#### CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

This report contains proceedings of the Departmental Committee on Energy during the approval hearings of Mr. Alex Kamau Wachira, nominee for appointment as Principal Secretary, State Department for Energy and Mr. Mohamed Liban, nominee for appointment as Principal Secretary, State Department for Petroleum as requested by H.E. the President and communicated to the House by the Speaker on Thursday, 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2022.

Pursuant to Article 155(3) (b) of the Constitution, Section 5 of the Public Appointments Parliamentary Approval Act (PAPAA) and Standing Order 45(1), H.E. the President notified the National Assembly of the nomination of fifty-one (51) Principal Secretaries to various State Departments vide a letter dated 2nd November 2022. The Hon Speaker vide a communication made on Thursday, 3rd November, 2022 conveyed to the House the Message from H.E. the President and subsequently referred names of the nominees, curricula vitae, and the report of the selection panel on their recruitment to Departmental Committees for approval hearings. While referring the matter to the Committees, the Speaker directed that the Committees undertake the vetting exercise within twenty-eight (28) days pursuant to Section 8 of the Public Appointments Parliamentary Approval Act (No. 33 of 2011). The Speaker further directed the Clerk of the National Assembly to notify the nominees and the general public by placing adverts in two newspapers of nationwide circulation and the Parliamentary Website of the time and place of holding the approval hearings by Friday, 4th November 2022.

In compliance with Article 118 (b) of the Constitution and section 6 (4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Friday, 4<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 informing the public of the nomination, date, time and place of the approval hearing. He also invited the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability of the nominees in conformity with section 6 (9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011). The memoranda were to be received on or before Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 at 5.00 p.m. (East African Time). In this regard, by close of business on Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> November 2022, the Committee received two memoranda in support of nominee, Mr. Alex Wachira's suitability.

The Clerk of the National Assembly also wrote to Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP) seeking references and background checks relating to the suitability of the nominee.

The nominees appeared before the Committee on Wednesday, the 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2022 for vetting. The Committee examined their suitability based on the criteria set out in Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011). In addition, the Committee examined their academic credentials, relevant experience, knowledge of sector issues and on leadership and integrity. The Committee paid due regard to the procedure used to arrive at the nominees; any

constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question and suitability of the nominees for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominees' abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the State Departments.

#### Committee Recommendation

The Committee having held approval hearings of the nominees regarding their suitability, observed that due process was followed on the recruitment process as provided for under Article 155(3) (b) of the Constitution and the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval Act) (No. 33 of 2011). The Committee therefore recommends that the National Assembly APPROVES the nomination of Mr. Alex Wachira for appointment as Principal Secretary, State Department for Energy and Mr. Mohamed Liban for appointment as Principal Secretary, State Department for Petroleum.

The Committee registers its appreciation to the Offices of the Speaker, Office of the Clerk of the National Assembly, Office of the Director, Departmental Committees and the Committee Secretariat for the logistical support extended during the vetting process.

#### CHAPTER ONE

#### 1.0 PREFACE

#### 1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

- The Departmental Committee on Energy is one of the fifteen Departmental Committees of the National Assembly established under Standing Order 216 whose mandates pursuant to the Standing Order 216 (5) are as follows:
  - To investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;
  - To study the programme and policy objectives of ministries and departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
  - iii. on a quarterly basis, monitor and report on the implementation of the national budget in respect of its mandate;
  - iv. To study and review all legislation referred to it;
  - v. To study, assess and analyse the relative success of the ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
  - vi. To investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned ministries and departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the House;
  - vii. To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 204 (Committee on Appointments);
  - viii. To examine treaties, agreements and conventions;
  - ix. To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation;
  - x. To consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
  - xi. To examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.

## 1.2 Subjects under the Committee

- In accordance with the Second Schedule of the Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to consider, fossil fuel exploration, development, production, maintenance and distribution, nuclear energy, clean energy, and regulation of energy.
- 3. In executing its mandate, the Committee oversees the Ministry of Energy and Petroleum.

