PREFACE

Mr.Speaker Sir,

The East Africa Legislative Assembly (EALA) is the independent legislative arm of the East Africa Community (EAC), established under Article 9 of the EAC treaty. EALA membership comprises of 9 members elected by each partner state. Article 50 of the treaty requires that EALA Members represent as much as practicable the various political parties represented in the National Parliament, shades of opinion, gender and other special interest groups in the partner states.

The Assembly plays a critical role in the furtherance of the EAC objectives including:

- Liaising with National Assemblies of partner states on matters relating to the community;
- ii. Debating and approving the budget of the Community;
- iii. Considering of annual reports on the activities of the community, annual audit reports and any other reports referred to it;
- iv. Discussing all matters referred to it regarding the community and making recommendations as it may deem necessary for the implementation of the community treaty.

The third Assembly concluded its sittings on 4th June 2017 and the fourth Assembly is expected to commence its sittings early in the year 2018. Due to unavoidable circumstances, the election of the Kenyan representatives to EALA could not be concluded as scheduled during the 11th Parliament. There is need to urgently conclude the election process for the East African Legislative Assembly to commence transacting business of the East African Community.

The Parliament of the Republic of Kenya is therefore, expected to complete the process of election of Kenyan representatives by mid December 2017. In this regard, the Joint Parliamentary Select committee on election of Members of the East African Legislative Assembly was established on the 8th and 9th of November, 2017 by the National Assembly and the Senate respectively.

1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1. The East African Legislative Assembly is established under Article 9 of the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community (EAC) as one of the key organs and independent institutions of the Community.
- 2. Articles 50 and 51 of the EAC Treaty provide for election of Members of the Assembly and the tenure of office of elected Members respectively. Specifically, Article 51(1) provides that an elected member of the Assembly shall hold office for five years and is eligible for re-election for a further term of five years.
- 3. By a letter dated 7th December, 2016, the Clerk of EALA wrote to the Speaker of the National Assembly informing the Speaker that the term of the 3rd East African Legislative Assembly was due to end on 4th June, 2017 and further requesting that the Speaker cause the election of the Members of the next Assembly in accordance with Article 50 of the Treaty, the relevant provisions of the EALA Act, 2011 and the Rules of Procedure relating to election of Members of the Assembly.
- 4. The election process commenced in April 2017 but could not be concluded before the end of the term of the 11th Parliament. There is urgent need to conclude the election process for the East African Legislative Assembly members and enable the commencement of business by the Assembly.
- 5. By a Motion adopted by the National Assembly and the Senate on 8th and 9th November, 2017 respectively, the Houses of Parliament established the Joint

- 6. The Joint Committee was mandated to urgently conclude the election process for the East African Legislative Assembly and for this purpose, to:
 - (a) suggest appropriate timelines for purposes of notifications, nominations and elections of EALA Members;
 - (b) consider the nominees, oversee the election process and report to the respective Houses within the timelines stipulated in the Elections Rules; and
 - (c) undertake any other functions as contemplated under the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 (EALA Rules) within the timelines stipulated in the said Rules.

7. The Rules are attached as Annex 2.

1.1 ELECTION TIMELINES

8. The Joint Committee convened its first meeting on Wednesday, November 15, 2017, where it prepared a road map for the election of Kenya's representatives to EALA. The proposed EALA election timelines were adopted as shown in Table 1.

1.2 ENTITLEMENT FOR NOMINATION

10. The Joint Committee considered the issue of the entitlement for nomination slots under the Rules. The Committee noted that under rule 6(1);

"The number of candidates that each party shall be entitled to nominate for election under these Rules shall be three times the figure arrived at by multiplying the number of elected Members of that party by such number as the Joint Committee shall determine and dividing the result by the total number of elected Members of Parliament".

Further, under rule 9 of the Rules "a person intending to vie for election independent of a political party shall submit his or her duly filled nomination form in the format prescribed in the Second Schedule to a presiding officer in the manner specified in the notice published under rule 4 and in accordance with rule 10".

- 11. In accordance with the provisions of rule 6 which provides for the number of candidates each political party should submit for election, the Joint Committee analyzed the representation in the Houses of Parliament to determine the proportionate entitlement for each of the twenty (20) political parties in the 12th Parliament. In this regard, the Joint Committee summed up the total number of members in each political party in both Houses as a proportion of the total membership of Parliament, which is 416 Members and multiplied by the resultant figure by 9.
 - 12. The Committee, noting that a party also includes a coalition of parliamentary political parties as provided in the EALA Rules and the Standing Orders of both Houses of Parliament, considered a letter from the Office of the Registrar of Political Parties which confirmed that there were only two coalition agreements deposited with the said Office. The committee learnt that five parties, namely, the *Orange Democratic Movement*, the *Wiper Democratic Movement*, FORD Kenya, AMANI National Congress and Chama Cha Mashinani (CCM), had entered into a coalition agreement for the formation of the National Super Alliance (NASA) Coalition. The second coalition agreement was by two parties, that is Wiper Democratic Movement and Muungano Party.
- 13. The Committee therefore having considered the relative strengths of parties in Parliament and established the parties qualifying to nominate members under the EALA Rules directed the Jubilee Party to nominate fifteen nominees and the NASA Coalition to nominate twelve nominees in order to ensure adequate representation of political parties in the membership of EALA.

The Committee was also conscious of the fact that the fifteen (15) independent members in both Houses of Parliament are indeed independent of one another and therefore could not be construed to be a "political party" for purposes of computing the proportional entitlements for parties. The Committee however resolved that independent candidate be invited to submit their nomination form in accordance with rule 9 of the EALA Rules.

