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1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 Background and Introduction

The Auditor-General carried out a Special Audit on the Efficiency and Effectiveness of Covid-19 vaccines roll-out in Kenya. The Audit covered the period from inception of the vaccination exercise in March 2021 to 31 March, 2022. The primary objective of the audit was to determine the efficiency and effectiveness of the Covid-19 vaccines rollout in the Forty-Seven (47) Counties. This report, however, specifically covers the audit performed for the vaccine's rollout in Kisumu County. The audit involved review of budget, sources of the vaccines, storage, distribution, utilization and disposal of the vaccines, human resource, coordination of players and monitoring and supervision.

The Government of Kenya commissioned use of the Chanjo System to manage the vaccines rollout and used existing structures of immunization to roll out the Covid-19 Vaccines.

1.2 Audit Scope, Limitations and Mitigation

The audit reviewed all processes relating to Covid-19 vaccines immunization which included budgeting, administration, disposal of the expired stocks, the governance, and the monitoring structures.

Challenges experienced during the audit included lack of definition of most of the vaccinating facilities in the Chanjo System and inadequacy and incomplete vaccine inventory records. The Audit Team put in place several measures to mitigate the challenges including expanding the scope to near 100% coverage of the vaccinating facilities in the County.

1.3 Audit Approach and Methodology

The Audit exercise entailed planning, piloting of the vaccine roll-out audit in one of the Counties, before rolling out to the rest of the 47 Counties. Meetings were held with the auditee and evidence was collected through interviews, document reviews, Data Analytics,

analysis of audit evidence, among others. The audit was performed using International Standards of Supreme Auditing Institutions (ISSAIs).

1.4 Report Summary

1.4.1 Doses Received and Administered

Kisumu County received 644,495 doses of various types of vaccines during the period under review. Out of the total Covid-19 vaccine doses received in the County, 560,332 doses were administered, while 57,961 vaccine doses were still in stock as at the time of the audit cutoff date of 31 March, 2022. The balance of 26,212 vaccine doses comprised of 8,950 expired or wasted and an unexplained deficit variance of 17,262 doses as at 31 March, 2022.

1.4.2 Budget

A review of the Kisumu County health services budget for the financial year 2021/2022 revealed that the County did not budget for the Covid-19 vaccination activities but instead used the budget for routine immunization to cater for the rollout exercise.

1.4.3 Sources and Distribution of Vaccines

The Source of vaccines was from the Government of Kenya (GOK). These vaccines were received in Kisumu county through the Kisumu Regional Store.

The distribution flow was from the Regional store, to County store and Sub County stores to facilities which were administering the vaccines.

1.4.4 Storage of Vaccines

The Kisumu County Stores complied to some extend with the storages conditions which had been set out for Covid-19 Vaccines. However, weaknesses were noted in the storage facilities including inadequate storage equipment and monitoring tools.

1.4.5 Disposal of Vaccines

The Special Audit noted that a total of 8,950 Vaccine doses had expired, were damaged or had gone to waste. Out of 8,950 vaccine doses, 3,630 doses had been disposed together with other hospital waste while the balance of 5,320 had been returned to the County store.

1.4.6 Human Resource Matters

The financing for health care personnel was to be funded by the Government of Kenya, Donors and development partners. Kisumu County Management explained that their trainings were undertaken through the assistance of the development partners. However, there were no proper records or documentation maintained for the trainings undertaken or provided.

1.4.7 Coordination of Players

The coordination of the exercise was done by the Kisumu County Covid-19 Vaccine Deployment and Vaccination Taskforce. However, appointment letters and minutes of the taskforce were not provided for audit review.

1.4.8 Monitoring and Supervision

The Audit established that Covid-19 Vaccines roll out was monitored and supervised by a Committee to ensure smooth implementation of policies and guidelines issued from time to time by the National Government. However, the Committee did not keep minutes and attendance schedules to evidence the activities.

1.4.9 Conclusions and Recommendation

The audit concluded that the roll-out of the Covid-19 Vaccines was effective. However, weaknesses were noted in the processes including failure to budget for the rollout, failure to fully adhere to waste disposal regulations, inadequate training, inadequate staff, inadequate tablets to access the Chanjo System and failure to provide data bundles to the staff updating data in the System. This impacted on the real time recording of information

in the Chanjo System and resulting to an unexplained variance (deficit) of 17,262 vaccine doses valued at Kshs.23,944,550 based on the average Vaccine cost during the period.

The existing immunization structures for routine vaccines were functional but require scale up to handle unforeseen pandemics. Owing to the weaknesses noted it is recommended that the Kisumu County Government should work closely with the National Government to strengthen the existing immunization structures and staffing to meet international standards.