#### CHAPTER TWO

#### 2.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

## 2.1 Legal Framework

- 6. Article 155 of the Constitution provides that:
  - 155. (1) There is established the office of Principal Secretary, which is an office in the public service.
    - (2) Each State department shall be under the administration of a Principal Secretary.
    - (3) The President shall-
      - (a) nominate a person for appointment as Principal Secretary from among persons recommended by the Public Service Commission; and
      - (b) with the approval of the National Assembly, appoint Principal Secretaries.
    - (4) The President may re-assign a Principal Secretary.
    - (5) A Principal Secretary may resign from office by giving notice, in writing, to the President.
- 7. In light of this, H.E. the President nominated fifty-one (51) persons for appointment as Principal Secretaries to various State Departments. The President nominated the following persons for appointment as Principal Secretaries for Energy and Petroleum:
  - i. Mr. Alex Wachira: Nominee for appointment as Principal Secretary, Energy; and
  - ii. Mr. Mohamed Liban: Nominee for appointment as Principal Secretary, Petroleum
- The Departmental Committee on Energy and Petroleum has been assigned the role of conducting the vetting of the aforesaid nominees.
- The following Articles of the Constitution and statutes/provisions will be paramount to the Committee as it executes this mandate:
  - i. The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011);
  - The Public Service Act (No. 10 of 2017) on recommendation for appointment of Principal Secretaries:
  - iii. Article 10 of the Constitution on the national values and principles of governance;
  - iv. Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity;
  - v. Article 77 of the Constitution on restriction on activities of State Officers;
  - vi. Article 78 of the Constitution on dual citizenship;
  - vii. Article 118 of the Constitution on public participation;
  - viii. Article 232 of the Constitution on values and principles of public service;
  - ix. The Leadership and Integrity Act (Cap. 182);

- x. The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act (No. 1A of 2015); and
- xi. The Public Officer Ethics Act (Cap. 183).

# The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011)

- 10. Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), provides for issues which the relevant House of Parliament (in this case, the National Assembly) is supposed to consider in relation to any nomination. These issues include:
  - i. the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;
  - ii. any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
  - iii. the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.
- 11. During the approval hearing, section 6 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) provides important points, viz:
  - An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background (section 6(7), PAPAA);
  - The criteria specified in the Schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate (section 6(8), PAPAA);
  - Any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated (section 6(9), PAPAA); and
  - iv. A candidate may, at any time, by notice in writing addressed to the Clerk, withdraw from the approval process and the candidate's nomination shall end (section 6(10), PAPAA).

# The Public Service Act (No. 10 of 2017)

- 12. Section 47 (2) of the Public Service Act (No. 10 of 2017) provides qualifications that one must have so as to be eligible for appointment as a Principal Secretary. These are:
  - be a citizen of Kenya;
  - ii. hold a degree from a university recognized in Kenya;
  - has at least ten (10) years relevant professional experience, five (5) years of which should have been in a leadership position or at a top management level in the public service or private sector;
  - iv. possess general knowledge of the organisation and functions of Government;
  - demonstrates an understanding of the goals, policies and developmental objectives of the nation;
  - vi. has demonstrable leadership and management capacity including knowledge of financial management and strategic people management; and
  - vii. meets requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution.

# Article 10(2) of the Constitution on national values and principles of governance

13. Article 10(2) of the Constitution provides for the national values and principles of governance which include patriotism, national unity, sharing and devolution of power, the rule of law, democracy and participation of the people; human dignity, equity, social justice, inclusiveness, equality, human rights, non-discrimination and protection of the marginalised; good governance, integrity, transparency and accountability; and sustainable development.

# Chapter 6 of the Constitution (Leadership and Integrity)

- 14. There are important provisions in Chapter 6 of the Constitution worth pointing out. Article 73 of the Constitution provides that the authority assigned to a State officer (a Principal Secretary being a state officer under Article 260 of the Constitution) is a public trust to be exercised in accordance to the Constitution, demonstrate respect for the people, bring honour to the nation and dignity to the office and promote public confidence in the integrity of the office. Also, the State officer shall have the responsibility to serve the people, rather than the power to rule them.
- 15. The guiding principles of leadership and integrity are listed as selection based on personal integrity, competence and suitability, objectivity and impartiality in decision making, selfless service based solely on the public interest, accountability and discipline and commitment in service to the people.

## Article 77 of the Constitution (Restriction on activities of State officers)

16. Article 77 of the Constitution provides that a full-time State officer shall not participate in any other gainful employment and that any appointed State officer shall not hold office in a political party.

# Article 78 of the Constitution on citizenship and leadership

17. Article 78 of the Constitution states that a person is not eligible for election or appointment to a State office unless the person is a citizen of Kenya. It also provides that a State officer or a member of the defence forces shall not hold dual citizenship.

## Article 118 of the Constitution on public access and participation

- 18. Article 118 of the Constitution provides that:
  - 1. Parliament shall:
    - a) conduct its business in an open manner, and its sittings and those of its committees shall be in public; and
    - facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative and other business of Parliament and its committees.
  - 2. Parliament may not exclude the public, or any media, from any sitting unless in exceptional circumstances the relevant Speaker has determined that there are justifiable reasons for the exclusion.

#### Article 232 of the Constitution on Values and Principles of Public Service

19. Article 232 of the Constitution provides for the values and principles of public service which include high standards of professional ethics; efficient, effective and economic use of resources; responsive, prompt, effective, impartial and equitable provision of services; involvement of the people in the process of policy making; accountability for administrative acts; transparency and provision to the public of timely, accurate information; fair competition and merit as the basis of appointments and

promotions; representation of Kenya's diverse communities; and affording adequate and equal opportunities for appointment, training and advancement, at all levels of the public service of men and women; the members of all ethnic groups; and persons with disabilities.