2.0 INVITATION FOR APPLICATIONS FOR ELECTION TO EALA

- 14. Pursuant to rule 4 of the EALA Rules, by an advertisement carried in the Daily Nation and the Standard Newspapers and published in the Kenya *Gazette* on 16th November, 2017, the Presiding Officers invited interested qualified persons to apply for nomination for election as a Member of EALA. The notice invited candidates from political parties to present their applications on or before 23rd November, 2017 and independent candidates to present their applications on the nomination day set for 30th November, 2017. A copy of the advertisement is attached as *Annex 3*.
- 15. To qualify for nomination for election, it was obligatory for interested persons to meet the qualifications set out under Article 50 of the Treaty which provides as follows:
 - (1) The National Assembly of each Partner State shall elect, not from among its members, nine members of the Assembly, who shall represent as much as it is feasible, the various political parties represented in the National assembly, shades of opinion, gender and other special interest groups in that Partner State, in accordance with such procedure as the National Assembly of each Partner State may determine.

- (2) A person shall be qualified to be elected a Member of the Assembly by the National Assembly of a Partner State in accordance with paragraph (1) of this Article if such person-
 - (a) is a citizen of that Partner State;
 - (b) is qualified to be elected a member of the National Assembly of that Partner State under its Constitution;
 - (c) is not holding office as a Minister in that Partner State;
 - (d) is not an officer in the service of the Community; and
 - (e) has proven experience or interest in consolidating and furthering the aims and objectives of the Community.
- 16. Further, Article 99 of the Constitution of Kenya (2010) sets out the qualifications and disqualifications for election as a Member of Parliament as follows:

Unless disqualified under subsection (2), a person qualifies for nomination as a member of Parliament if the person—

- (a) is registered as a voter;
- (b) satisfies any educational, moral and ethical requirements prescribed by the Constitution and this Act; and
- (c) is nominated by a political party, or is an independent candidate who is supported—
 - (i) in the case of election to the National Assembly, by at least one thousand registered voters in the constituency; or
 - (ii) in the case of election to the Senate, by at least two thousand registered voters in the county.
- (2) A person is disqualified from being elected a member of Parliament if the person—

- (a) is a State officer or other public officer, other than a Member of Parliament;
- (b) has, at any time within the five years immediately preceding the date of election, held office as a member of the Commission;
- (c) has not been a citizen of Kenya for at least the ten years immediately preceding the date of election;
- (d) is a member of a county assembly;
- (e) is of unsound mind;
- (f) is an undischarged bankrupt;
- (g) is subject to a sentence of imprisonment of at least six months, as at the date of registration as a candidate, or at the date of election; or
- (h) is found, in accordance with any law, to have misused or abused a State office or public office or in any way to have contravened Chapter Six of the Constitution.
- (3) A person is not disqualified under subsection (2) unless all possibility of appeal or review of the relevant sentence or decision has been exhausted.
- 17.At the close of the application period, the Presiding Officers received a total of 208 applications. A summary of the applications per party is indicated in Table 2.

- 18.By a letter dated 24th November, 2017 the Presiding Officers forwarded the schedule of applicants to the leaders of majority party and minority party in both houses of Parliament for their action. The letter to the party leaders and the schedule of the applicants to the respective parties is attached at *Annex 4*.
- 19. The party leaders were requested to submit their nominees for election to the Presiding Officers on nomination day which was set for Thursday, 30th November, 2017. Independent candidates were similarly to submit their applications to the Presiding Officers on the nomination day.

2.1 PRE-NOMINATION BRIEFING

20.Pursuant to Rule 7 of the EALA Rules, on 29th November, 2017, the Presiding Officers held a pre-nomination briefing with the parliamentary party leaders of the Jubilee Party and NASA coalition at which the leaders were updated on the requirements under the Treaty for nomination of candidates for election to

EALA, the number of slots for nomination available for the parties depending on their representation in Parliament and the election timelines.

- 21. Nominating political parties were further requested to note that on the nomination day, Thursday, 30th November 2017, the following documents would be required for inspection by the Presiding Officers in respect of each candidate nominated for election to EALA:
 - (1) A duly filled Nomination of Party Nominee Form for Election of a Member of the East African Legislative Assembly as set out in the First Schedule to the Rules;
 - (2) A letter certifying that rule 8(3) requiring that each party nominates candidates through a transparent and democratic process has been complied with and attaching the final list of nominees of the party.
 - (3) A copy of the National Identity Card or Passport of the nominee evidencing that the person is and has been a citizen of Kenya for at least ten years immediately preceding the date of the election (Article 50(2) of the Treaty and Article 99(2)(c) of the Constitution);
 - (4) Detailed Curriculum Vitae (as required in the form set out in the First Schedule to the Rules);
 - (5) Certified copies of certificates and testimonials (as required in the form set out in the First Schedule to the Rules);
 - (6) For nominees who are State officers, public officers, sitting members of Parliament or are officers in the service of the East African Community, evidence of resignation as received by their employer or competent authority (Article 50(1) of the Treaty and Article 99(2)(a) and (d) of the Constitution);

- (7) For nominees who have held office as members of the IEBC, evidence that they have not held such office within five years immediately preceding the date of election; and
- (8) An Affidavit sworn by the candidate in support of the candidate's nomination.

2.2 NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES

- 22.On 30th November, 2017, the Presiding Officers received nomination papers of independent candidates and candidates nominated by the Jubilee Party and the NASA coalition.
- 23.On 6th December, 2017, pursuant to Rule 13(1), the Presiding Officers presented their Report on the nomination process to the Joint Committee. The Report of the Presiding Officers is attached as *Annex 5*.
- 24. In the Report, the Presiding Officers informed the Committee that thirty-one (31) candidates were cleared and issued with provisional nomination certificates. Twenty-six (26) of the nominees were affiliated to the political parties while five (5) were independent candidates.
- 25. The Presiding Officers noted that one of the nominees of the Jubilee Party, Ms. Julie Njeri Waweru is a serving Public Officer. Ms. Waweru is one of the Directors of the Kenya Youth Enterprise Fund. The Presiding Officers had provisionally accepted her nomination papers on the strength of the court decision by Justice D.K. Njagi Marete in Eric Cheruiyot & 7 others versus Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission & 7 others issued on 29th March, 2017. The Court declared section 43(5) of the Elections Act, 2011

unconstitutional, in effect allowing public officers intending to vie for political office to continue serving in their respective offices and only be required to resign after being nominated by their political parties to contest in an election.

