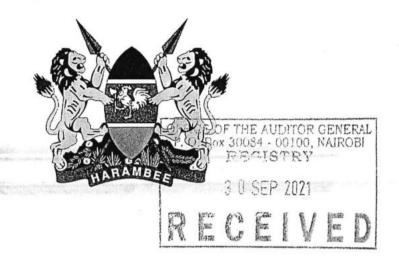

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1. KEY ENTITY INFORMATION AND MANAGEMENT

(a) Background information

The Executive Office of the President as defined by Executive Order No. 1/2018 of June, 2018 (Revised) on Organization of the Government comprise of State House, Office of the Deputy President and the Cabinet Affairs Office. Following a Deed of Transfer of Functions executed between the National Government and the Nairobi City County Government recently, Nairobi Metropolitan Services (NMS), was established. It was established and domiciled in the Executive Office of the President to coordinate the implementation of the Deed.

At policy level, the Executive Office of the President is headed by the Head of the Public Service who is responsible for the general policy and strategic direction. At the operational and departmental level, the day to day operations of the Office is overseen by the Comptroller with regard to State House and who is also the appointed Accounting Officer for Vote 1011-The Executive Office of the President. A Principal Administrative Secretary and Assistant Secretary to the Cabinet oversees affairs of Cabinet Office, while a Secretary Administration similarly oversees the operations of the Office of the Deputy President. A Director — General oversees the operations of the Nairobi Metropolitan Services. The Accounting Officer has delegated the budget execution to the respective heads of Departments.

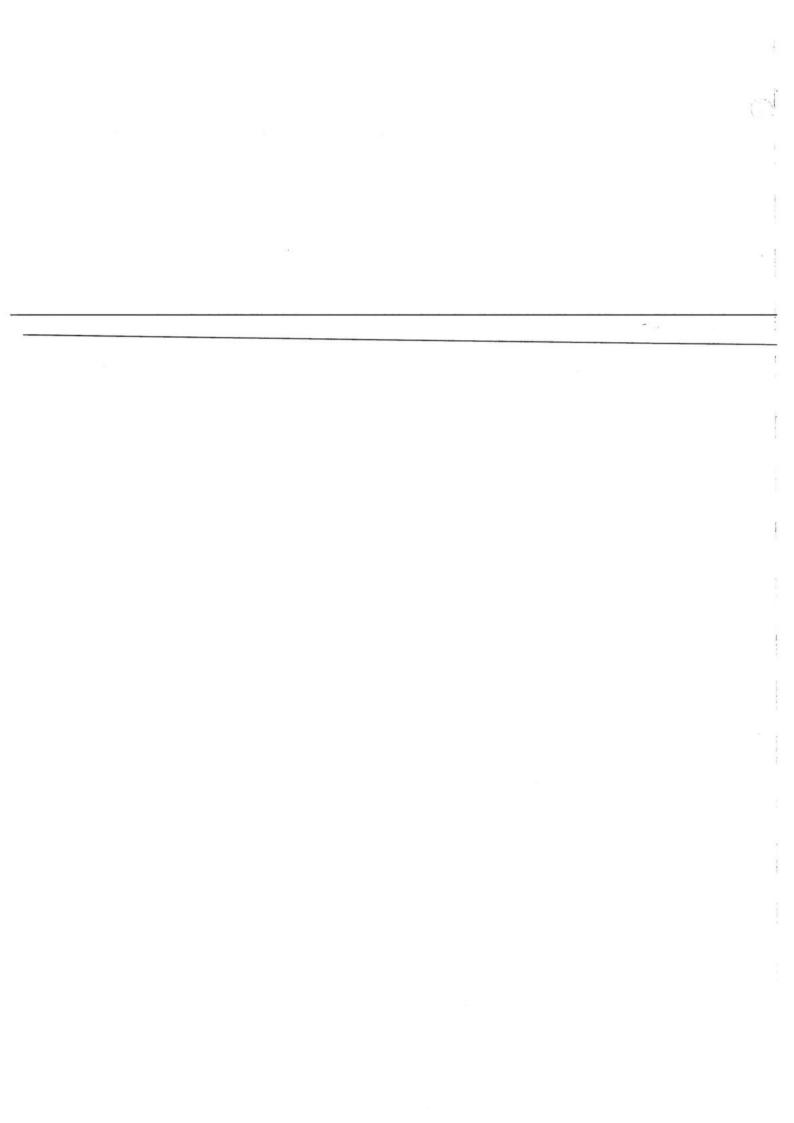

Dr. Joseph K. Kinyua, EGH Head of the Public Service

Dr. Joseph K. Kinyua EGH. begun his career as an assistant lecturer at The University of Nairobi in 1978. He joined the Central Bank of Kenya in 1980 and worked his way through the ranks, from an Economist to Director of Research. Mr. Kinyua also worked as an Economist on a fixed term appointment with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) during 1985 – 1990, after which he returned back to the Central Bank of Kenya.

He was appointed Financial Secretary to the Treasury in June 1995, a position he held until July 1999 when he re-joined the Central Bank of Kenya as Director of Financial Markets. In October, 2000 he was appointed Director of Research and Chief Economist, Central Bank of Kenya; and in September 2002, he was appointed as Permanent Secretary to the Treasury, a position he held until January 2003 when he was appointed Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Planning and National Development. In July 2003 he was appointed Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Agriculture where he served until July 2004 when he was re-appointed as Permanent Secretary to the Treasury until June 2013.

Currently, he is the Head of the Public Service in the Executive Office of the President, a position to which he was appointed in October, 2013.

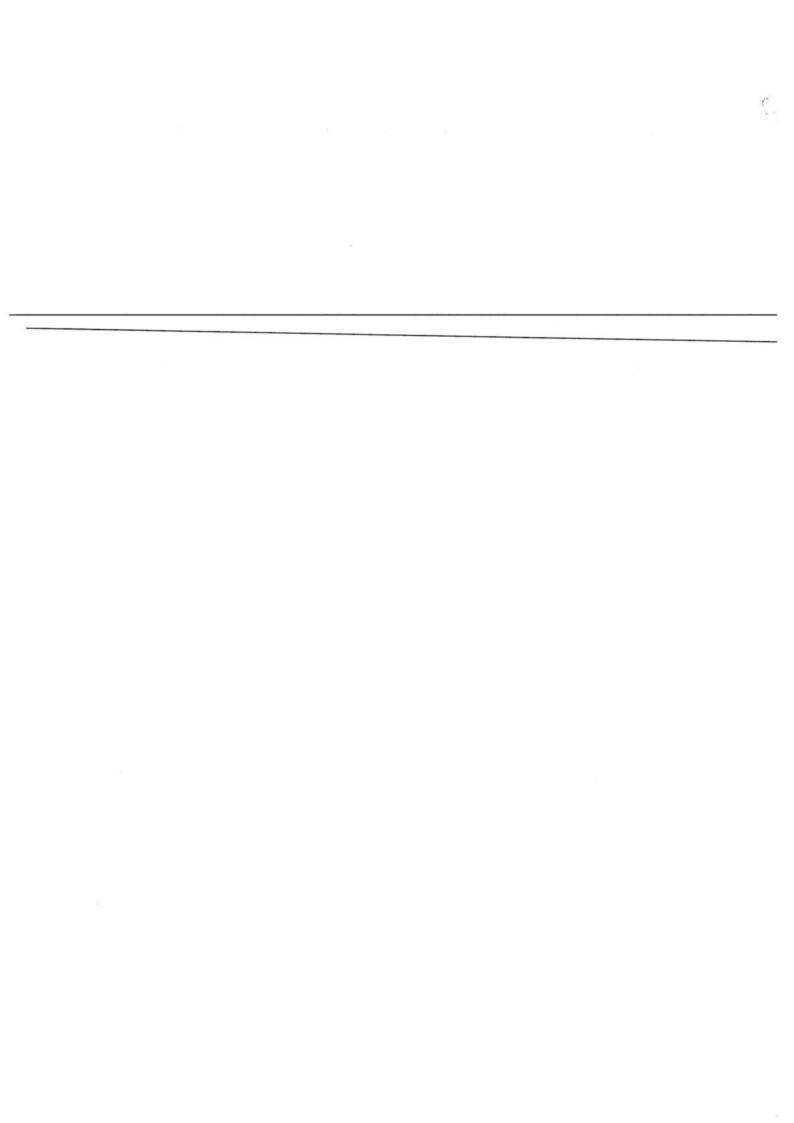

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2. FOREWORD BY THE HEAD OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE



On behalf of The Executive Office of the President, I present the financial statements for 2020/21 Financial Year. The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with the Constitution and Section 81 (1) of the PFM Act, 2012. They have also been prepared according to the standards set out by the Public Sector Accounting Standards Board and the International Public Sector Accounting Standards (IPSAS) both of which prescribe the format, policies, treatment of expenditures, among others for such statements.