# The Leadership and Integrity Act (Cap. 182)

20. The Leadership and Integrity Act provides a number of obligations to a State officer. These are, among others: to respect and abide by the Constitution and the law, public trust, performance of duties in an honest and accountable manner, professionalism, financial integrity, not to engage in activities that amount to abuse of office, not misuse public resources, accepting gifts that may compromise the officer's duties, wrongful or unlawful acquisition of property, conflict of interest e.t.c.

# The Public Service (Values and Principles) Act

21. Section 5 of the Public Service (Values and Principles) Act provides that a public officer shall maintain high standards of professional ethics, including, being honest; displaying high standards of integrity, transparency, accountability, respect to others, objectivity, patriotism, observance of rule of law. (Applies in future upon appointment)

# The Public Officer Ethics Act (Cap. 183)

22. The Public Officer Ethics Act provides for obligations to be carried out by a public officer. These include professionalism, carrying out duties in accordance with the law, prohibition from unjust enrichment, avoiding conflict of interest, not using office as a venue for soliciting or collecting harambees; not acting for foreigners; care of property; political neutrality, not practicing nepotism or favouritism, giving impartial advice, conducting private affairs in a way that maintains public confidence, bar from sexual harassment, submission of declaration of income, assets and liabilities once every two years (section 26). (Applies in future after appointment)

## 2.2 Qualifications for appointment as Principal Secretary

23. In conducting the approval hearings, the Committee was guided by Article 155 (3) (b) of the Constitution, section 47 (2) of the Public Service Act and the provisions of Section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011).

#### 2.3 Message from H.E. the President

24. H.E. the President on 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022 communicated the names of the nominees for appointment to the positions of Principal Secretary Energy and Petroleum to the Speaker for approval by the National Assembly pursuant to Article 155 (3). The Speaker in his communication from the Chair issued on Tuesday, 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2022 and pursuant to Standing Order No. 42 referred the names to the Departmental Committee on Energy to conduct approval hearings and report within twenty-eight (28) days (Annexure 1-Notification).

## 2.4 Speaker's Communication and Committal to the Committee

- 25. Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 42, the Speaker of the National Assembly on Tuesday, 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2022 communicated to the House the message from H.E. the President regarding the nominees for appointment as Principal Secretaries for various State Departments. The Speaker informed the House that H.E. the President was seeking approval of the National Assembly on the said nominations before the nominees' appointment (Annexure 2- CVs and Testimonials).
- 26. In accordance with Standing Order 45(1), the Speaker read the Message from H.E. the President and referred the names of the nominees, their curricula vitae and report of the Selection Panel on the recruitment process to the Departmental Committee on Energy to conduct approval hearings (Annex 3- Message from H.E the President).
- 27. While referring the matter to the Committee, the Speaker directed that the Committee undertakes the vetting exercise within twenty-eight (28) days pursuant to Section 8 of the Public Appointments Parliamentary Approval Act (No. 33 of 2011). The Speaker further directed the Clerk of the National Assembly to notify the nominees and the general public by placing adverts in two newspapers of nationwide circulation and the Parliamentary Website of the time and place of holding the approval hearings by Friday, 4th November 2022 (Annexure 4- Print media adverts/ Public notification).
- 28. In addition, the Speaker directed that approval hearings should commence on Monday, 14<sup>th</sup> November 2022 and end on Friday, 18<sup>th</sup> November 2022. Thereafter, the reports should be tabled in the House not later than Tuesday, 22<sup>nd</sup> November, 2022 so as to enable the House to consider the reports within the statutory timelines.

#### 2.5 Notification to the Public

- 29. Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), provides that "any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated".
- 30. The Clerk of the National Assembly on Friday, 4th November, 2022 placed a notification in the print media informing the general public of the intention of the Committee to conduct approval hearings, as provided for by Article 118 (1) (a) (b) and (2) of the Constitution and Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), which allows public participation in committee proceedings. The notification gave provision for the submission of

memoranda, by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominees, by Friday, 11th November, 2022 at 5.00 pm (East African Time).

31. In this regard, by close of business on Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, the Committee had received two memorandum in support of the nominee for Energy, Mr. Alex Wachira's suitability.

