

CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

The Special Funds Accounts Committee is a Select Committee of the House established under the National Assembly's Standing Orders Number 205A to examine accounts laid before the House. The Committee examines the National Government Constituencies Development Fund, the Equalization Fund, the Judiciary Fund, the Political Parties Fund and other Funds established by law as the Speaker may direct.

The Committee was established in the fifth session of the Eleventh Parliament following the review of the National Assembly's Standing Orders and is amongst the three Watchdog Committees of the Twelfth Parliament that examines reports of the Auditor- General laid before the National Assembly to ensure probity, efficiency and effectiveness in the use of public funds.

Reports on audited financial statements for the NG-CDF from the two hundred and ninety (290) Constituencies formed the bulk of the work of the Committee. The Committee received backlog of these reports dating back to the financial year 2013/14, and has been able to dispense with 156 reports from fifty-two (52) Constituencies in the Counties of Nairobi, Kisumu, Kiambu, Mombasa, Kilifi, Kwale, Taita Taveta, Lamu and Tana River for financial years 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2015/16.

In addition, the Committee has dispensed with reports of various key funds and proposed various recommendations geared towards effective discharge of mandates of the public entities

This report contains the activities undertaken by the Committee during the term of the 12th Parliament and pending business, and is submitted pursuant to Standing Order Number 200A (1).

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment of Committee

- The power of each House of Parliament to establish committees and to make Standing Orders for the orderly conduct of its proceedings, including the proceedings of its committees is provided under Article 124 of the Constitution.
- 2. The National Assembly Standing Orders has established various committees of the House with distinct Mandates. These Committees under the Directorate of Audit, Appropriations and Other Select Committees play a pivotal role of facilitating the National Assembly fulfill its constitutional mandate of allocation of national revenue, appropriation of funds and oversight over national revenue, expenditure and State organs.
- The Special Funds Accounts Committee is established pursuant to Standing Order 205A.

1.2 Mandate of the Committee

- 4. The Committee is mandated to examine audited accounts laid before the House of:
- The Equalization Fund;
- (ii) The Political Parties Fund;
- (iii) The Judiciary Fund;
- (iv) The National Government Constituencies Development Fund; and
- (v) Such other Fund established by law as the Speaker may direct.
- 5. In discharge of its mandate, the Committee considers matters related to:
 - (i) The principles of public finance under Article 201 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 guides the Committee in the execution of its mandate. The principles require openness, accountability and public participation in financial matters as well as prudence and responsible use of public funds amongst others. Further, the provision of Article 226 (5) of the Constitution of Kenya on direct personal liability guides the committee is its examination of the audited accounts. The Article provides that "If the holder of a public office, including a political office, directs or approves the use of public funds contrary to law or instructions, the person is liable for any loss arising from that use and shall make good the loss, whether the person remains the holder of the office or not".
 - (ii) The various legal provisions as contained in various Acts of Parliament which include the PFM Act, 2012, the repealed Public Audit Act, 2003, the Public Audit Act, 2015, the repealed Public Procurement and Disposal Act, 2005, the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015 as well as established customs, traditions, practices and usages also guides the Committee.
- (iii)Section 68 (1) of the PFM Act, 2012 provides, inter alia, that- "An accounting officer for a national government entity including Public Funds, Parliamentary Exit Report of the Special Fund Accounts Committee for the Twelfth Parliament (December 2017 to June 2022)

Service Commission and the Judiciary is accountable to the National Assembly. The Accounting Officer is required to ensure that the resources of the respective entity for which he or she is responsible are used in a way that is lawful and authorized, and effective, efficient, economical and transparent."

2.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1 Legal framework

- 10. Article 93 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya establishes the Parliament of Kenya which consists of the National Assembly and the Senate. Further, Article 95 provides for the role of the National Assembly amongst others to:
 - (i) deliberate on and resolve issues of concern to the people;
 - (ii) enact legislation;
 - (iii) determine allocation of national revenue between the two levels of governments the National government and County governments;
 - (iv) appropriate funds for expenditure by the national government and national State organs;
 - (v) exercise oversight over national revenue and its expenditure;
 - (vi) exercise oversight over State organs; and
 - (vii) review the conduct in the office of the President, Deputy President and other State officers and initiate the process of removal from office.
- 11. In addition, Article 124 of the Constitution empowers Parliament to establish Committees and to make Standing Orders for orderly conduct of its proceedings including the proceedings of its Committee. The Special Funds Accounts Committee is a Select Committee of the House established under the National Assembly's Standing Orders Number 205A to examine accounts laid before the House.