The statements have been derived from the records maintained of our financial transactions for the year ended 30th June, 2021. They thus disclose with accuracy the true position of financial affairs of the Office during the reporting year and also reflect the true and fair position of the financial status of the Office. Nothing has been brought to my attention that the Office will not continue to deliver services to the public to necessitate initiation of action to fore stall such an eventuality. The public should thus rest assured of continued service delivery in the coming period.

The statements, besides expressing the financial status of the Office have gone further to show how the votes were applied on the priority programmes and sub-programmes in the reporting period. The report has also outlined the outcomes and outputs achieved by the various programmes including the challenges faced where targets were not achieved. This is necessary for demonstrating to the tax payers how their resources were spent and for purposes of learning useful lessons for improving future programming.

The resources voted under the Office were spent in strict adherence with the laws and regulations governing public finance management. Due care was exercised to ensure that such expenditures realized value for money, and most importantly met Kenyans needs and aspirations. They were applied to fund government priority policies- The Kenya Vision 2030, the Big Four Agenda and other policies in force. This is necessary to strengthen Kenya's economic base for purposes of ensuring sustainable growth and prosperity. The Office therefore remains committed to appropriate public resources prudently and account for them as expected by law and the people of Kenya for improved service delivery.

Budget Performance Based on Economic Classification and Programmes

The Executive Office of the President was allocated a budget of Ksh.41,032,010,348 during 2020/2021 financial year vide Vote 1011. This budget comprised Ksh.26,991,960, 253 recurrent while Kshs. 14,040,050,095 was allocated for development. The development allocation for the year comprised a UNICEF grant of Ksh.18,000,000 support to the Presidential Policy & Strategy Unit and a further grant of Kshs.528,742,787 from the Kenya - EU Partnership on National Strategy to Counter Terrorism.

The budget for the Office in 2020/2021 Financial Year was appropriated under five key programmes namely: Cabinet Affairs, Government Advisory Services, State House Affairs, Deputy President Services and the Nairobi Metropolitan Services.

Programme 1: Cabinet Affairs

This programme seeks to facilitate effective and efficient public policy formulation, implementation, monitoring and evaluation for enhanced service delivery and harmonious government operations. The programme was allocated **Kshs.** 2,206,524,019 which comprised 5.40% of the total budget. The resources were applied on the following sub-programmes:

a) Sub-Programme: S.P. 1.1: Management of Cabinet Affairs

S.P. 1.2: Advisory Services

S.P. 1.3: Resource Surveys and Remote Sensing

Programme 2: Government Advisory Services

This programme aims at facilitating and enhancing public policy advisory for effective management of public affairs. It was allocated Kshs. 996,450,174 which is equivalent to 2.40% of the budget. The budget was applied on the following sub-programmes:

(a) Sub-Programmes

S.P. 2.1: Power of Mercy Advisory Services

S.P. 2.2: Counter-Terrorism Advisory Services

Programme 3: State House Affairs

The programme's objective is to facilitate efficient and effective execution of the President's mandate as per the Constitution and other laws. It was allocated Kshs. 5,956,932,266 or 14.50% of the total budget. This budget was applied on the following sub-programmes:

Sub Programmes:

S.P. 3.1:

Coordination of State House functions

S.P.3.2:

Administration of statutory benefits for the Retired

Presidents and State Officers.

S.P. 3.3:

Strategic Policy, Public Sector Performance

Monitoring.

Programme 4: Deputy President Services

The resources allocated under this Programme facilitate the Deputy President to discharge his mandate as given in the Constitution as the Principal Assistant to the President. The Programme was allocated Kshs. 1,528,613,264 representing 3.73% of the budget during 2020/2021 annual budget. The budget was applied on the following sub-programmes:

Sub Programmes:

S.P. 4.1: General administration, Planning and Support Services

S.P. 4.2: Coordination and Supervision

Programme 5: Nairobi Metropolitan Services

This is a new Programme introduced during 2020/2021 financial year. Its purpose is to coordinate the implementation of the Deed of Transfer of Functions executed between the National Government and Nairobi City County Government. It was allocated Kshs. 30,343,490,625 representing 73.95% of the Presidency's vote and was applied on the following sub-programmes:

Sub Programmes:

S.P. 5.1: General Administration and Support

S.P. 5.2: Coordination of Nairobi Metropolitan Functions

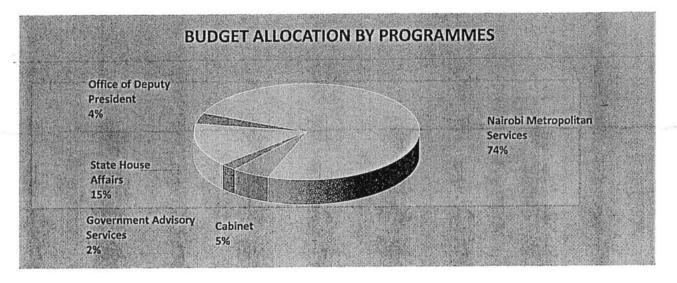


Figure 1: Allocation of Resources in the Executive office of the President by Programmes, 2020/2021 Financial year

Actual receipts by the Executive office of the President stood at 26.03% below budget while actual payments fell short of the budget by 26.08%. This negatively impacted on the planned service delivery by the Office during 2020/2021 Financial Year. The failure to release the full exchequer to fund the budget is mainly attributed to challenges arising from the late approval of Supplementary budget towards end of June 2021 which negatively affected procurement of goods and services (acquisition of assets and use of goods and services) which are guided by mandatory rules and regulations.

Budget Utilisation

The Executive Office of the President spent KShs.30,329,846,787 against an approved budget of KShs.41,032,010,348. Utilisation of the budget was carried out through various activities (Economic Classifications) as shown in Table 6

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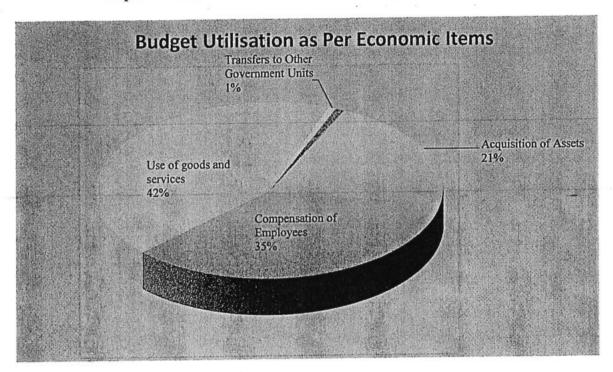


Figure 2: Utilization of Resources in The Executive office of the President by Economic items, 2020/2021 Financial year

Key Achievement for the Executive Office of the President in 2020/21 Financial Year.

- Restricted working periods occasioned by need to control spread of COVID 19 pandemic.
- Reduced budget resources after clearing pending bills as first charge.
- Succession management and staff capacity building challenges
- Frequent breakdown of machines and equipment needed for service delivery

Key Risk Management Strategies

To mitigate the challenges faced, the Office plans to-

- Enhance timely processing of payments and clear them as Exchequers are given.
- Enhance human Resource capacity by training the existing technical staff including hiring of new ones in collaboration with the Public Service Commission.