#### 2.6 Notification to the Nominee

- 32. The Clerk of the National Assembly vide an advert placed in the print media on Friday, 4th November 2022 and letters Ref. NA/DDC/ENERGY/VETT/2022/001 and Ref. NA/DDC/ENERGY/VETT/2022/001 (Annexures 5 & 6) informed the nominees of the nomination by H.E. the President and requested them to appear for vetting by the Departmental Committee on Energy on Wednesday, 16th November, 2022 in Committee Room 9, Main Parliament Building. The Clerk of the National Assembly further requested the nominees to bring with them their clearance certificates from the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI) and Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP) (Annexure 7).
- 33. However, vide a Communicated dated 16th November, 2022, the Speaker of the National Assembly suspended the exercise arising from the decision of the Employment and Labour Relations Court regarding Constitution Petition No. E 186 of 2022 and E192 of 2022 challenging the nomination of Principal Secretaries (Annexure 8).
- 34. The suspension was lifted vide a Communication dated **Tuesday**, **29**<sup>th</sup> **November**, **2022** after the aforementioned Petitions were dismissed by the Court. The nominees were dully notified of the new date being **Wednesday**, **30**<sup>th</sup> **November**, **2022**.

## 2.7 Clearance Requirements

35. The Clerk of the National Assembly wrote to the Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB), Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP) and Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI) requesting for tax, education loans, integrity, affiliation to political parties and criminal record status of the nominees. The following institutions wrote back to the National Assembly clearing the nominees, KRA (letter Ref. KRA/5/1002/5(8179) dated 14th January 2022); DCI DCI/CRO/SEC/6/7/2/A/VOL.XI/208 dated 10th November, 2022); EACC Ref: EACC.7/10/5 11th VOL XXI (70) dated November 2022); HELB (letter Ref. HELB/RR/112009/190 10th dated November 2022); and ORPP Ref: RPP/ORG/GEN/VETT/2022(041) dated 7th November 2022 (Annexure 9).



# 2.8 Report of the Selection Panel on the Nomination of Principal Secretaries

- 36. Pursuant to Article 155 (3) (a) of the Constitution, the Public Service Commission invited applications from suitably qualified persons for the position of Principal Secretary. The advertisement was published in the print media, Kenya Gazette No. 10536 and on the Commission's Website on 7th September, 2022 with a closing date of 20th October, 2022.
- 37. On 20th September, 2022, the Commission extended the advertisement period by seven (7) days. The advertisement period lapsed on 27th September, 2022 with a total of nine thousand one hundred and fifty-four (9,154) persons submitting applications for consideration.
- 38. Four hundred and seventy-seven (477) candidates were shortlisted from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 and a further review done on 7<sup>th</sup> October, 2022 to bring the shortlist to five hundred and eighty-five (585) candidates so as to cater for gender, marginalized/minority groups and PWDs pursuant to Article 232 (1) (h) of the Constitution. Interviews for the shortlisted persons were conducted from 12<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> October, 2022.
- 39. The Public Service Commission adhered to all provisions of the Constitution in the process of advertising, shortlisting and interviewing the candidates including, merit, gender, ethnic and regional balance.

#### 2.9 Committee Proceedings

- 40. The Committee having received the names of the nominees was obligated to conduct approval hearings and make determination of the nominees' suitability or otherwise within twenty-eight (28) days as provided for in section 8 (1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011).
- 41. The Committee held four (4) sittings during which it examined and reviewed the nominees' certificates, testimonials as well as conducted approval hearings.

#### CHAPTER THREE

#### 3.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS

- 42. The Committee conducted approval hearings for the nominees on Wednesday, 30<sup>th</sup> November, 2022. In conducting the vetting exercise, the Committee was guided by, among other documents, the Constitution, the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011), the Public Service Act and the Standing Orders.
- 43. The Committee examined the nominees using the guidelines in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011). The Committee also considered the following in vetting the nominees:
  - a. Academic qualifications
  - Employment record and work experience
  - Professional association
  - d. Public office, political activities and affiliations
  - e. Potential conflict of interest
  - Suitability to the position
  - g. Tax compliance
  - h. Vision and leadership
  - i. Integrity
  - Expectations and Key priorities

#### 3.1 Mr. Alex Kamau Wachira

Mr. Wachira was orally interviewed by the Committee and responded to questions during vetting as follows:

44. Mr. Wachira is a Kenyan citizen of identity card number 22509967 and was born in 1982, Nyeri County.

#### 3.1.2 Educational Background

- 45. Mr. Alex Kamau Wachira holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing from the University of Nairobi College Of Health Sciences (2006). He informed the Committee that he was pursuing Masters of Arts in Leadership at Pan African Christian University.
- 46. He attended Kamuka Boarding Primary School where he obtained a Kenya Certificate of Primary Education (KCPE) in 1996 and later proceeded to Chinga Boys High School in 1997 where he sat for Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) Examinations in 2000.

#### 3.1.3 Work Experience/Career Progression

- 47. Mr. Wachira has worked in the private sector all his career life in the following capacities:
  - i. Head of Fixed Income Dealing, Faida Investment Bank from June 2012 to date;
  - ii. Head of Fixed Income Dealing, Genghis Capital Ltd from May 2011 to June 2012;
  - iii. Dyer and Blair Investment Bank from March 2008 to April 2009;
  - iv. Wilka Pump Engineering Works Ltd;
  - v. Implala Logistics Ltd;
  - vi. AC Nielsen Plc from May to June 2006 and March to June 2007 and;
  - vii. Kymms Family Salon ltd.
- 48. Other assignments include Student Organization of Nairobi University (SONU) Elections as a Commissioner and sitting in the Elections Petition Panel in 2004 and 2005.