2.2 Establishment and mandate of the Committee

- 12. The Committee was established in the fifth session of the Eleventh Parliament following the review of the National Assembly's Standing Orders and is amongst the three Watchdog Committees of the Twelfth Parliament that examines reports of the Auditor-General laid before the National Assembly to ensure probity, efficiency and effectiveness in the use of public funds.
- 13. The Committee examines the National Government Constituencies Development Fund, the Equalization Fund, the Judiciary Fund, the Political Parties Fund and other Funds established by law as the Speaker may direct

3.0 ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE COMMITTEE

- 14. In the discharge of its mandate, the Committee held a total of three hundred and fifty-two (352) sittings as follows:
 - a) First Session 2017- 1 (one) sitting.
 - b) Second Session 2018- sixty (60) sittings.
 - c) Third Session 2019- one hundred and nine (109) sittings.
 - d) Fourth Session 2020- eighty-six (86) sittings.
 - e) Fifth Session 2021- ninety-two (92) sittings.
 - f) Sixth Session 2022- fourteen (14) sittings.
- 15. Reports on audited financial statements for the NG-CDF from the two hundred and ninety (290) Constituencies formed the bulk of the work of the Committee. The Committee received backlog of these reports dating back from financial year 2013/14 to 2016/2017.
- 16. The Committee examined one hundred and fifty six (156) reports from the following fiftytwo (52) Constituencies in the following Counties:
 - a) Nairobi County- Westlands, Dagoretti North, Dagoretti South, Langata, Kibra, Roysambu, Kasarani, Ruaraka, Embakasi South, Embakasi North, Embakasi Central, Embakasi East, Embakasi West, Makadara, Kamukunji, Starehe and Mathare:
 - Kisumu County- Kisumu Central, Kisumu East, Kisumu West, Muhoroni, Nyakach, Nyando and Seme;
 - Kiambu County- Gatundu South, Gatundu North, Juja, Thika Town, Ruiru, Githunguri, Kiambu Town, Kiambaa, Kabete, Kikuyu, Limuru and Lari;
 - d) Mombasa County- Changamwe, Jomvu, Kisauni, Nyali, Likoni and Mvita.
 - Kilifi County- Kilifi North, Kilifi South and Kaloleni. Rabai, Ganze, Malindi and Magarini;
 - f) Kwale County- Msambweni, Lunga Lunga, Matuga and Kinango;
 - g) Taita Taveta County- Taveta, Wundanyi, Mwatate and Voi;
 - h) Lamu County- Lamu West and Lamu East; and
 - Tana River County- Garsen, Galole and Bura.
- 17. In addition, the Committee also finalized reports of the following funds established by law:
 - (i) Report of the Auditor-General on audited financial statements for Political Parties Fund for the financial year ended June 2017;
 - (ii) The Report of the Auditor General on audited financial statements of Commodities Fund for financial years 2015/16, 2016/17;

- (iii) The Report of the Auditor General on audited financial statements of Agricultural Settlement Fund Trustees for the financial year 2015/2016;
- (iv) The Report of the Auditor General on audited financial statements of Universal Service Fund for the year financial year 2016/2017;
- (v) The Report of the Auditor General on audited financial statements of Water Sector Trust Fund for the financial year 2016/2017;
- (vi) The Report of the Auditor General on audited financial statements of Uwezo Fund for the financial year 2016/2017;
- (vii) The Report of the Auditor General on audited financial statements of Women Enterprise Development Fund for the financial year 2017/2018;
- (viii) The Report of the Auditor General on audited financial statements of Unclaimed Assets Trust Fund for financial year 2016/2017; and
- (ix) The Report of the Auditor General on audited financial statements of Local Authorities Provident Fund for financial years 2016/2017,2017/2018 and 2018/2019. These reports have been adopted by the House and can be downloaded from the parliament website.
 - 18. The Committee also finalized on the following reports, which are yet to be debated by the House:
 - (i) Twelve Report on audited financial statements for the Land Settlement Fund for financial years 2019/2020 and 2020/21; and
 - (ii) Thirteenth Report on Status of the Equalisation Fund
 - 19. During examination of these reports, the Committee pronounced itself through various recommendations geared towards efficient and effective management of these public entities. It is on this basis that the Committee hopes that such recommendations will cure the inherent structural and administrative loopholes identified during the examination of the audit reports.
 - 20. The Committee recommends that ALL Accounting Officers whose financial statements were examined to implement these recommendations with a view of preventing the reoccurrence of such audit queries. This will improve on the efficiency and proper management of public resources.
 - 21. The key recommendations are summarized as follows:
 - a) National Government Constituency Development Fund:
 - ✓ The Committee emphasized that the Accounting Officer complies with the International Public Sector Accounting Standards (IPSAS) framework in preparation of financial statements;
 - ✓ The National Government Constituencies Development Fund Board in consultation with the Public Sector Accounting Standards Board (PSASB)

- conducts continuous capacity building on financial reporting standards for constituency staff;
- ✓ Need for standardization of NG-CDF projects in terms of costs and designs across counties;
- ✓ The NG-CDF Board to issue guidelines on the -use of emergency funds; and
- ✓ NG-CDF Board to review guidelines on issuance of bursaries, so as to enhance efficiency.