- 3. Training 48,000 Special Interest Persons (i.e. Women, Youth and Vulnerable persons) on Livelihood related skills.
- 4. Implementing the National Counter-Terrorism Strategy
- 5. Mapping the Maasai Mara range land resource ecosystem for estimating wildlife population.
- 6. Preparing eleven (11) management audits on state corporations and evaluating 200 boards.
- 7. Improved waste collection from 1800 tons to 2500 tons/ per day.

Projects Implementation:

During 2020/2021 financial year, Executive office of the President implemented the following projects-

- Survey of 4,552 parcels of county allotted property and preparation of 7,445 lease documents for issuance of titles.
- Rehabilitation of County rental houses (-520) Buru Buru, Kariobangi South and Jamhuri.
- Markets Renovation Muthurwa, Wakulima, Jericho, Kariobangi South, Landhies Road, Toi, Kayole Spine and Embakasi Village.
- Expansion of road network: (tarmacking 30km of new roads, re-carpeting 43.3km, maintained 88km roads, constructing 18km of Non-motorized transport facilities –walkways, rehabilitation of five (5) bus termini and construction of one new bus terminus at Green Park.)

The implementation of projects and programmes funded in this Office was greatly challenged by COVID -19 and its containment measures.

Challenges faced and Strategies for their Mitigation

The Office faced the following challenges during the financial year -

- 1. Limited budgetary resource allocation.
- 2. Management of pending bills.
- 3. Lack of specialized equipment required for service delivery or implementation of projects.
- 4. Lack of adequate technical staff especially medical personnel given the limited resources.
- 5. Declining resources allocated for key programmes like health, among others.

Recommendations

To mitigate challenges faced the Executive office of the President:

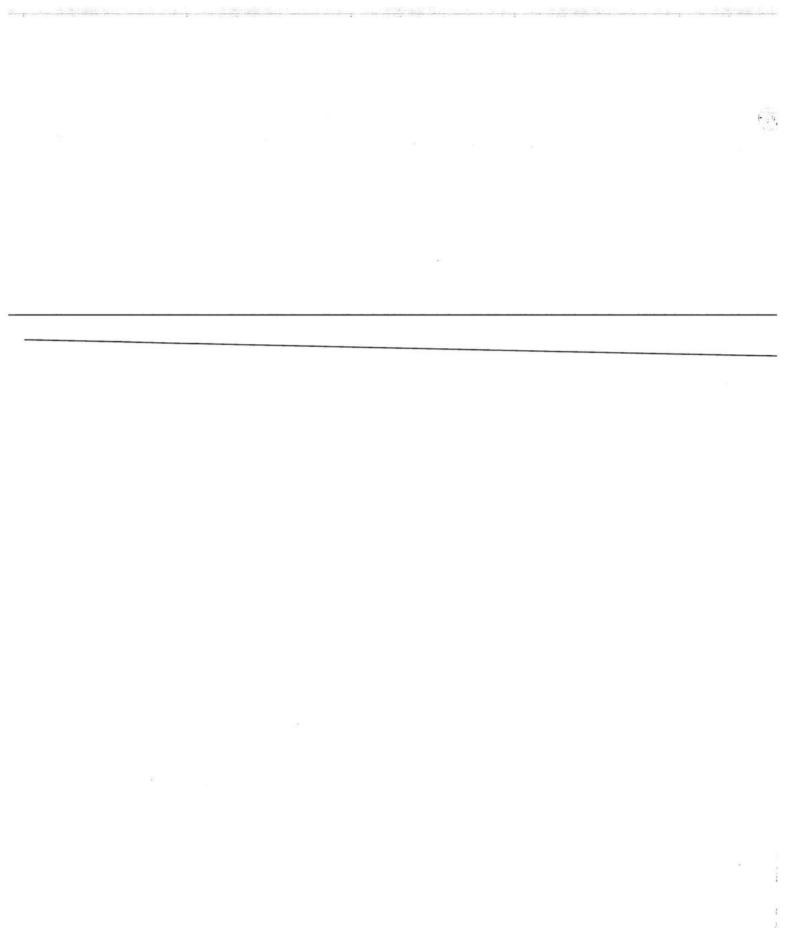
- Will enhance human resource capacity by prioritizing technical departments.