- 26. The Presiding Officers went on to note that the decision of Justice Marete had been stayed by the Court of Appeal in County Government of Embu & another versus Eric Cheruiyot & 15 others on 27th September, 2017. This had the effect of suspending the decision of Justice Marete therefore reinstating the provisions of section 43(5) of the Elections Act, 2011 mandating pubic officers to resign at least six (6) months before an election in which they intend to contest.
- 27. The Presiding Officers also pointed out that Ms. Winfred Syonindi Mutua, a nominee of the NASA Coalition is a sitting Member of the Machakos County Assembly. Article 99(2)(a) and (d) of the Constitution provides that a member of a county assembly is not qualified to be elected as a Member of Parliament. This therefore means that Ms. Mutua does not qualify to be elected as a member of EALA in accordance with Article 50(2)(b) of the EAC Treaty. The Presiding Officers however provisionally accepted her nomination papers to enable the Committee make the decision on whether she qualifies for election to EALA in accordance with its powers under the EALA Rules.
- 28.In addition, the Presiding Officers stated that on Friday, 1st December, 2017 after the close of the nomination exercise they wrote to the following independent offices:
 - a) The Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC) to confirm-

- (i) whether, as required under article 99(1) (a) of the Constitution, each provisionally nominated candidates is registered as a voter in the voters Register held by the Commission; and
- (ii) whether, as required under article 99(1) (a) of the Constitution, the persons set out in the list submitted by the independent candidates, as persons supporting their nominations, are registered voters in the respective constituencies (at least one thousand registered voters in the constituency) or counties (at least two thousand registered voters in the county).
- b) The Registrar of Political Parties to ascertain whether the independent candidates meet the conditions set out in section 33(1)(a) of the Elections Act, 2011 which provides inter alia that a person qualifies to be nominated as an independent candidate for presidential, parliamentary and county elections for the purposes of articles 97, 98, 137, 177 and 180 of the Constitution if that person
 - (i) has not been a member of any political party for at least three months preceding the date of the election.

The letters to Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC) and the Registrar of Political Parties are attached as Annex 6

29. On Monday, 4th December, 2017, the Registrar of Political Parties vide her letter Ref: RPP/FRP/3/2 VOL VIII dated 4th December, 2017 informed the Presiding Officers that according to the records held by her office as at 4th December, 2017, the following is the political parties membership status of the listed applicants-

- 30. On Tuesday, 5th December, 2017, the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission vide their letter Ref: IEBC/VREO/2/6/2/Vol II (8) dated 4th December, 2017 indicated that
 - a) all the thirty-one (31) candidates provisionally issued with nomination certificates were duly registered as voters,
 - b) the Commission needed the soft copies of the list of supporters for the following independent candidates in order to verify whether the independent candidates meet the threshold of article 99 (1) (c) of the Constitution-

c) Mr. Cheruiyot Kemei Tamogei who submitted the soft copies of the list of his supporters, had only 917 registered voters and hence below the required number as stipulated under article 99(1) (c).

The response from the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC) and the Registrar of Political Parties are attached at Annex 7

- 31. The Report further indicated that the nomination papers and documents of provisionally nominated candidates were opened for public inspection on Friday, 1st December, 2017, and Monday, 4th December, 2017, in accordance to rule 12 of the said Rules. At the end of the inspection period, the Presiding Officers received the following complaints
 - i) A letter from Mr. Justus O. Mochoge a nominee of the NASA Coalition alleging that he was informed of his nomination on the nomination day Thursday, 30th November, 2017 at 3:30 p.m. and hence was not available to present his papers as he was in Busia. He however travelled to Nairobi on 1st December, 2017 to present his papers but was informed that he was time barred as the nomination day closed on Thursday, 30th November, 2017. He has written a letter requesting the Joint Committee to consider his case and accept his papers;
 - ii) A letter from Hon. Lawrence Sifuna, an independent candidate indicating that he sent his application to the Clerk of the National Assembly on 17th November, 2017. He however was unable to present his nomination papers on 30th November, 2017 as the vehicle he was travelling in broke down in Webuye and hence could not reach Nairobi on time to present his papers. He is requesting the Joint Committee to consider his application; and

- iii) A letter from Mr. Jimmy P. Luka submitted on 1st December, 2017, raising an issue with the fact that he had been excluded by his party from the list of nominees and requesting that the list of nominees submitted by NASA be rejected owing to the fact that no disabled person had been nominated and further, owing to the relationship of some nominees to the coalition leadership. Letters of complaints are attached as *Annex 8*.
- 32. Pursuant to Rule 13(1) of the EALA Rules, the Presiding Officers forwarded to the Joint Committee the names and nomination papers of all duly nominated candidates for consideration by the Committee. The list of candidates who qualified for nomination is indicated on table 3.

33. Rule 3 of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017, requires persons seeking the office of EALA membership to meet the requirements for election set out under Article 50(2) of the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community, Article 99 of the Constitution and section 22 of the Elections Act.

The thirteen (13) applicants indicated in table 4 did not qualify for nomination.

CONSIDERATION OF NOMINEES BY THE COMMITTEE

34.At a meeting held on 6th December, 2017 the Committee considered the nominees submitted by the Jubilee Party, NASA Coalition and the independent candidates as well as complaints submitted during the inspection of the nominees and made the following observations-

1. Consideration of complaints

- a) With respect to the request by Hon. Lawrence Sifuna to the Committee to consider his application after the close of the nomination day, the Committee declined to consider his application because he did NOT present his papers on the nomination day as required under Rule 9 of the Rules and as set out in the advertisement inviting persons interested in vying for election as a member of EALA to submit their applications on 30th November, 2017, the day assigned as the nomination day.
- b) With respect to the request by Mr. Jimmy P. Luka to the Committee to reject the nominees by the NASA Coalition, the Committee declined his request owing to the fact that the Rules required the political parties entitled to nominate its nominees to do so in accordance with rule 6(2). The Committee noted that it was not its mandate to adjudicate on the processes carried out by the respective political parties in determining its nominees.
- c) With respect to the request by Mr. Justus Mochoge to be included as one of the nominees of the NASA Coalition, the Committee noted that the NASA Coalition had, on the nomination day, submitted the name of the applicant as one of its nominees. The Committee therefore noted that the applicant should be included as a nominee of the NASA Coalition.