#### 3.1.4 Professional Associations & Affiliations

- 49. Mr. Wachira is professionally affiliated with:-
  - i.General Nairobi University Nursing Students Association (NUNSA) where he serves as the Secretary;
  - ii. Association of Medical Students Association of University of Nairobi (AMSUN), serving as the treasurer;
  - iii. The Kenya Breast Health Programme where he is an active volunteer;
  - iv.Kenya Association of Stock Brokers and Investment Bankers (KASIB);
  - v.Bond Market Association Founding Member; and
  - vi. Naromoru Nairobi Catholic Association Chairman.

#### 3.1.5 Public Office, Political Activities and Affiliations

- 50. The nominee does not hold other positions in public offices apart from those highlighted under the section on work and professional experiences.
- 51. The nominee has contributed to the community and the nation as follows:
  - i.He served as a member of the Board of Management in Moi Equator Girls High School –Nanyuki and St. Monica Secondary School – Naro Moru between 2015 and 2019.
  - ii.He is an active volunteer of Kenya Breast Health Programme which participated in the screening of patients for breast cancer from 2004 – 2007.
  - iii. He has organized medical camps, workshops and clinics throughout the country.

#### 3.1.6 Personal Conflict of Interest

51. The nominee has no immediate associations that are likely to present potential conflict of interest when he assumes the position.

#### 3.1.7 Sources of Income and Net-worth

- 52. The nominee's sources of income during the calendar year preceding his nomination and the current calendar year comprise of salaries from Faida Investment Bank, commissions and share dividends from Impala Logistics Ltd of four million two hundred and thirty four thousand seven hundred and seventeen and fifteen cents (Kshs. 4,234,717.15) in year 2021 and six million seven hundred and nine thousand, four hundred and sixty five and fifty three cents (Kshs. 6,709,465.53) in the year 2022.
- 53. The nominee estimates his financial worth at one hundred and forty two million five hundred and twenty thousands (Kshs. 142, 520,000) in assets.

#### 3.1.8 Honors and Awards

53. Mr. Wachira received Bond Market Association award in December 2016.

#### 3.1.9 Published Writing

54. The nominee has published in scientific peer reviewed journals: -

Alex Wachira, Dr. Muchelule Yusuf, and Muchiri Albert Gakuru (2020), A framework Policy Governing Importation, Operations and Maintenance of Electric Cars in Kenya.



#### 3.1.10 Integrity

55. The nominee informed the Committee that he had never been mentioned adversely in any report by a Parliamentary Committee or an Independent Commission. He also confirmed that he had no previous conviction or an ongoing case in court and that he is a person of high integrity.

#### 3.1.11 Clearance Requirements

56. The Committee confirmed that the nominee had been cleared by KRA, ORPP, DCI, EACC and HELB, having obtained clearance certificates to that effect.

#### 3.1.12 Other issues under consideration

57. To examine suitability or otherwise of the nominee, the Committee posed questions to the nominee in the following thematic areas:

### 3.1.13 Nominees Response to Members' Questions

#### i. On the Cost of Electricity

- 58. The nominee enumerated the following measures on the reduction of the cost of electricity
  - a) Phasing out of thermal on account of higher unit cost as compared to other renewable sources,
  - b) Retirement of Muhoroni Gas Plant which uses 300, 0000 litres of Kerosene per day,
  - c) Increasing the capacity of the Olkaria to Western Kenya power line

#### ii. Access to Electricity

59. The nominee stated that he will work with key stakeholders to ensure 100% connectivity by 2027. He further said that he will pursue policies that will ensure equity in terms of access to power.

#### iii. Rural Electrification

60. The nominee also stated that he will the marching fund programme between County Governments and NGCDF and liaise with REREC to ensure connectivity in the shortest possible time. He also stated that in off grid areas he will promote renewable energy.

#### iv. Funding to the Sector

61. The nominee committed to liase with other development patners and use of PPPs for construction of power lines and other capital intensive projects. He also stated that he will encourage SAGAs to adopt alternative sources of income to generate additional revenue.

#### v. Renewable Energy

62. The nominee committed to initiate zero rating of solar panels

#### vi. On Innovations in the Sector

63. The nominee explained that he had published a paper on Electric Cars and will work with relevant stakeholders to ensure the innovation penetrates the market.

#### vii. On Enhancing the Performance of the Sector

64. The nominee pledged to establish a taskforce of key players in the sector to identify and pursue areas of synergy and cooperation to enhance efficiency.