Progress in the Attainment of Strategic Objectives

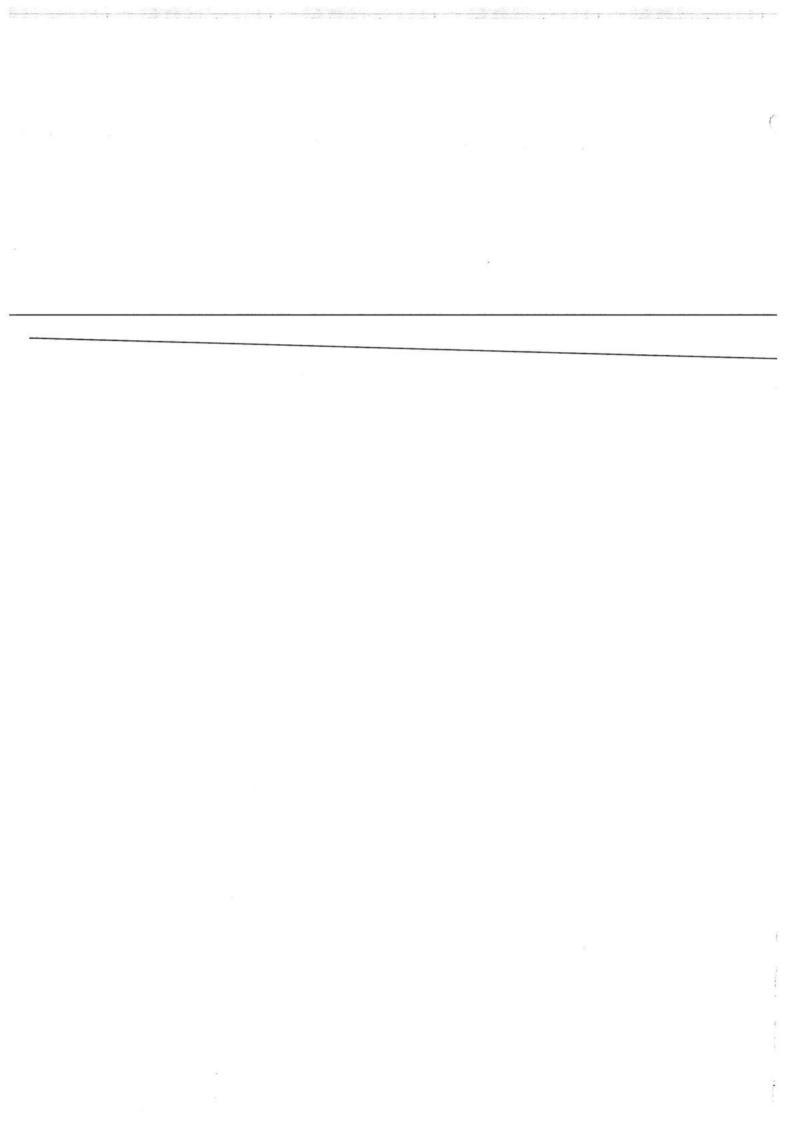

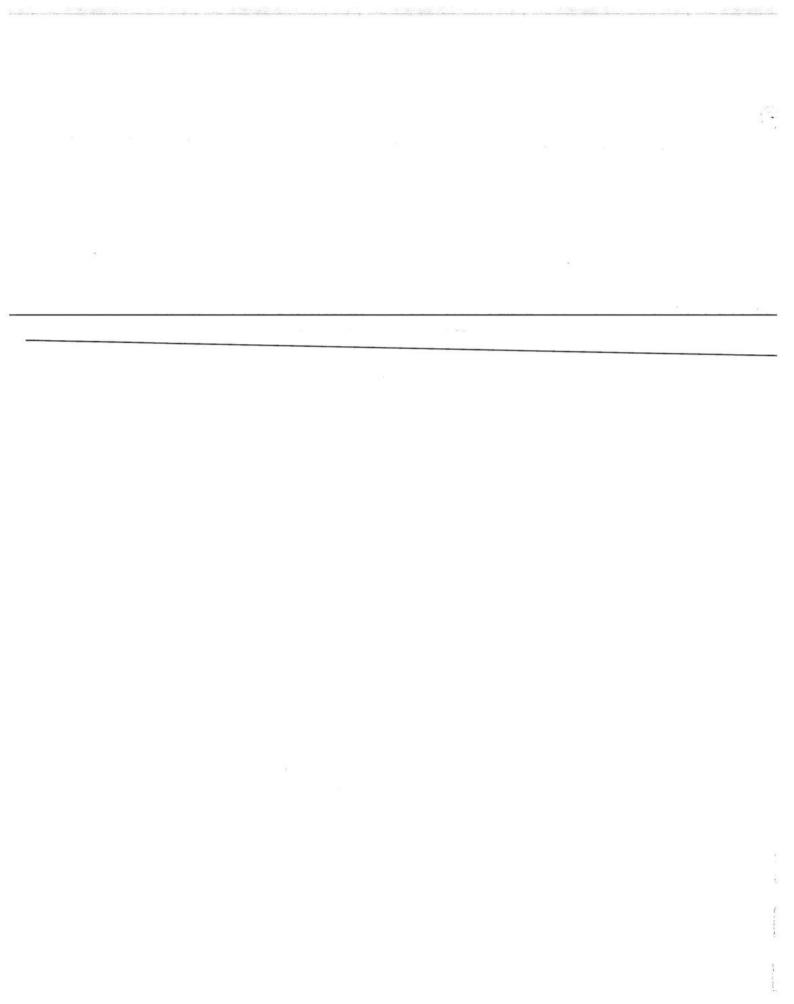

4. CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT/ SUSTAINABILITY REPORTING

This Office recognizes its Corporate Social Responsibility to Kenyans. Accordingly, it implements Corporate Social Responsibility Programmes geared towards the enhancement of lives of the vulnerable in the society. This includes women, youth and persons living with disability. With regard to People Living with Disability, the Office gives an annual grant of Kshs.200 million to the National Fund for the Disabled of Kenya. These resources are spent on buying assistive devices for disabled persons, capacity building, training workshops, issuance of small grant for income generation activities as well as for expanding the revenue base for the National Fund for the Disabled of Kenya. In 2020/21 Financial Year, the Office facilitated issuance of Kshs.920 million towards People Living with Disability.

The Office is also cognizant of the needs of people living in the informal settlements. For purposes of containing the spread of COVID-19 and to provide clean water as a Right to the Residents, the Office supplied free clean water to the residents of informal settlements. The Office also addressed the plight of Kenyans who were adversely affected by the effects of COVID-19. Consequently, it oversaw the continued implementation of the Tax relief accorded to Kenyans until the end of first half of 2020/2021 Financial Year.

In furtherance of good health among mothers, the Office through the First Lady's Office has been implementing the Beyond zero campaign. The initiative seeks to promote safe motherhood and good health for infants and mobilizes resources – funds, equipment which are given to the needy areas of the country. Over Kshs.3 billion has been spent on this programme in 47 counties. The Office of the First Lady has also been at the forefront in motivating students to study hard. It manages the Pupils reward Scheme (PURES) through which best performing students are rewarded for academic excellence. In addition, the Office also mentors the students to become responsible citizens. Over 4,500 have benefited from this scheme.

The Office also implements a youth engagement programme with the objective of making them participate in matters of governance in the country. During the engagement, the government listens to their needs for purposes of devising ways of meeting them. One such need which has not been met for this group is skills training for self-reliance. During the period under review, the Office undertook business training for youth with the objective of preparing them to initiate their own businesses. Through the youth programme, the youth are mentored and molded into responsible citizens, most importantly to keep them off some organizations luring them to join proscribed groups. Through the same programme, the Office has procured and delivered sports kits to registered groups for purposes of helping them to engage productively in games during their free time.

Sustainability strategy and profile

In a fast changing world in the management of public affairs, the Executive Office of the President is aware of need to sustain quality public service delivery for the country. This will be attained through-

Creation of Institutions:

Towards this end, and in collaboration with Public Service Commission, the Office continues to create institutions to provide the desired services to Kenyans. This includes the review of the structure of Government to create new State Department for Competency Based Curriculum, State Corporations across Ministries/ Departments.

Creation of Appropriate Policy and Legal Environment for sustained growth.

The Executive Office of the President as the Apex Ministry is desirous of Kenya's continued growth and prosperity. It has continued to work with stakeholders to put in place robust policy and legislative measures for sustainable development. It has thus continued to oversee and strictly monitor the implementation of Key policies like Kenya Vision 2030, Agenda Four (Manufacturing, Universal Health care, Food and Nutrition Security and Housing), among other national priorities. The Office has also worked with other public agencies to identify and review policies and laws necessary for stimulating the growth and development of our Country in all the sectors within the broader public sector reforms. During the year under review, the Office created the fully fledged Department of The Oceans and Blue Economy purposely to provide overall policy guidance and coordination in the appropriation of Kenya's maritime resources. This was done on the realization that our marine resources have great potential for national development but have not been tapped adequately. With this coordination Office in Place, government will regulate the use of these resource and provide good framework for promotion of fishing for food, processing and also tap other opportunities arising from our seas and oceans.

The Office is also at the forefront of making Kenya a key trade and investment destination. In this regard, it has provided leadership in the implementation of trade and investment related reforms by recommending the appropriate fiscal incentives which have attracted key investors into the country. The Office has also invested in the promotion of SMEs sector which has great potential for future production and employment by working with stakeholders to build its capacity including review of policy-SMEs Credit Guarantee Scheme, among others.

Internally, the Office has put in place systems and structures to ensure continuous service delivery. It has further put in place training programmes to build the capacity of staff every year. It may also be noted that the Office has taken a pro-active stance in safeguarding staff by ensuring their vaccination against Covid - 19 virus.

Strategic Planning

To mitigate current and future challenges, this Office has prepared and is implementing a Strategic Plan. Through, Planning, the Office is able to project its future need and those of the country and is able to work with stakeholders to put in place the appropriate delivery systems.

1. Environmental performance

The Executive Office of the President is aware that good environment is critical for our sustainable development. It has therefore taken measure to mitigate the environmental conservation by -

Establishing indigenous tree nurseries with over 7,000 seedlings awaiting maturity and transplant.

- Procuring Ozone/ CFC free friendly electronic items to reduce air pollution. Executive
 office of President always emphasizes on CFC free certified goods to avoid pollution of
 air.
- Protection of trees and other vegetation within its premises.
- Contracting NEMA compliant companies for waste collection and disposal with emphasis on recycling.
- Disposal of all e-wastes in accordance with NEMA guidelines.
- Promotion of bio-diversity management for preservation of plant and animal species (elephants and other animals).

The planned environmental intervention was impacted negatively by unpredictable weather, inadequate resource, COVID-19 pandemic among others. The Office however remains committed to conserving the environment and will put in place a robust plan to ensure more proactive participation.

Employee welfare

Employee welfare is critical for productivity. Consequently, the Office applied and will continue to enforce the existing policies, laws and regulations governing the workforce in the public service. These policies, laws and regulations provide guidance on the entry, stay and exit of civil servants and cover wide areas including gender and disability, management, workers safety as well as application of Public service values and principles as well as Article 10 of the Constitution. The Office will also remain open and will borrow and implement best practices in the management of human resources.

2. Market place practices

The Executive Office of the President remains committed to the promotion of value for money in public procurement. It commits to-

a) Responsible Competition Practice

- Promotion of open and transparent tendering by advertising procurement opportunities in the print media and Departments websites
- Ensuring Responsible and Fair competition (Right price, right quality and quantity, Right source of goods and Right service providers.