2. Observations

- a) The Jubilee Party and NASA Coalition had complied with rule 6 of the Rules and submitted three times the number of persons they are entitled to nominate under the Rules.
- b) Noting the advice of the Presiding Officers on statute and case law on the issue of resignation of State Officers and public officers intending to vie for political officer, a public officer ought to resign at least six (6) months before the election he or she intends to contest. Ms. Julie Njeri Waweru, being a Public Officer employed by the Kenya Youth Enterprise Fund, did not therefore qualify to be elected as a member of EALA.
- c) Ms. Winfred Syonindi Mutua being a Member of the Machakos county assembly did not qualify to be elected to EALA in accordance with Article 50 of the EAC Treaty as read together with Article 99 of the Constitution.
- d) All the thirty-one (31) candidates provisionally issued with nomination certificates were duly registered as voters.
- e) The following independent candidates do not qualify for nominations as independent candidates as they did not meet the conditions set out in section 33(1)(a) of the Elections Act, 2011, which provides *inter alia* that a person qualifies to be nominated as an independent candidate for presidential, parliamentary and county elections for the purposes of articles 97, 98, 137, 177 and 180 of the Constitution if that person
 - (i) has not been a member of any political party for at least three months preceding the date of the election.

- f) That Mr. Eric Wanjohi Gatheru an independent candidate was also disqualified because the list of his supporters were below the requisite number in accordance to provision of Article 99(1)(c) of the Constitution.
- g) Given the fact that none of the independent candidates qualify to vie for election and that the nominees by the political parties qualify to vie, the entitlements to nominate persons for election to EALA would only accrue to political parties as follows -
 - (a) the Jubilee Coalition five (5) nominees; and
 - (b) the NASA Coalition four (4) nominees.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Pursuant to the provisions of rule 13 (5) of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017, the Committee recommends that the Houses of Parliament resolve as follows-

That, pursuant to the provisions of Art. 50 (2) of the East African Community Treaty on qualification for election as Member of the Assembly as read together with Art. 99 of the Constitution of Kenya, Ms. Julie Njeri Waweru and Ms. Winfred Syonindi Mutua do not qualify to be elected a Member of the Assembly as they are unqualified to be elected as Members of Parliament in Kenya, being state officers;

- 2) That, Mr. Cheruiyot Kemei Tamogei, Ms. Hellen Makone, Mr. Billy Baltazar and Mr. Humphrey Kimani Njuguna who submitted their applications to vie as candidates independent of a political party do not qualify to vie for election as they do not meet the requirements of section 33(1)(a) of the Elections Act, 2011;
- 3) That, the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission having confirmed that the list of the persons in support of his nomination as an independent candidate as required under Article 99(1)(c) of the Constitution, fell below the constitutional threshold, Mr. Eric Wanjohi Gatheru does not qualify for election as a Member East African Legislative Assembly;
- 4) That, having met all requirements under the Constitution of Kenya, the East African Community Treaty, Elections Act, 2011 and the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017, the following nominees qualify for election as members to the East African Legislative Assembly –

REMARKS BY THE CLERKS OF THE HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT & BRIEF ON THE MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

The Representative of the Clerk of the Senate, Mr. M. A. Mohamed welcomed Members to the meeting and briefed them on the Committee's mandate and timelines. He explained to the Members that the Clerk of the East African Legislative Assembly (EALA) had written to the Speakers of Parliaments in the Partner States requesting them to cause to be held an election of members of EALA.

The Committee was informed that by a motion adopted by the National Assembly and the Senate on 8th and 9th November, 2017 respectively, the Houses of Parliament established a Joint Committee consisting of seven (5) members from each House, with the following mandate—

- a) suggest appropriate timelines for purposes of notifications, nominations and elections;
- b) Consider the nominees, oversee the election process and report to the House within the timelines stipulated in the Elections Rules.

The Co-Chairperson, Hon. Katoo Ole Metito, M.P. gave a background brief of the work done by a Joint Committee of the Eleventh (11th) Parliament and explained the reasons as to why the committee did not conclude its mandate.

He explained that the 11th Parliament made an amendment to Rule 6 of the EALA Election Rules, 2017 which was gazetted on 14th August, 2017 as Kenya Gazette Supplement No. 129, and thereby makes its mandatory for political parties to submit a list of nominees that is three times the number of slots available for nomination.

The Committee was explained to how the slot available for nomination of candidates was arrived at. The Committee considered the party strength in the (12th) Parliament and resolved that;

- a) Jubilee Party was entitled to 5 nomination slots;
- b) NASA Coalition was entitled to 4 nomination slots; and

c) Independent Candidates did not qualify for any nomination slot because an independent candidate was independent of the other independent candidates and therefore could not be considered as a group.

The Committee clarified that the nomination process was new and distinct from the process done by the Eleventh (11th) Parliament, since the slots for nomination were based on the parliamentary party membership of the Twelfth (12th) Parliament.

CONSIDERATION OF COMMITTEE TIMELINES MIN/JPCEALA/004/2017

The Principal Legal Counsel (Senate), Ms. Elizabeth Muhia presented the Committee timelines and explained that they were arrived from the timelines set out in the EALA Rules, 2017.

Members discussed the timelines and proposed that the timelines be reduced so that the elections would be held by 14th December, 2017. The Committee made the following amendments to the timelines;

- a) The advertisement calling for applications for membership to EALA be done on 16th November, 2017;

The Senior Deputy Clerk (KNA), Mr. Jeremiah Ndombi presented a detailed brief indicating the progress of the nomination process of members to the East African Legislative Assembly (EALA).

