in October 23<sup>rd</sup> 1995 at Kapnyemisa Lelmokwo Ngechek ward in Nandi County. Her life was brutally cut short barely a week to her 26<sup>th</sup> birthday. The Senator stated that Ms. Tirop's first taste of international success saw her win the world junior 5,000m bronze in 2012 and 2014, as well as the world junior cross-country silver in 2013. Two years later, during a rapid ascent, she won the senior World Cross Country championships in China at the age of 19, becoming the second-youngest woman to do so after Zola Budd of 1985 to claim gold.

The Senator reminded the Senate that during the month of September 2021, the late Tirop broke the women 10km world record, and had also competed for Kenya in the just concluded Tokyo Olympics, placing fourth in the 5,000 metres.

The Senator expressed concern that Kenya had lost a young and promising hero who, at the age of 25 years, had brought so much glory to her country, and called upon Athletics Kenya and the Ministry of Sports to set up a fully functional department of guidance and counselling to ensure athletes mental wellness is kept and checked at all times.

In conclusion, the Senator condemned the brutal act meted on the young athlete with the strongest terms possible, and urged all the relevant authorities to complete the investigation and bring the perpetrators to book as soon as possible to ensure justice is served to the family of Agnes Tirop.