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- Ensuring separation of roles/ functions in the procurement process to prevent conflict of interest.
- Declaration of any interest during tendering process where applicable and Recusing
- Complying with tender management procedures (Preliminary, Technical and Financial evaluations) for objective evaluation of bids.
- Communicating outcomes for each tender to all participants.
- Preservation/Setting aside of certain categories of procurement to only AGPO registered companies
- Continuous monitoring and periodic Market survey on prices to ensure contracts awarded comparable to the prevailing market prices thereby realization of value for money.

b) Responsible Supply Chain and Supplier Relations

- Invitations to institution's functions and awards to the suppliers whose services are exceptional.
- Issuance of letters of recommendations to other organizations for companies that request and deserve to be recommended.
- Promoting Companies owned by Youth, Women and PWD through letters to guarantee and access bank credits whenever such a request is made.
- Suppliers empowerment and support on the online procurement processes.
- Timely response on various queries / Complaints regarding procurement.
- Suppliers sensitization on feedback mechanisms and platforms available e.g sharing Official emails, Websites and use of questionnaires.
- Request for feedback on the level of satisfaction on responses for various queries.
- Strategic Placement of suggestion boxes for feedback on the level of satisfaction.
- Strategic display of Citizen Service Charters clearing stating the procurement processes and requirements to participate in procurement.
- Timely payment for supply of goods and provision of services.

c) Responsible Marketing and Advertisement:

- Continuous in-house staff trainings on responsible marketing practices as well as ethical procurement practices such as honesty, fairness and trustworthiness.
- Advertising tenders requiring wide circulation in statehouse website, PPRA
 Portal and print media and only buying KeBS approved products.
- Procuring from ethically approved companies. (Those which promote good business ethics).
- Carrying out Due diligence on operations, capacity and capabilities of each company before engaging them for work

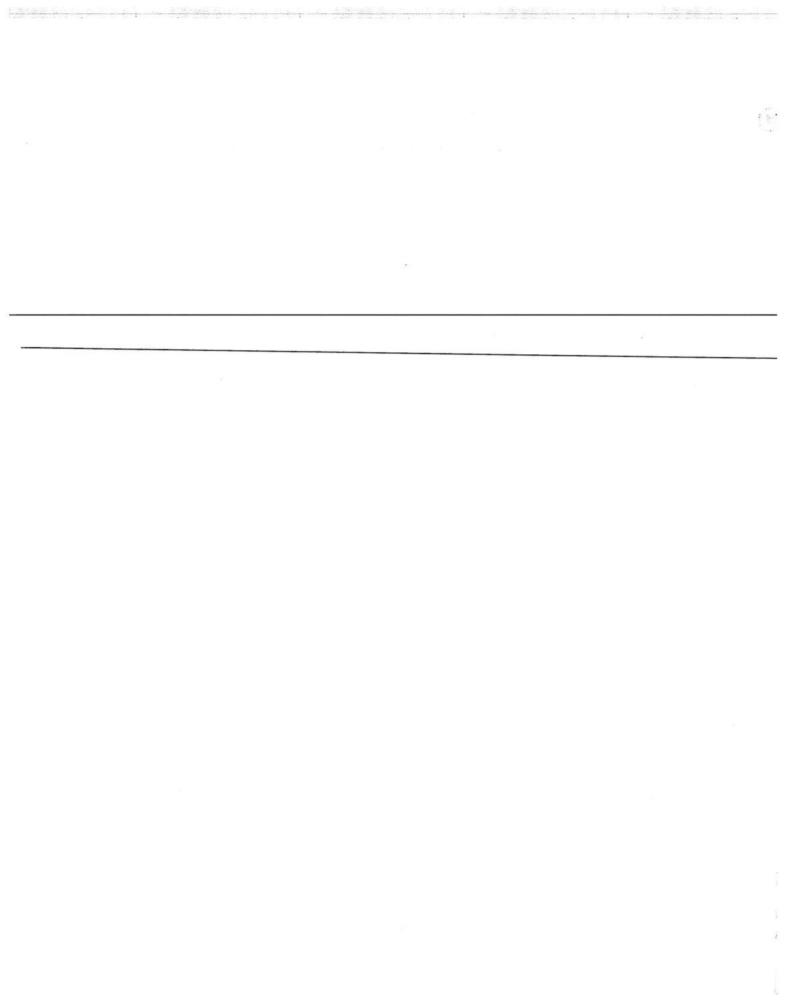
d) Product Stewardship:

- Procuring eco-friendly supplies (Minimum harm to environment in production and capacity for recycling).
- Strict compliance with disposal regulations for obsolete assets and materials.
- Promoting value for money in procurement for goods and Services-minding - Quality and price.
- Keeping consuming departments informed on how to manage the products in to reduce harmful exposure and to maximize on the products.
- Provision of protective gear and materials to safeguard consumers from injury or any other harm.

3. Community Engagements

This Office acknowledges the need for continuous engagement with the community. It has therefore put in place such community engagement programmes and which impact positively on the lives of Kenyans such as-

- The Beyond zero campaign pioneered by the Office of the First Lady which seeks to promote safe motherhood and infant health through provision of resources and equipment.
- Promoting sporting activities to raise resources for specified purpose (The First Lady's Half Marathon and the IAAF World under 18 Youth championships Nairobi Olympics where the First Lady of Kenya is the Patron.)
- Embracing of innovative approaches such as 'Adopt a Ward' initiative, pioneered by the Office of the First Lady, through which 15 maternity wards in different counties have been equipped in collaboration with partners.
- Community collaboration in environmental protection and conservation strategies, e.g ('Hands off our Elephant') campaign to sensitize communities on need to save the endangered Big Five animals.
- Implementing and institutionalizing specific motivation and mentoring programmes focusing on specific groups such the Pupils Reward Scheme (PURES) which encourages and rewards students for good academic performance besides molding them into responsible citizens.
- Women empowerment over 54,000 women trained on Table banking.
- Initiation and management of programmes to promote studies among youth (Accessing of internships and scholarships) over 700 Kenyan students have benefited.

REPORT OF THE AUDITOR-GENERAL ON THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE, 2021

PREAMBLE

I draw your attention to the contents of my report which is in three parts:

- A. Report on the Financial Statements that considers whether the financial statements are fairly presented in accordance with the applicable financial reporting framework, accounting standards and the relevant laws and regulations that have a direct effect on the financial statements.
- B. Report on Lawfulness and Effectiveness in Use of Public Resources which considers compliance with applicable laws, regulations, policies, gazette notices, circulars, guidelines and manuals and whether public resources are applied in a prudent, efficient, economic, transparent and accountable manner to ensure Government achieves value for money and that such funds are applied for intended purpose.
- C. Report on Effectiveness of Internal Controls, Risk Management and Governance which considers how the entity has instituted checks and balances to guide internal operations. This responds to the effectiveness of the governance structure, the risk management environment, and the internal controls developed and implemented by those charged with governance for orderly, efficient and effective operations of the entity.

An unmodified opinion does not necessarily mean that an entity has complied with all relevant laws and regulations, and that its internal controls, risk management and governance systems are properly designed and were working effectively in the financial year under review.

The three parts of the report are aimed at addressing the statutory roles and responsibilities of the Auditor-General as provided by Article 229 of the Constitution, the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 and the Public Audit Act, 2015. The three parts of the report, when read together constitute the report of the Auditor-General.

REPORT ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Opinion

I have audited the accompanying financial statements of The Executive Office of The President set out on pages 43 to 69, which comprise the statement of assets and liabilities

as at 30 June, 2021, and the statement of receipts and payments, statement of cash flows and summary statements of appropriation - recurrent and development combined for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information in accordance with the provisions of Article 229 of the Constitution of Kenya and Section 35 of the Public Audit Act, 2015. I have obtained all the information and explanations which, to the best of my knowledge and belief, were necessary for the purpose of the audit.

In my opinion, the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of The Executive Office of The President as at 30 June, 2021, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended, in accordance with International Public Sector Accounting Standards (Cash Basis) and comply with the Public Finance Management Act, 2012.