He highlighted the following;

- That nomination was held on Thursday, 30th November, 2017 at County Hall, Mini Chambers from 9.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m.
- The presiding officers received a list of fifteen (15) nominees from Hon. Adan Duale, M.P. and Sen. Kipchumba Murkomen, M.P., the Leader of the Majority Party in the National Assembly and the Senate respectively, at 10.45 a.m.
- 3) At 3.30 p.m. the presiding officers received a list of twelve (12) nominees from the NASA Coalition signed by Sen. Moses Wetangula, M.P., and Hon. John Mbadi, M.P., Minority Leader of the Senate and the National Assembly respectively.
- 4) Several independent candidates submitted their respective nomination papers for consideration by the presiding officers.
- 5) Upon scrutiny, successful nominees were issued with provisional certificates of nomination.
- 6) On 1st December, 2017 the presiding officers wrote to:
 - a) the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission to confirm-
 - (i) Whether or not, as required under article 99 (1) 9a) of the Constitution, each provisionally nominated candidate is registered as a voter in the voters' register held by the Commission, and
 - (ii) Whether or not, as required under article 99(1) (a) of the Constitution, the persons set out in the list submitted by the independent candidates, as persons supporting their nominations, are registered voters in the respective constituencies (at least one thousand registered voters in the constituency) or counties (at least two thousand registered voters).

- b) The Registrar of Political Parties to ascertain whether the independent candidates meet the conditions set out in section 33(1)(a) of the Elections Act, 2011.
- 7) That on 4th December, 2017 the Registrar of Political Parties replied in a letter informing the presiding officers indicating the status of the independent candidates being members of the Jubilee Party and that Mr. Eric Wanjohi Gatheru was the only partyless candidate.
- 8) That on 5th December, 2017, the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission wrote back to the presiding officers indicating that all the thirty-one (31) candidates were duly registered as voters. The Commission further sought to have the soft copies of the list of supporters of the independent candidates.
- 9) Nomination papers and documents of provisionally nominated candidates were opened for public inspection on Friday 1st December, 2017 and Monday 4th December, 2017 in accordance to rule 12.
- 10) That the presiding officers received three complaints to be considered by the Joint Committee;
 - (i) A nominee of the NASA Coalition, Mr. Justus O. Mochoge alleging that he was informed of his nomination on the nomination day at 3.30 p.m. and was not able to avail his papers as he was in Busia.
 - (ii) A letter from Hon. Lawrence Sifuna, an independent candidate indicating that he sent his application to the Clerk of the National Assembly on 17th November, 2017 but was not able to present his papers on 30th November as his vehicle broke down in Webuye.
 - (iii) A letter from Mr. Jimmy P. Luka who presented his papers on 1st December, 2017, raising an issue that he had been excluded by his party from the list of nominees and requesting that the list presented by NASA to be rejected owing to the fact that no disable person had been nominated.

Committee Resolution

Having considered the matters raised in the report by the presiding officers, the Committee resolved;

- To amend item three (3) on the report by deleting the word 'additional'.
- To admit the papers of Mr. Justus Mochoge as a nominee of the NASA Coalition.
- To dismiss both the requests by Hon. Lawrence Sifuna and Mr. Jimmy P. Luka.
- To hold a meeting on 6th December, 2017 at 4.00 p.m. to consider and adopt the report and receive the pending response from the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission.

MIN/JPCEALA/012/2017 CONSIDERATION OF COURT CASES ON EALA NOMINATIONS

The Director, Litigation & Compliance briefed Members on the current court cases challenging the EALA Elections as follows;

That as at 5th December, 2017 there were three court cases relating to the EALA elections. Two seeking orders to quash the EALA elections commenced by the 11th Parliament and one case filed to compel the 12th Parliament to carry out and complete the EALA elections, following the expiry of the term of the 11th Parliament.

- On 18th May 2017, Mr. Okiya Omtatah Okoiti, acting in person, filed a petition at the High Court against the Hon. The Attorney General, the Senate and the National Assembly. The Jubilee Coalition and the CORD Coalition were joined as interested parties seeking orders to restrain the Senate and National Assembly from conducting the EALA elections on the following grounds.
- On 24th November, 2017 Mr. Omtatah filed a fresh application under a certificate of urgency seeking conservatory orders to halt the fresh EALA election process being undertaken by the 12th Parliament.
- On 29th November, 2017 Honourable Mr. Justice Mativo, made the following direction;
 - (a) The Petitioner (Mr. Omtatah) is granted leave to amend the petition within 3 days and serve the same upon the respondents and the interested parties;
 - (b) The respondents and the Interested Party to respond to the amended petition within 7 days from the date of the service (if need be);
 - (c) The Respondents to file their written submissions to the Preliminary Objection within the same period of 7 days from the dated of service; and,
 - (d) The matter shall be heard on 29th January 2018.

MIN/JPCEALA/013/2017 BALLOT PAPER DESIGN

The secretariat presented a sample of the proposed ballot paper for the election of members to the East African Legislative Assembly.

Upon consideration the Committee resolved as follows;

- To amend the ballot paper to have both the option of an 'X' or a 'tick' (yes).
- To clearly indicate on the instructions of the ballot paper that any a ballot will be considered spoilt if a member marks more than nine (9) candidates.
- Design the ballot paper in accordance with rule 16(1).