b) Land Settlement Fund

- ✓ The Committee recommended the reconstruction of the Fund's books of account
 due the existence of irreconcilable opening balances. The Accounting Officer
 acted on this recommendation as evidenced in the audited Financial statements
 for the FY 2020/2021 which are awaiting adoption by the House.
- ✓ The Long Outstanding imprests and inaccuracy of Trade and Other payables from Exchange transactions were reconciled, hence this led to the reorganisation of the structure and particulars of the various components of Fund's financial statements.

c) Local Authorities Provident Fund

✓ The Committee recommended that the Fund continues diversifying its
investment portfolio in property to support the country's big Four Agenda on
affordable housing as well as enhance growth in retirement benefits for its
members.

d) Women Enterprise Fund:

- ✓ The Committee recommended that Director of Criminal Investigations fast tracks the investigation into the cases of misappropriation of funds. The Auditor-General had established that there was embezzlement of funds by employees of the Fund amounting to Kshs. 24,625,450.
- ✓ The Committee recommended the need for the Fund to enhance their lending policies to improve recoverability of loans. Secondly, the Fund should lend directly to borrowers instead of using financial intermediaries.

e) The Equalization Fund

- ✓ Allocations to the Equalization Fund- Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 (CoK) requires that the Fund be allocated one half per cent (0.5%) of all the revenue collected by the National Government each year, calculated on the basis of the most recent audited revenue received.
- ✓ The total entitlement to the Fund since establishment is Kshs. 47,383,520.543. However, the Fund has only been allocated Kshs. 19,225,317,433 as at FY 2021/2022 out of which Kshs. 12.4 billion has been released to the Fund, resulting to a shortfall of Kshs. 34.9 billion as at May 2022.

- ✓ The Committee recommended that the Cabinet Secretary in-charge of the National Treasury expedites allocation of funds to the Equalization Fund as provided in the Constitution.
- Representation to the Equalization Fund Advisory Board- Regulation 4(1) (d) and (e) provides for a person nominated by the National Assembly and Senate respectively as Members of the Equalization Fund Board for a period of six years, non-renewable, on such terms and conditions as may be specified in the instrument of appointment. Further, regulation 10 (3) provides for Board expenses of not more than three percent of annual approved equalization fund allocation.
- ✓ The Committee observed that currently, there existed no formal structures to
 facilitate linkage between the two representatives and Parliament as an institution.

 As a result, consultations and provision of timely feedback to Members on issues
 pertaining to implementation of projects under the Equalization Fund was not
 effective.
- ✓ The Committee recommended that the Equalization Fund Advisory Board adequately facilitate representatives of Parliament through provision of functional physical offices at the Equalization Fund Advisory Board secretariat. This will ensure that the representatives discharge their mandate effectively and are reachable to Members for consultations on issues pertaining implementation of projects.
- ✓ The Committee further recommended that each House of Parliament to provide liaison services with the representatives at the Board for the effective resolution of concerns that may arise from Members.

4.0 PENDING BUSINESS BEFORE THE COMMITTEE

22. The pending business at the end of 12th Parliament comprises od audited financial statements of various funds as per attached APPENDIX 1 (REPORTS OF OTHER FUNDS) and APPENDIX 2 (NG-CDF REPORTS OF VARIOUS CONSTITUENCIES FOR VARIOUS FINANCIAL YEARS).

5.0 CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES

- 23. During the term, the Committee experienced various challenges which affected realization of its targets in terms of the number of reports for scheduled for consideration. These included:
 - (i) Backlog of reports of NG-CDF audited financial statements from the 290 Constituencies for four FYs since 2013/14 to 2016/17 that were unexamined. This is in addition to audited reports of other funds that the Committee was mandated to examine was overwhelming to the Committee;

- (ii) Suspension of holding physical meetings due to fear of spread of COVID 19 in the country;
- (iii)Limitation to the number of Committee Rooms available for meetings and number of persons who could be admitted in a meeting. This was major setback in carrying out some inquiries which needed cross examination of various players;
- (iv)Restriction of movement in the Country which resulted to suspension of inspection of projects under the review by the Committee; and
- (v) The technological challenges where committees were allowed to undertake virtual meetings. Due to nature of documents that the Committee deals with, which is bulky in nature, projecting them virtually was almost impossible, and where it was done, following up on critical evidence was a challenge.

6.0 Recommendations

- 24. To effectively perform its mandate, the Committee recommends that:
 - There is need to create additional Committee to specifically deal audited financial statements of the National Government Constituencies Development Fund of the two hundred and ninety Constituencies;
 - (ii) All Committees dealing with reports of the Auditor-General be allocated specific Committee room for holding meetings for proper planning of their meetings which require sufficient notice.
 - (iii) There is need for a framework on implementation of recommendations arising from examination of reports of the Auditor-General;
 - (iv)There is need to enhance Committee Secretariat with additional Clerk Assistants and Researchers;
 - (v) Members of Audit Committees and Secretariat need enhanced capacity building programs on financial matter; and

(vi) There is need Installation of an integrated computer in Committee rooms for purposes of holding virtual meetings.