Basis for Opinion

The audit was conducted in accordance with International Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAIs). I am independent of The Executive Office of The President Management in accordance with ISSAI 130 on Code of Ethics. I have fulfilled other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the ISSAI and in accordance with other ethical requirements applicable to performing audits of financial statements in Kenya. I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion.

Key Audit Matters

Key audit matters are those matters that, in my professional judgment, are of most significance in the audit of the financial statements. There were no key audit matters to report in the year under review.

Other Matter

Pending Bills

Note 21.1 to the financial statements reflects pending accounts payable of Kshs.5,349,989,714 as at 30 June, 2021. The bills were not paid during the year under review but were instead carried forward to the financial year 2021/2022. Failure to settle bills during the year to which they relate distorts the budget implementation of the subsequent year as the outstanding bills form a first charge on available resources.

REPORT ON LAWFULNESS AND EFFECTIVENESS IN USE OF PUBLIC RESOURCES

Conclusion

As required by Article 229(6) of the Constitution, based on the audit procedures performed, I confirm that, nothing has come to my attention to cause me to believe that public resources have not been applied lawfully and in an effective way.

Basis for Conclusion

The audit was conducted in accordance with ISSAI 4000. The standard requires that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain assurance about whether the activities, financial transactions and information reflected in the financial statements are in compliance, in all material respects, with the authorities that govern them. I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my conclusion.

REPORT ON EFFECTIVENESS OF INTERNAL CONTROLS, RISK MANAGEMENT AND GOVERNANCE

Conclusion

As required by Section 7(1)(a) of the Public Audit Act, 2015, based on the audit procedures performed, I confirm that, nothing has come to my attention to cause me to believe that internal controls, risk management and overall governance were not effective.

Basis for Conclusion

The audit was conducted in accordance with ISSAI 2315 and ISSAI 2330. The standards require that I plan and perform the audit to obtain assurance about whether processes and systems of internal control, risk management and governance were operating effectively, in all material respects. I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my conclusion.

Responsibilities of Management and those Charged with Governance

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with International Public Sector Accounting Standards (Cash Basis) and for maintaining effective internal control as Management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error and for its assessment of the effectiveness of internal control, risk management and governance.

In preparing the financial statements, Management is responsible for assessing The Executive Office of The President's ability to sustain services, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to sustainability of services and using the applicable basis of accounting unless Management is aware of the intention to terminate the Office or cease operations.

Management is also responsible for the submission of the financial statements to the Auditor-General in accordance with the provisions of Section 47 of the Public Audit Act, 2015.

In addition to the responsibility for the preparation and presentation of the financial statements described above, Management is responsible for ensuring that the activities, financial transactions and information reflected in the financial statements are in compliance with the authorities which govern them, and that public resources are applied in an effective way.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing The Executive Office of The President's financial reporting process, reviewing the effectiveness of how the Management monitors compliance with relevant legislative and regulatory requirements, ensuring that effective processes and systems are in place to address key roles and responsibilities in relation to governance and risk management, and ensuring the adequacy and effectiveness of the control environment.

Auditor-General's Responsibilities for the Audit

The audit objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes my opinion in accordance with the provisions of Section 48 of the Public Audit Act, 2015 and submit the audit report in compliance with Article 229(7) of the Constitution. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with ISSAIs will always detect a material misstatement and weakness when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

In addition to the audit of the financial statements, a compliance audit is planned and performed to express a conclusion about whether, in all material respects, the activities, financial transactions and information reflected in the financial statements are in compliance with the authorities that govern them and that public resources are applied in an effective way, in accordance with the provisions of Article 229(6) of the Constitution and submit the audit report in compliance with Article 229(7) of the Constitution.

A material weakness is a condition in which the design or operation of one or more of the internal control components does not reduce to a relatively low level the risk that misstatements caused by error or fraud in amounts that would be material in relation to the financial statements being audited may occur and not be detected within a timely period by employees in the normal course of performing their assigned functions.

Because of its inherent limitations, internal control may not prevent or detect misstatements and instances of non-compliance. Also, projections of any evaluation of effectiveness to future periods are subject to the risk that controls may become inadequate because of changes in conditions, or that the degree of compliance with the policies and procedures may deteriorate.

As part of an audit conducted in accordance with ISSAIs, I exercise professional judgement and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. I also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the Management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the Management's use of the applicable basis of
 accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty
 exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on The Executive
 Office of The President's ability to continue to sustain its services. If I conclude that
 a material uncertainty exists, I am required to draw attention in the auditor's report to
 the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are
 inadequate, to modify my opinion. My conclusions are based on the audit evidence
 obtained up to the date of my audit report. However, future events or conditions may
 cause the Office to cease to sustain its services.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.
- Obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence regarding the financial information and business activities of The Executive Office of The President to express an opinion on the financial statements.
- Perform such other procedures as I consider necessary in the circumstances.

I communicate with the Management regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that are identified during the audit.

I also provide Management with a statement that I have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on my independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