(Legislative Supplement No. 24)

LEGAL NOTICE NO. 58

THE EAST AFRICAN LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY ELECTIONS ACT, 2011

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 12 of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act, the Parliament of Kenya makes the following Rules:—

THE EAST AFRICAN LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY ELECTIONS (ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE ASSEMBLY) RULES, 2017

PART I-PRELIMINARY

1. These Rules may be cited as the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017.

2. In these Rules, the parliamentary words and expressions used have the same meaning as that assigned to them in the Standing Orders of the respective House of Parliament and unless the context otherwise requires—

"candidate" means a person who is nominated to vie for election to the East African Legislative Assembly;

"election" means an election to the East African Legislative Assembly;

"joint committee" means a committee established by the National Assembly and the Senate for the purposes of elections conducted under these Rules;

"nomination" means nomination as a candidate to vie for election to the East African Legislative Assembly;

"party" means a parliamentary political party or coalition of parliamentary political parties;

"presiding officers" means the Clerk of the National Assembly and the Clerk of the Senate;

"returning officers" means the Speaker of the National Assembly and the Speaker of the Senate; and

"voter" means a member of the National Assembly or the Senate but does not include the Speaker of either House of Parliament.

PART II—QUALIFICATIONS AND NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES

3. A person shall not qualify to vie for election unless he or she meets the requirements for election set out under Article 50(2) of the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community, Article 99 of the Constitution and section 22 of the Elections Act.

4. Where an election is to be held, the presiding officers shall, by notice in the Gazette and in at least two newspapers of national

Notification of election and nomination date.

- (a) notify that fact and invite interested qualified persons to apply, within a period of seven days from the date of the notice, for nomination to be elected as a member of the East African Legislative Assembly; and
- (b) appoint a nomination day, which shall be within a period of seven days from the expiry of the period prescribed under paragraph (a) for the receipt of applications for nomination.
- 5. A person who qualifies for nomination shall submit his or her application for nomination to the specified political party of his or her choice in the manner specified in the notice published under rule 4.

6. (1) A party shall be entitled to nominate for election under these Rules any number of candidates not exceeding three times the figure arrived at by multiplying the number of elected Members of Parliament of that party by such number as Joint Committee shall determine and dividing the result by the total number of elected Members of Parliament.

Application for nomination by a political party.

Number of nominees of each party.

- (2) In nominating its candidates, each party shall, as much as it is feasible, take into account the need for fair representation of the various shades of opinion, regional balance, gender and other special interest groups in Kenya and shall ensure that at least one third of its nominees are women.
- 7. The presiding officers may, before the expiry of the period prescribed under rule 4(b) invite the respective leader of the majority party and the leader of the minority party of all parties entitled to nominate candidates for a pre-nomination briefing on the nomination requirements under the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community, the East Africa Legislative Assembly Elections Act, 2011 and under these Rules

Pre-nomination briefing.

8. (1) Upon the nomination of a candidate under these Rules, the respective political party or the nominee, as the case may be, shall submit the particulars of the nominee in the form prescribed in the First Schedule to the presiding officer in the manner prescribed under rule 10.

Nomination of candidates by a political party.

- (2) The nomination of a candidate by a political party shall not be valid unless the candidate or political party submits to the presiding officer, the prescribed form duly filled and certified by the leader of the majority party or the leader of the minority party, as the case may be, in the manner set out in the form.
- (3) Each party shall nominate candidates through a transparent and democratic process and shall keep a written record of the proceedings at which the final decision to nominate any candidate was made.
- 9. A person intending to vie for election independent of a political party shall submit his or her duly filled nomination form in the format prescribed in Second Schedule to a presiding officer in the

Nomination of candidates independent of a political party.

manner specified in the notice published under rule 4 and in accordance with rule 10.

10. On the day of nomination, at any time not later than four o'clock in the afternoon, an independent candidate or a nominee, the leader of the majority party or the leader of the minority party, as the case may be, of all parties entitled to nominate candidates shall deliver nomination papers of the candidate or candidates nominated by the party to the presiding officer.

11. (1) A candidate may, not later than four o'clock in the afternoon of the day following the nomination day, withdraw his or her candidature by notice in writing signed and delivered to the presiding officer, and in the case of a candidate nominated by a political party, with a copy to the party leader of the party that nominated the candidate.

(2) No withdrawal of a candidate shall be accepted after the expiry of the period prescribed under sub-rule (1).

(3) Where the presiding officer receives information that a candidate has died and the information is received after four o'clock in the afternoon of the nomination day, and before the election day, the election shall proceed, but the voters shall be informed of such death.

(4) In the case of a party nominee, the party which nominated the candidate who dies or for any other reason ceases to be a candidate before the election day, may notwithstanding rule 10, nominate another person in place of the candidate.

12. Subject to such conditions as the presiding officers may prescribe, any person may, during office hours for two working days from the nomination day, inspect the nomination papers of any candidate and may lodge a complaint with the presiding officers in relation to a candidate's nomination.

13. (1) Within three days after the expiry of the period provided for in rule 10, the presiding officers shall forward to the joint committee, for its consideration, the names and nomination papers of all duly nominated candidates together with any complaint that may have been received under rule 12.

(2) The joint committee may, in considering nomination papers under sub-rule (1), invite to appear before the committee, the respective nominee in order to verify any information affecting his or her qualification to vie for elections under these Rules.

(3) The joint committee may, upon considering the nomination papers of a candidate make a recommendation for the rejection of the papers of the candidate if it is apparent from the contents of the papers that the candidate is not qualified to vie for election.

(4) The joint committee may make a recommendation for the rejection of all nominations and order a fresh nomination if it is apparent from the list of nominees that it shall not be possible, upon the holding of elections, to have, as much as is feasible, a fair representation of the various political parties in Parliament, regional

balance, shades of opinion, gender and other special interest groups in Kenya and to ensure that at least not more than two thirds of the persons elected are of the same gender.

- (5) The joint committee shall consider the nomination papers and table its report on the nominees in both Houses of Parliament within a period of seven days from the date of receipt of the papers.
- (6) In the event that Parliament approves the recommendation of the joint committee for a fresh nomination, the presiding officer may shorten the periods specified under rule 4.