#### viii. On Skewed Contracts by IPPs

65. The nominee committed to spearhead the review of the contracts to ensure that Kenyans get value for money. He further added that to avoid a scenario where huge amounts of money are paid for deemed generation, he will work towards ensuring efficiency in the construction of power lines such as the Loiyangalani-Suswa Power line.

#### ix. On Commissioning of Sub-stations

66. The nominee informed the Committee that he will prioritize the Commissioning of Mariakani, Isinya and Kibiko.

#### 3.1.14 Submission of Memoranda

67. The Committee received a total number of two (2) submissions, in support of the nominee's nomination. The memoranda were considered by the committee as required by provisions of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011. The memoranda received and the manner in which they were considered is summarized below-

#### a) Letter by Mr. Willie Njoroge

- 68. Mr. Willie Njoroge, Chief Executive, Kenya Association of Stockbrokers and Investment Bankers (KASIB) submitted a letter dated 7th November, 2022 addressed to the Committee Chair (Annexure 10). In the letter he observed that the nominee, Mr. Alex Wachira is a member of KASIB and represented the association I numerous engagements at the Capital Markets Bond Steering Committee. He further stated that the nominee is not only a strong team player but also a committed, diligent and a professional practitioner with vast knowledge of capital market matters. He further conveyed highest regards for the nominee.
- 69. Observation: Contrary to section 3(9) of the Act, the letter was not a written statement on oath. The letter was also not contesting the suitability of the candidate.

#### b) Letter by Mr. Geoffrey O. Odundo

- 70. Mr. Geoffrey Odundo, Chief Executive, Nairobi Securities Exchange Plc (NSE) submitted a recommendation on 7th November, 2022 (Annexure 11). In his recommendation he wished to confirm that the nominee has been a senior dealer with one of the licensed trading participants, Faida Investment Bank and that he is certified Automated Trading User by the NSE. He further stated that the nominee has been instrumental in the development of the Bonds market and is currently a member of a technical taskforce representing the Trading Participants at the Central Bank of Kenya Central depository Upgrade Project. He concluded by stating that the nominee is a dedicated professional of good standing in the listed securities market sphere. He further strongly recommended the appointment of the nominee.
- 71. **Observation:** Contrary to section 3(9) of the Act, the letter was not a written statement on oath. The letter was also not contesting the suitability of the candidate.

#### 3.2 Mr. Mohamed Liban

72. Mr. Liban was orally interviewed by the Committee and responded to questions during vetting as follows:

#### 3.2.1 Personal Background

 Mr. Mohamed Liban is a Kenyan citizen of identity card number 0076253 and was born in 1961, Isiolo County.

#### 3.2.2 Educational Background

- Mr. Liban holds a Masters of Public Health and Epidemiology from Kenyatta University awarded in 2005.
- 74. He graduated with a Diploma in Clinical Medicine and Surgery from KMTC in 1984. He joined the same institution for Higher Diploma in Ophthalmology graduating in 1989 and later advanced to International Diploma in Community Eye Health from London University in 1993. He thereafter specialized in Higher Diploma in Cataract Surgery (Intra-ocular lens implant surgery) from KMTC in 1995.

#### 3.2.3 Work Experience/Career Progression

- 75. Mr. Liban is currently the Chairperson, Ewaso Ngi'ro North Development Authority, Ministry of EAC & Regional Development, a position he has held since 2019.
- 76. Mr. Liban has also worked in the following capacities:
  - i.Regional Elections Co-ordinator Upper Eastern Region, Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC) from 2015 to 2017
  - ii.Regional Elections Co-ordinator, Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC)Upper North Eastern (Wajir and Mandera Region) from 2011 to 2015
  - iii.Regional Manager -Upper Eastern Region, Kenya Red Cross Society (KRCS) in 2009
  - iv.Regional Health Officer -Upper Eastern Region, Kenya Red Cross Society (KRCS) in 2008
  - v. Assistant Chief Clinical Officer, Ministry of Health (MOH) in 2009
  - vi.International Health Relation Officer in 2006
  - vii.Co-ordinator, Kenya Ophthalmic Program (KOP) 1998 to 1999

  - (ii) Construction of Isiolo Eye Unit.
  - (iii) Established and constructed regional and branch offices for Kenya Red Cross Society in Upper Eastern Region.
  - (iv) Integrated Primary Eye Care in Primary Health Care under the Ministry Of Health.
  - (v) He developed the curricula for Ophthalmic Clinical Officers and Nurses for the Kenya Medical Training College (KMTC)
  - (vi) Establishment of School Health programme in Isiolo County.

#### 3.2.6 Financial Net worth

- 80. The nominee's sources of income during the calendar year preceding his nomination and the current calendar year comprise of employment salary and allowance, income of Kshs five million (Kshs 5,000,000) in the year 2020/2021 and three million (Kshs 3,000,000) in the year 2021/2022.
- 81. The nominee estimates his financial worth at sixty million (Kshs 60, 00,000) in assets acquired.