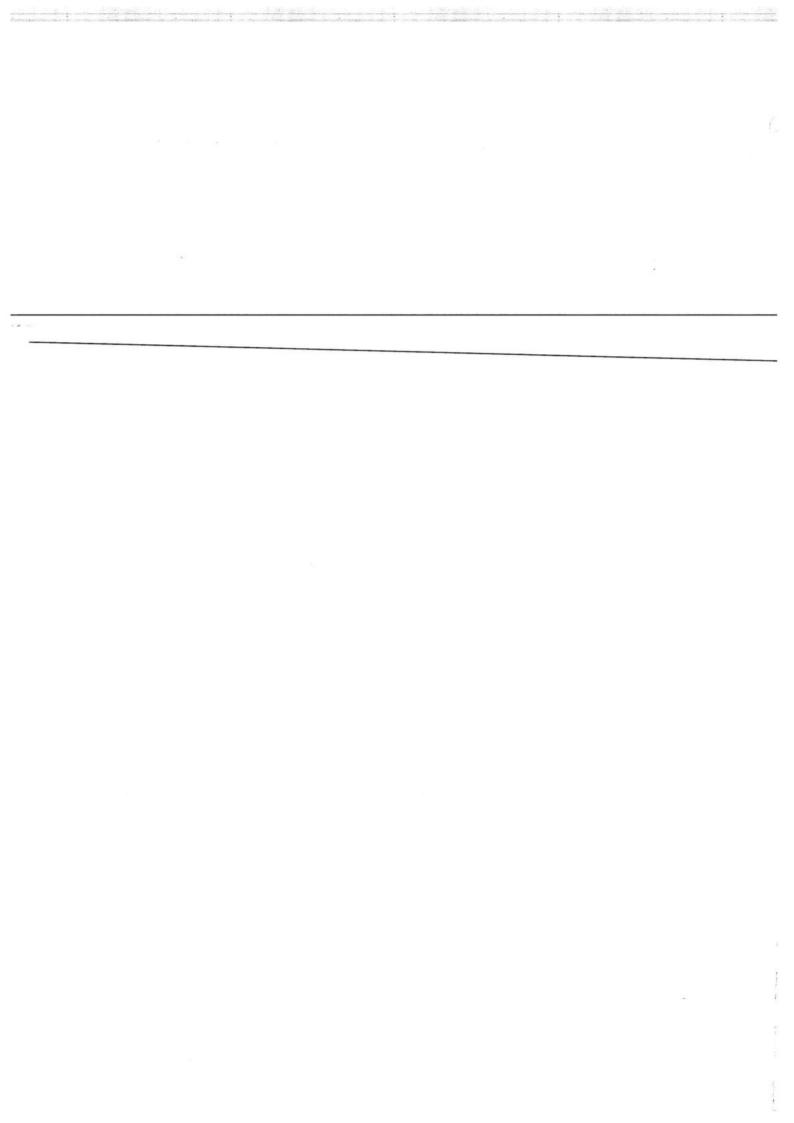

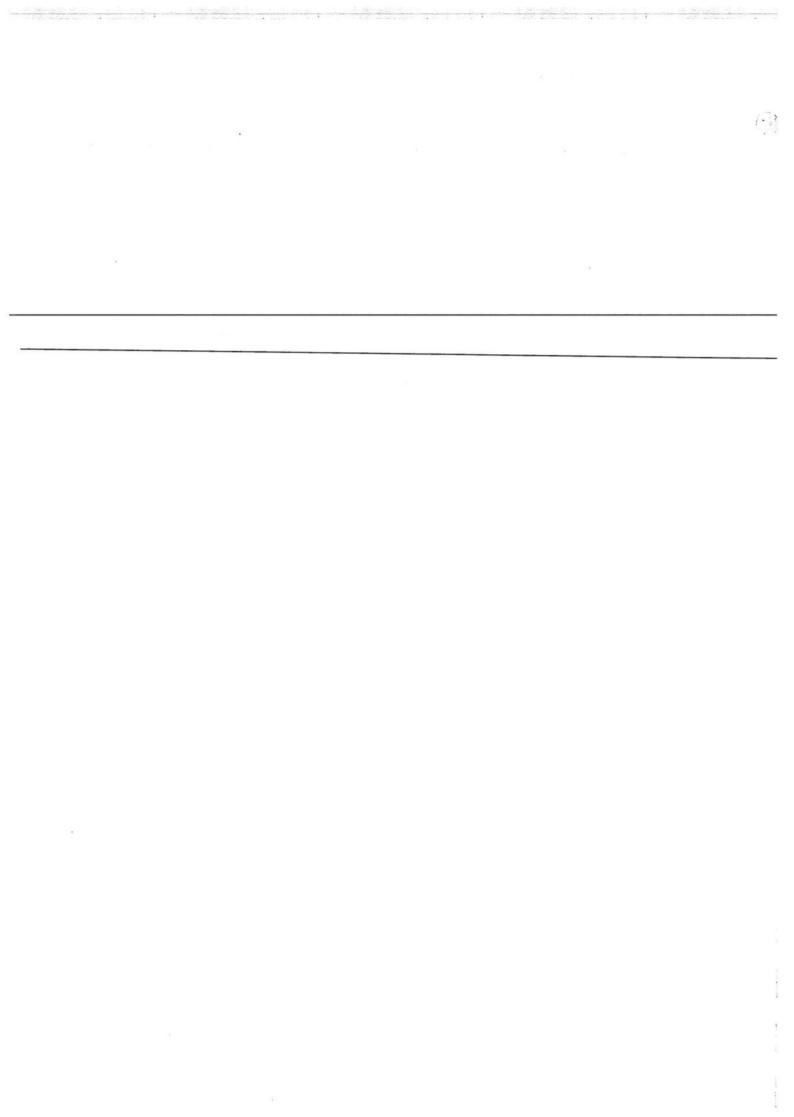

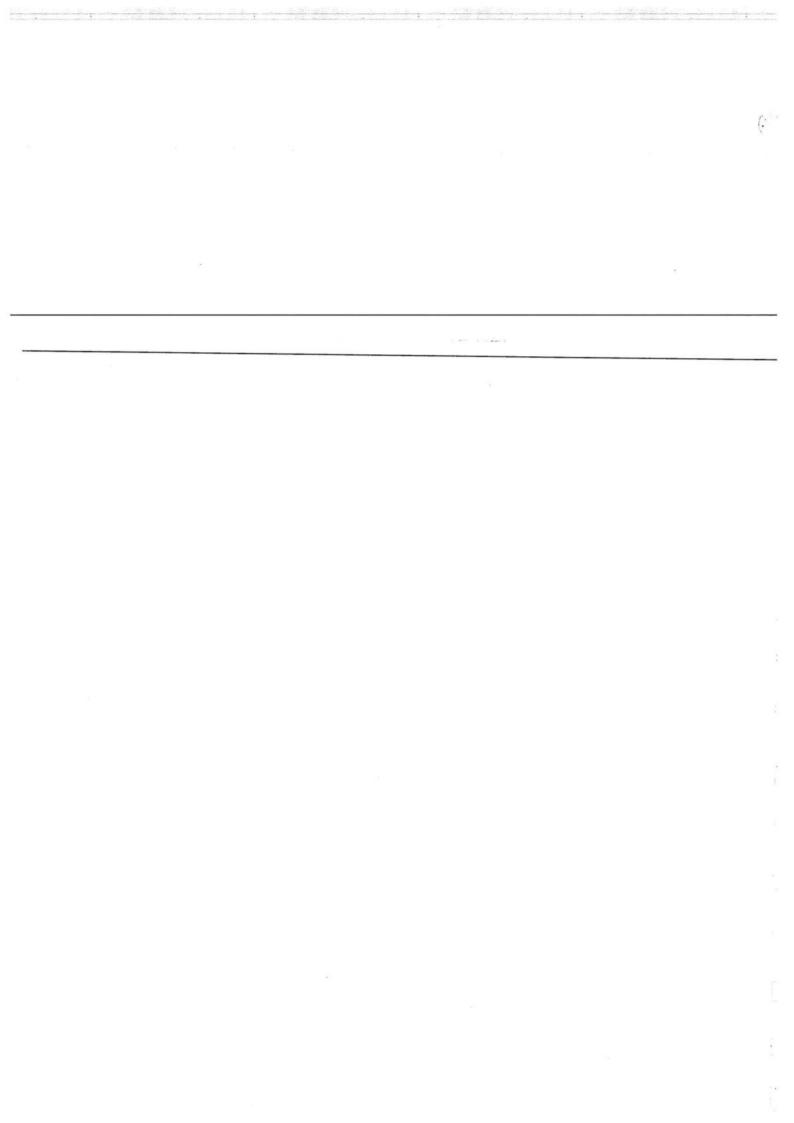

14. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principle accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below:

1. Statement of Compliance and Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Cash-basis International Public Sector Accounting Standards (IPSAS) as prescribed by the Public Sector Accounting Standards Board (PSASB) and set out in the accounting policy note below. This cash basis of accounting has been supplemented with accounting for; a) receivables that include imprests and salary advances and b) payables that include deposits and retentions.

The financial statements comply with and conform to the form of presentation prescribed by the PSASB. The accounting policies adopted have been consistently applied to all the years presented.

2. Reporting Entity

The financial statements are for the Executive Office of the President. The financial statements encompass the reporting entity as specified under section 81 of the PFM Act 2012 and also comprise of the following development projects implemented by the entity:

i. Refurbishment of State Houses and Lodges

ii. Refurbishment of the 3rd Floor of the Harambee House.

iii. Refurbishment of the Deputy President's residence in Mombasa

iv. The Executive Office of the President also extended assistance to the National Fund for Disabled of Kenya to fund small scale projects for people with disabilities and to increase its revenues.

3. Reporting Currency

The financial statements are presented in Kenya Shillings (KShs), which is the functional and reporting currency of the Government and all values are rounded to the nearest Kenya Shilling.

4. Significant Accounting Policies

The accounting policies set out in this section have been consistently applied by the Entity for all the years presented.

a) Recognition of Receipts

The Entity recognizes all receipts from the various sources when the event occurs and the related cash has actually been received by the Entity.

Tax Receipts

Tax receipts are recognized in the books of accounts when cash is received. Cash is considered as received when notification of tax remittance is received.

Transfers from the Exchequer

Transfers from the exchequer are recognized in the books of accounts when cash is received. Cash is considered as received when payment instruction is issued to the bank and notified to the receiving entity.

External Assistance

External assistance is received through grants and loans from multilateral and bilateral development partners.

Grants and loans shall be recognized in the books of accounts when cash is received. Cash is considered as received when a payment advice is received by the recipient entity or by the beneficiary.

In case of grant/loan in kind, such grants are recorded upon receipt of the grant item and upon determination of the value. The date of the transaction is the value date indicated on the payment advice. A similar recognition criterion is applied for loans received in the form of a direct payment.

During the year ended 30th June 2021, there were no instances of non-compliance with terms and conditions which have resulted in cancellation of external assistance loans.

