5. STATEMENTS

a) Pursuant to Standing Order 47 (1)

The Senator for Nairobi City County (Sen. Sakaja Johnson, MP) made a Statement regarding the operations of the Intelligence and Strategic Operations (ISO) Department of the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA).

In the Statement, the Senator informed the Senate that KRA leverages on the potential of intelligence gathering and analysis, among other strategies, to combat tax evasion and other tax related crimes. The Senator further informed the Senate that intelligence management function of the ISO has been key in the collection of information relating to tax evasion, cyber crime and corruption and has continued to enhance the institution's capacity to penetrate and quash tax evasion cartels.

The Senator, raised concerns that the Department is now engulfed in allegations of poor policies and practices that inhibit legal transactions. He highlighted that there have been cases of prolonged holding of consignments

on allegations of tax evasion, an exercise which has affected business operations and trade in the country.

In conclusion, the Senator appealed to the Commissioner General of KRA to ensure that ISO works within its mandate and ensure that there are effective linkages between departments, geared towards increased revenue collection for the benefit of the country.

Thereafter, the Speaker allowed comments from Senators on the Statement and subsequently referred it to Standing Committee on Finance and Budget, pursuant to Standing Order 47 (3).