#### 3.2.7 Integrity

82. The nominee informed the Committee that he had never been mentioned adversely in any report by a Parliamentary Committee or an Independent Commission. He also confirmed that he had no previous conviction or an ongoing case in court and that he is a person of high integrity.

#### 3.2.8 Published Writing

- 83. The nominee has published two articles:
  - i. A thesis, Kenyatta University, on Cataract Uptake in Merti Division, Isiolo District; and
  - Project on Increasing Coverage of Eye Care Services in Isiolo District- Institute of Human Resource Policy Manual 2021 Opthalmology, London

- 84. The nominee submitted copies of the following copies of policy statements of which he is a member:
  - i. Ewaso Ng'iro North Development Authority (ENNDA) Strategic Plan 2021/2022
  - ii. Ewaso Ng'iro North Development Authority (ENNDA) Human Resource Policy Manual 2021

#### 3.2.9 Conflict of Interest

85. The nominee has no immediate associations that are likely to present potential conflict of interest when he assumes the position.

#### 3.2.10 Clearance Requirements

86. The Committee confirmed that the nominee had been cleared by KRA, ORPP, DCI, EACC and HELB, having obtained clearance certificates to that effect.

#### 3.2.11 Other issues under consideration

87. To examine suitability or otherwise of the nominee, the Committee posed questions to the nominee in the following thematic areas:

#### 3.2.12 Nominees' Response to Members' Questions

#### i. On strategic Reserves

88. The nominee said owing to geo-political nature of the oil industry there is need for a national strategic reserve. He proposed that funds should be allocated to establish necessary infrastructure like storage tanks to sustain demand for up to 90 days.

#### ii. On Cost of Petroleum

89. The nominee acknowledged that the costing of petroleum products is determined by a number of factors such as international prices and taxes. To remedy this situation, the nominee undertook to pursue government to government negotiations in bulk purchase of petroleum products.

#### iii. On Petroleum Development Levy Fund

90. The nominee affirmed the need to liase with parliament to develop appropriate regulations due to the change of funds from the Ministry of Energy to the Ministry of Transport

#### iv. On Oil Marketing Companies

91. Exploitation of small/independent oil dealers by large oil marketers. The nominee proposed to initiate stringent measures through Energy and Petroleum Authority to regulate and ensure petroleum tariff review is adjusted to mitigate and ensure fairness to all industry players

#### v. On Proliferation of Petrol Stations in residential areas

92. The nominee undertook to collaborate with county government, the police and national government administration to control this trend.

#### vi. On Hoarding

93. The nominee informed the committee that he will spearhead a multi stakeholder approach in dealing with oil companies that engage in this malpractice.

#### vii. On Subsidies

94. The nominee addressed the economic implications of the subsidy and stated that it is costly and a short term solution.

#### viii. Open Tender System

- 95. The nominee assured the committee that he will spearhead the implementation of a more open system taking into account views of all stakeholders .He also committed to ensuring transparent procurement process.
  - ix. On Licensing of oil blocks
- 96. The nominee committed to ensure the enactment of policies on licensing of blocks that will give the country a higher bargaining power in oil prospects.
  - x. On National Oil Corporation of Kenya (NOCK)
- 97. The nominee undertook to carry out an audit of the operations of NOCK with a view to enhancing its capacity.
  - xi. Competitiveness of Petroleum Industry
- 98. The nominee noted that due to bureaucratic processes there is a shift of business from the Port of Mombasa to other ports along the East African Coast .In order to curb this trend, the nominee undertook to liaise with other stakeholders in ensuring efficiency in petroleum industry. He further committed to fast track the completion and operationalization of the Kisumu Jetty.

#### CHAPTER FOUR

#### 4.0 OBSERVATIONS AND FINDINGS

99. The Committee observations were guided by Article 155 of the Constitution, section 47 of the Public Service Act and section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No. 33 of 2011) in terms of issues for consideration as follows:

i.the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;

ii.any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and

iii.suitability of the nominees for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominees' abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is made.

100. The Committee made the following observations:

#### 4.1 Mr. Alex Kamau Wachira

- 101. The Committee held a meeting on Wednesday, 30th November, 2022 to deliberate on the approval hearings and observed the following:
  - i.THAT, in accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold dual citizenship;
  - ii.THAT, the academic credentials, and professional training and experience of the nominee is in accordance with the provisions of Section 6(7) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011;
  - iii.THAT, the nominee is currently serving as Head of Fixed Income Dealing at Faida Investment Bank;
  - iv.THAT, the nominee demonstrated vast experience of 12 years in improving institutional performance, driving innovations and transformation in previous positions;
  - v.THAT, the nominee satisfies the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity;
  - vi.THAT, the nominee has not been charged in a court of law or mentioned adversely in a Parliamentary Committee report or Commission of Inquiry;
  - vii.THAT, as stipulated in Article 75(1) of the Constitution, the nominee has no potential conflict of interest;
  - viii.THAT, the nominee satisfies the requirements of Article 77(1) of the Constitution in that he does not intend to participate in any other gainful employment;
    - ix.THAT, the nominee does not hold office in any registered political party hence satisfies the provisions of Article 77(2) of the Constitution;
    - x.THAT, the nominee has never been dismissed from office for contravention of the provisions of Articles 75(1) (conflict of interest), 76 (financial probity), 77 (restriction of State Officers) and 78(2) (dual citizenship) of the Constitution;