PART III—ELECTION CAMPAIGNS AND VOTING

- 14. An aspiring candidate may approach and seek the support of a Member of Parliament entitled to vote before the nomination day and may, if nominated, continue to do so after the nomination day.
- 15. (1) The presiding officers shall, by notice published in the Gazette and in at least two newspapers of national circulation appoint a date and a venue for the holding of the election by the respective Houses of Parliament which shall be not more than fourteen days after the nomination day.
- (2) The date and time for election appointed under sub-rule (1) shall be the same for the National Assembly and the Senate.
- 16. (1) Each presiding officer shall prepare and at the time appointed for the election, shall issue to each voter one ballot paper on which shall be written in alphabetical order, the names of all duly nominated candidates, their gender, age and county clustered under the heading of the names of the respective parties that nominated them.
- (2) A voter shall be required to cast a specified number of votes, which shall be clearly indicated on the bailot paper, in respect of the candidates nominated by each party.
- (3) The number of votes cast under sub-rule (2) in respect of each party shall be the figure arrived at by multiplying the number of Members of Parliament of that party by the number determined by the Joint Committee and dividing the result by the total number of Members of Parliament.
- 17. (1) The voting in each House shall be conducted under the general supervision of the respective Speaker, who shall be the returning officer, in the place appointed by the Speaker.
- (2) On receiving a ballot paper, a voter shall secretly record his or her votes by putting a mark against the names of the nine candidates that the voter wishes to elect as members of the East African Legislative Assembly, in the respective proportions specified under sub-rule (3) of rule 15.
- (3) A voter shall cast as many votes as the number of candidates to be elected and in proportion to the number of candidates required to be elected as shall be determined by the Joint Committee.
- (4) Where a voter casts more votes than the number of candidates required to be elected with respect to a category of candidates, the ballot paper of that voter shall be regarded as spoilt.

- (5) The ballot paper of a voter shall not be regarded as spoilt where the voter casts a number of votes that falls below the number of candidates to be elected in an election conducted under these Rules.
- (6) A voter who accidentally spoils a ballot paper while voting is in progress shall, on surrendering the spoilt ballot paper, be issued with a replacement ballot paper.

18. (1) Immediately after all voters have cast their votes, the respective returning officer shall appoint two members to act as counting agents for all the candidates.

(2) The respective presiding officer shall, in the presence of the counting agents as witnesses, count the votes cast.

19. When the votes have been counted and the results of the election have been ascertained—

(a) each presiding officer shall record the results of the tally and report to the respective House the results of the election together with the number of votes recorded for each candidate under each cluster at the end of the election exercise;

- (b) the returning officer in each House shall the upon reporting the results of the elections under paragraph (a), send a message to the other House communicating the results of the election in the respective House;
- (c) the returning officer shall announce to the respective House, the results of the election in the other House; and
- (d) the returning officer in the National Assembly shall declare to be duly elected as members of the East African Legislative Assembly, nine persons who receive the highest number of votes.
- 20. Within seven days after the declaration of the duly elected members of the East African Legislative Assembly under rule 19 (d)—
 - (a) the presiding officers shall publish the names in the Gazette;
 - (b) the returning officers shall jointly transmit to the Clerk of the East African Legislative Assembly the names of the elected members as published in the Gazette.
- 21. The presiding officers of the respective Houses of Parliament shall ensure safe custody of all ballot papers and other documents relating to the conduct of the election and shall cause all such documents to be destroyed after the expiration of six months from the election day.

PART IV—VOIDANCE OF ELECTION

- 22. Any question that may arise as to whether a person is an elected member of the East African Legislative Assembly or whether a seat in the Assembly is vacant shall be determined by the High Court.
- 23. The procedure, jurisdiction and grounds for election petitions in respect of a Member of Parliament shall apply mutatis mutandis for a

PART V-MISCELLANEOUS

24. Where the seat of a member elected under these Rules becomes vacant, the Speakers shall, upon receipt of notification of the vacancy from the Speaker of the East African Legislative Assembly, facilitate the election of a member to replace the member in accordance with the procedure set out under these Rules.

Filling of vacancy.

25. If any matter arises which is not specifically provided for in these Rules, the respective Speakers shall make a ruling directing what is to be done and in making such a ruling, the Speakers shall be guided by the practice and procedure normally followed in similar situations with regard to the conduct of elections in Parliament.

Matters not specifically provided for

26. These Rules supercede any previous rules, procedure or practice for the election of members to the East African Legislative Assembly.

Supercession

27. The Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules. 2001 and the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2012 are revoked.

The above referenced subject matter refers.

The East African Legislative Assembly is established under Article 9 of the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community (EAC) as one of the key organs and institutions of the Community. The Assembly has a term of five (5) years and each Member State is required to nominate nine (9) members after every five-year term of the Assembly. The 3rd Assembly was elected in 2012 and the term of the members came to an end on 4th June, 2017.

Section 4 of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act, 2011 requires the election of Members to the Assembly to be conducted within ninety days before the expiry of the term of the sitting members. The election of members to the Assembly is to be conducted in accordance with procedures set out by each Partner State.

We have also attached a separate list and documents of applicants from other parties, who state that they have a working relationship with the Jubilee Party. Please note that, the Joint Committee confirmed with the Registrar of Political Parties that the Jubilee Party had not deposited a pre-election or post-election agreement between it and any other political party.

The East African Legislative Assembly is established under Article 9 of the Treaty for the Establishment of the East African Community (EAC) as one of the key organs and institutions of the Community. The Assembly has a term of five (5) years and each Member State is required to nominate nine (9) members after every five-year term of the Assembly. The 3rd Assembly was elected in 2012 and the term of the members came to an end on 4th June, 2017.

Section 4 of the East African Legislative Assembly Elections Act, 2011 requires the election of Members to the Assembly to be conducted within **ninety** days before the expiry of the term of the sitting members. The election of members to the Assembly is to be conducted in accordance with procedures set out by each Partner State.

RE: FORWARDING OF NAMES AND NOMINATION PAPERS OF DULY NOMINATED CANDIDATES FOR ELECTION AS MEMBERS TO THE EAST AFRICAN LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY (EALA)

Further to the resolution of the Houses, the Presiding Officers appointed Thursday, 30th December, 2017, as the nomination day to receive and process nominations from the Jubilee Party, NASA Coalition and the independent candidates.