Other receipts

These include Appropriations-in-Aid and relates to receipts such as proceeds from disposal of assets and sale of tender documents. These are recognized in the financial statements the time associated cash is received.

b) Recognition of payments

The Entity recognises all payments when the event occurs and the related cash has actually been paid out by the Entity.

Compensation to Employees

Salaries and wages, allowances, statutory contributions for employees are recognized in the period when the compensation is paid.

Use of Goods and Services

Goods and services are recognized as payments in the period when the goods/services are paid for. Such expenses, if not paid during the period where goods/services are consumed, shall be disclosed as pending bills.

Interest on Borrowing

Borrowing costs that include interest are recognized as payment in the period in which they are paid for.

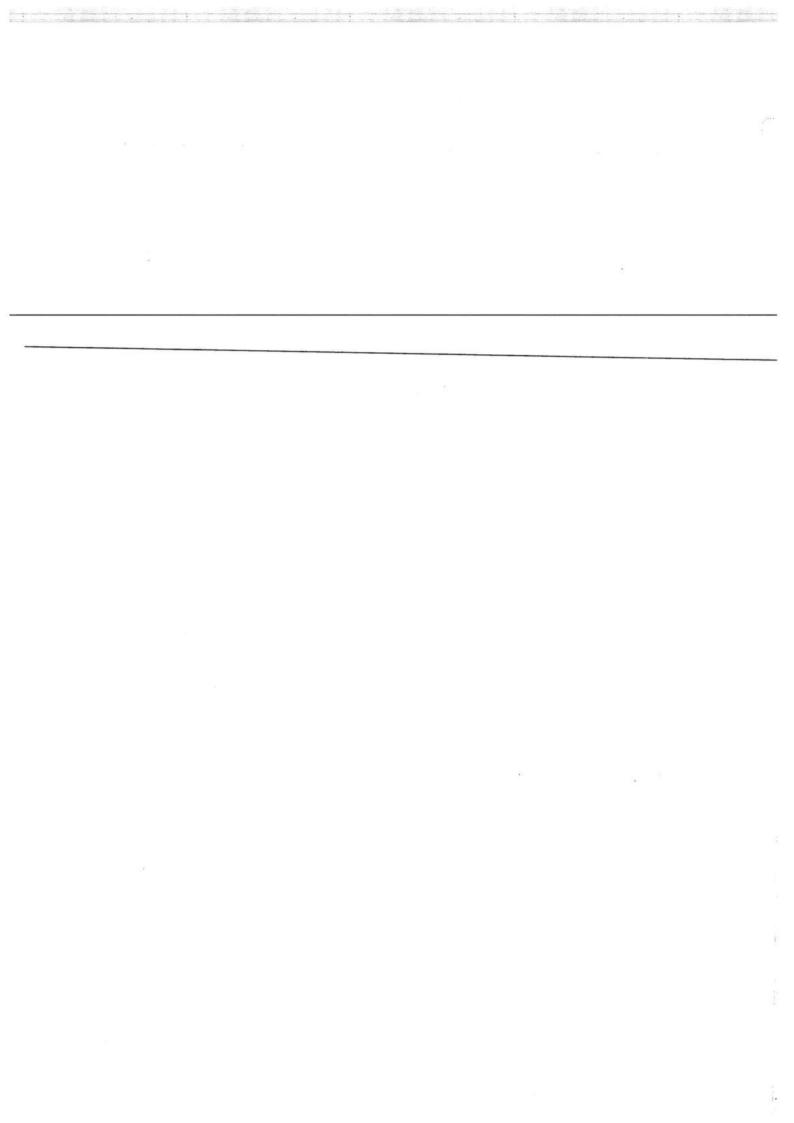
SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Repayment of Borrowing (Principal Amount)

The repayment of principal amount of borrowing is recognized as payment in the period in which the repayment is made.

Acquisition of Fixed Assets

The payment on acquisition of property plant and equipment items is not capitalized. The cost of acquisition and proceeds from disposal of these items are treated as payments and receipts items respectively. Where an asset is acquired in a non-exchange transaction for nil or nominal



consideration and the fair value of the asset can be reliably established, a contra transaction is recorded as receipt and as a payment.

A fixed asset register is maintained by each public entity and a summary provided for purposes of consolidation. This summary is disclosed as an annexure to the financial statements.

5. In-kind contributions

In-kind contributions are donations that are made to the Entity in the form of actual goods and/or services rather than in money or cash terms. These donations may include vehicles, equipment or personnel services. Where the financial value received for in-kind contributions can be reliably determined, the Entity includes such value in the statement of receipts and payments both as receipts and as payments in equal and opposite amounts; otherwise, the contribution is not recorded.

6. Third Party Payments

Included in the receipts and payments, are payments made on its behalf to third parties in form of loans and grants. These payments do not constitute cash receipts and payments and are disclosed in the payment to third parties in the statement of receipts and payments as proceeds from foreign borrowings.

7. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and cash at bank, short-term deposits on call and highly liquid investments with an original maturity of three months or less, which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value. Bank account balances include amounts held at the Central Bank of Kenya and at various commercial banks at the end of the financial year.

Restriction on Cash

Restricted cash represents amounts that are limited/restricted from being used to settle a liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period. This cash is limited for direct use as required by stipulation.

Amounts maintained in deposit bank accounts are restricted for use in refunding third party deposits. As at 30th June 2021, this amounted to Kshs.104,090,532 compared to Kshs.28,996,235 in prior period as indicated on note 15.

There were no other restrictions on cash during the year.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

8. Accounts Receivable

For the purposes of these financial statements, imprests and advances to authorized public officers and/or institutions which were not surrendered or accounted for at the end of the financial year are treated as receivables. This is in recognition of the government practice where the imprest payments are recognized as payments when fully accounted for by the imprest or AIE holders. This is an enhancement to the cash accounting policy. Other accounts receivables are disclosed in the financial statements.

9. Accounts Payable

For the purposes of these financial statements, deposits and retentions held on behalf of third parties have been recognized on an accrual basis (as accounts payables). This is in recognition of the

government practice of retaining a portion of contracted services and works pending fulfilment of obligations by the contractor and to hold deposits on behalf of third parties. This is an enhancement to the cash accounting policy adopted by National Government Ministries and Agencies. Other liabilities including pending bills are disclosed in the financial statements.

10. Pending Bills

Pending bills consist of unpaid liabilities at the end of the financial year arising from contracted goods or services during the year or in past years. As pending bills do not involve the payment of cash in the reporting period, they are recorded as 'memorandum' or 'off-balance' items to provide a sense of the overall net cash position of the Entity at the end of the year. When the pending bills are finally settled, such payments are included in the Statement of Receipts and Payments in the year in which the payments are made.

11. Budget

The budget is developed on a comparable accounting basis (cash basis except for imprest and deposits, which are accounted for on an accrual basis), the same accounts classification basis, and for the same period as the financial statements. The original budget was approved by Parliament on June 2020 for the period 1st July 2020 to 30th June 2021 as required by Law and there were two supplementary adjustments to the original budget during the year.

A comparison of the actual performance against the comparable budget for the financial year under review has been included in the financial statements.

Government development projects are budgeted for under the MDAs but receive budgeted funds as transfers and account for them separately. These transfers are recognized as inter-entity transfers.

12. Comparative Figures

Where necessary, comparative figures for the previous financial year have been amended or reconfigured to conform to the required changes in presentation.

13. Subsequent Events

There have been no events subsequent to the financial year end with a significant impact on the financial statements for the year ended 30th June 2021.

14. Errors

Material prior period errors shall be corrected retrospectively in the first set of financial statements authorized for issue after their discovery by: i) restating the comparative amounts for prior period(s) presented in which the error occurred; or ii) If the error occurred before the earliest prior period presented, restating the opening balances of assets, liabilities and net assets/equity for the earliest prior period presented.

During the year, errors that have been corrected are disclosed under note 17 explaining their nature and amounts.

15. Related Party Transactions

Related party relationships are a normal feature of Government Institutions. Specific information with regards to related party transactions is included in the disclosure note 20.

16. Contingent Liabilities