- xi.THAT, the Committees did not receive any written statements on oath (affidavit) with regard to the suitability or otherwise of the nominee:
- xii.THAT, the nominee was cleared by the Credit Reference Bureau, the Higher Education Loans Board, Directorate of Criminal Investigations, Kenya Revenue Authority and the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, therefore making him fit to hold public office as per the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution.

  - iii.THAT, the nominee served as Chairperson Ewaso Ngi'ro North Development Authority from May 2019 to May 2022;
  - iv.THAT, the nominee demonstrated vast experience of 38 years in improving institutional performance, driving innovations and transformation in previous positions;
  - v. THAT, the nominee satisfies the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity;
  - vi. THAT, the nominee has not been charged in a court of law or mentioned adversely in a Parliamentary Committee report or Commission of Inquiry;
  - vii. THAT, as stipulated in Article 75(1) of the Constitution, the nominee has no potential conflict of interest;
  - viii. THAT, the nominee satisfies the requirements of Article 77(1) of the Constitution in that he does not intend to participate in any other gainful employment;
  - ix. THAT, the nominee does not hold office in any registered political party hence satisfies the provisions of Article 77(2) of the Constitution;
  - x. THAT, the nominee has never been dismissed from office for contravention of the provisions of Articles 75(1) (conflict of interest), 76 (financial probity), 77 (restriction of State Officers) and 78(2) (dual citizenship) of the Constitution;







These were HIV/AIDS program in three slums of Meru, Blood Donor Services in Embu, Integrated Health Outreach Project [IHOP] in Garbatulla District and Sexual Reproductive Health in Merti District.

These projects were funded by Japan, Swedish and Netherlands Red Cross and implemented within the stipulated time frame and integrated within the Ministry of Health existing structures. IHOP has impacted positively by reducing mortalities among the mothers and children, and being cost effective it reduced the referral cases to Isiolo District Hospital thus reducing the congestion at the hospital.

# 1984 to 2007: Ministry of Health

As Senior Assistant Chief Clinical Officer (2007) at the Ministry of Health Headquarters in charge of Eastern, North Eastern and Coast Provinces in the management of Clinical Services, I discharged my duties effectively and honestly to Kenyans.

I also acted as a Deputy Chief Clinical Officer in the same year to assist Chief Clinical Officer in running comprehensive health care services on day to day issues.

As International Health Relation Officer (2006) at the Ministry of Health Headquarters, I assisted the Director of Medical Services on bilateral/multilateral health issues responsible for two continental health issues (USA and Middle East) in collaboration with WHO and Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Kenya. I discharged my duties effectively and professionally.

In between 1988-2005, I was appointed as National Primary Eye Care (PEC) Project Manager and integrated PEC into Primary Health Care components in 23 Districts by sensitizing and conducting workshops for District Health





Management Teams. The projects were supported jointly by the Ministry of Health and Kenya Society for the Blind /Sight Savers in collaboration with 17 other stakeholders in compacting blindness in Kenya.

I also acted as a Co-ordinator for Kenya Ophthalmic Program (KOP) between 1998 and 1999 while the Co-ordinator was away on study leave in UK. As in charge of PEC under KOP, I deputized the CoOrdinator as well.

As Senior Clinical Officer and Cataract Surgeon between 1989 and 1997, I was in charge of Isiolo District Eye Unit and discharged my duties diligently and passionately in delivering comprehensive eye care services in the Isiolo and neighboring districts of Meru and Samburu.

I established Isiolo Eye Unit at Isiolo District Hospital with support from Salus Oculi, a Germany-Based Organization by constructing eye clinic, male and female wards and a theatre. In addition, School Outreach Reach Program was initiated to enhancing child health in collaboration with the members of the District Health Management Team.

Between 1987 and 1989, I was posted to Madogo Health Centre in Tana River District from Garissa Provincial Hospital as in charge. My first posting from the Medical College to Garissa was in 1984 and served in different departments. I discharged my duties with utmost responsibilities of delivering comprehensive health care services.

I served in the following Hospitals either as a general clinician or as student on attachment; Eldoret, Machakos, Nakuru, Kenyatta National Hospital, Garissa and Kikuyu Eye Unit.