We hereby report that-

- 1. The nomination was held on Thursday, 30th December, 2017, at County Hall, Mini Chambers from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- 2. The venue was set and opened for the process from 8:30 a.m.
- 3. The Presiding Officers were at the venue awaiting submission of names of additional nominees from the party Leaders and independent candidates.
- 4. At 10:45 a.m. Hon. Adan Duale and Hon. Sen. Kipchumba Murkomen, the Leader of the Majority Party in the National Assembly and in the Senate respectively, appeared before the Presiding Officers and pursuant to rule 8(3) of the East African Legislative Assembly (Elections of Members of the Assembly) Rules 2017, presented a list of fifteen (15) nominees for election as members of the East African Legislative Assembly.

- 5. At 3:30 p.m. the Presiding Officers received a list of twelve (12) nominees from the NASA Coalition.
- 6. During the course of the day, the independent candidates submitted their respective nomination papers for consideration by the Presiding Officers.
- 7. Upon scrutiny of the applications by the independent candidates and applicants nominated by the Jubilee Party and the NASA Coalition, the Presiding Officers issued the successful nominees with provisional certificates of nomination.
- 8. On Friday, 1st December, 2017, after the close of the nomination exercise we wrote letters to the following independent offices:
 - a) The Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC) to confirm;
 - (i) Whether or not, as required under article 99(1) (a) of the Constitution, each provisionally nominated candidate is registered as a voter in the voters Register held by the Commission, and
 - (ii) Whether or not, as required under article 99(1) (2) of the Constitution, the persons set out in the list submitted by the independent candidates, as persons supporting their nominations, are registered voters in the respective constituencies (at least one thousand registered voters in the constituency) or counties (at least two thousand registered voters in the county).
- b) The Registrar of Political Parties to ascertain whether the independent candidates meet the conditions set out in section 33(1)(a) of the Elections Act, 2011 which provides *inter alia* that a person qualifies to be nominated as an independent candidate for presidential, parliamentary and county elections for the purposes of articles 97, 98, 137, 177 and 180 of the Constitution if that person
 - (i) has not been a member of any political party for at least three months preceding the date of the election.
- 9. On Monday, 4th December, 2017, the Registrar of Political Parties vide her letter Ref: RPP/FRP/3/2 VOL VIII dated 4th December, 2017 informed us that according to the records held by her office as at 4th December, 2017, the following is the political parties membership status of the listed applicants-

c) Mr. Cheruiyot Kemei Tamogei who submitted the soft copies of the list of his supporters, had only 917 registered voters and hence below the required number as stipulated under article 99(1) (c).

The nomination papers and documents of provisionally nominated candidates were opened for public inspection on Friday, 1st December, 2017, and Monday, 4th December, 2017, in accordance to rule 12 of the said Rules. At the end of the inspection period, we received the following complaints -

1. A letter from Mr. Justus O. Mochoge a nominee of the NASA Coalition alleging that he was informed of his nomination on the nomination day - Thursday, 30th November, 2017 at 3:30 p.m and hence was not available to present his papers as he was in Busia. He however travelled to Nairobi on 1st December, 2017 to present his papers but was informed that he was time barred as the nomination day closed on Thursday, 30th November, 2017. He has written a letter requesting the Joint Committee to consider his case and accept his papers;

- 2. A letter from Hon. Lawrence Sifuna, an independent candidate indicating that he sent his application to the Clerk of the National Assembly on 17th November, 2017. He however was unable to present his nomination papers on 30th November, 2017 as the vehicle he was travelling in broke down in Webuye and hence could not reach Nairobi on time to present his papers. He is requesting the Joint Committee to consider his application; and
- 3. A letter from Mr. Jimmy P. Luka submitted on 1st December, 2017, raising an issue with the fact that he had been excluded by his party from the list of nominees and requesting that the list of nominees submitted by NASA be rejected owing to the fact that no disabled person had been nominated and further, owing to the relationship of some nominees to the coalition leadership.



RE: ADDENDUM TO THE PRESIDING OFFICERS REPORT ON THE NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR ELECTION AS MEMBERS TO THE EAST AFRICAN LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY (EALA)

Further to the letter dated 5th December, 2017 from the clerks of both houses of Parliament reporting on the nomination of candidates for election to the East Africa Legislative Assembly and forwarding the duly received nomination papers, we wish to add as follows to the said report-

1. One of the Nominees of the Jubilee Party, Ms. Julie Njeri Waweru is a serving Public Officer. Ms. Waweru is one of the Directors of the Kenya Youth Enterprise Fund. We had provisionally accepted her nomination papers on the strength of the court decision by Justice D.K. Njagi Marete in the case of Eric Cheruiyot & 7 others v Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission & 7 others issued on 29th March, 2017. In the said case, the Court declared section 43 (5) of the Elections Act, 2011 unconstitutional, in effect allowing public officers intending to vie for political office to continue serving in their respective offices and only be required to resign after

being nominated by their respective political parties to contest in an election. On 27th September, 2017 however, the Court of Appeal in County Government of Embu & another v Eric Cheruiyot & 15 others stayed the said decision. This had the effect of reinstating the provisions of section 43 (5) of the Elections Act, 2011 and therefore mandating pubic officers to resign at least six (6) months before an election in which they intend to contest.

2. Ms. Winfred Syonindi Mutua, a nominee of the NASA Coalition is a sitting Member of the Machakos County Assembly. This means that she offends Article 99 (2) (a) and (d) of the Constitution which provide that a member of a county assembly or indeed any state officer who is not a member of parliament is not qualified to be elected as a member of parliament. Ms. Mutua therefore appears not to qualify to be elected as a member of EALA in accordance with Article 50 (2) (b) of the EAC Treaty. We however provisionally accepted her nomination papers to enable the Committee make the decision on whether she qualifies for election to EALA in accordance with the Committee's powers under the East African Legislative Assembly Elections (Election of Members of the Assembly) Rules, 2017 Rules.