2.0 BACKGROUND AND INTRODUCTION

Kenya received its first consignment of Astra Zeneca- Oxford Covid-19 vaccine in March, 2021 as part of the COVAX facility. This was followed by more vaccines of Moderna, Johnson & Johnson (Janssen), Pfizer and Sinopharm from other development partners. The Ministry of Health (MOH) launched a campaign and kicked off deployment plan for the vaccines on 5th March, 2021, with priority given to frontline health workers and essential staff including security personnel. According to the National Covid-19 vaccine deployment plan, the first vaccine plan was developed in March 2021 and was subsequently revised by the MOH in August 2021 in an effort to cover the entire adult population in the country.

Kisumu County received its first consignment of Astra Zeneca-Oxford Covid-19 vaccine in April 2021, through the Kisumu Regional Vaccines Store. The vaccine doses were first administered at Jaramogi Oginga Odinga Hospital before being rolled out to the other facilities in the seven (7) Sub Counties. As of 31 March, 2022, the Special Audit team established that the County had received 644,495 vaccines doses as tabulated below:

2.1 Objective of the Audit

The primary objective of the audit was to determine the efficiency and effectiveness of the Covid-19 vaccine rollout in Kenya. This was to be achieved through; review of budget, sources of the vaccines, storage, distribution, utilization and disposal of the vaccines, human resource, coordination of players and monitoring and supervision.

2.2 Terms of Reference

2.3 Scope of the Audit and Limitations

2.3.1 Scope

The audit reviewed all processes from the inception of Covid-19 vaccines roll out, through budgeting to administration and disposal including the governance and monitoring structures. The period covered was from inception in March 2021 to 31 March, 2022.

2.3.2 Limitations

The Special Audit Team experienced challenges and limitations which were mitigated in several ways in order not to affect the quality and result of our findings. Some of the challenges and measures taken included:

- i) All the 90 vaccinating facilities in the county were not defined in the Chanjo System. The data was captured using the respective Sub County store. This called for 100% coverage of physical verification of records, stocks and visits to all facilities.
- ii) Inconsistent data as captured in the system verses actual on the ground. This called for 100% coverage of physical verification of records, stocks and visits to all facilities.
- iii) Under staffing at facilities. This was mitigated by allocating more time spent at the facilities.
- iv) Challenges in accessing the facilities due to poor road Network. This called for more hours spent by the team on the field visits.
- v) Vaccination undertaken at the facility level outside the Chanjo system. This was mitigated by corroborating the data in the physical ledgers with what was captured in the electronic ledger management information system (eLMIS).

2.4 Audit Approach and Methodology

The Special Audit Team held entry and exit meetings with the Kisumu County Health Management Team on 9 May, 2022 and 2 June, 2022 respectively. During the entry meeting, uniform and detailed work plans were developed and adopted which were then applied in the execution of the audit. The following were the main evidence gathering methods applied during the audit execution:

2.4.1 Document Review

To effectively plan for the audit and as a source of audit evidence, the Audit Team reviewed various documents including the vaccine, order sheets, vaccine stock ledgers, various training reports, outreaches, co-ordination activities and seizure/destruction forms.

2.4.2 Analytical Review

The Audit Team extracted the vaccine data from the Chanjo System and carried a comparative analysis with records at the regional stores and vaccinating facilities.

2.4.3 Physical Verification

The audit team carried out physical verification in Kisumu regional store, the 7 Sub County Stores and all 90 vaccinating facilities in Kisumu County as detailed in **Appendix 1**.

2.4.4 Interviews

The Audit Team interviewed senior officers from the Kisumu County Government to clarify the various issues and to assist in making an informed report as detailed below: -

2.5 Audit Phases

The audit was divided into Two Phases; Phase one involved review of processes at The National Treasury, Office of the Controller of Budget and Ministry of Health and an analysis of data maintained by eLMIS, Chanjo system and Kenya Health Information System. The information was shared with the audit Teams to inform the next phase.

Phase Two involved review of processes, data and verifications at regional office in Kisumu and vaccinating facilities in Kisumu County. This Phase also involved verification of samples already drawn in phase 1 and interview of staff.

2.6 Report Structure

The report should be read in its entirety in order to comprehend fully the approach to and findings of our work. The report has covered analysis and facts as understood with the aim of informing The National Treasury and The Ministry of Health of the status of the Vaccines Roll Out in the County, bearing in mind the challenges and limitations experienced.

3.0 DETAILED FINDINGS

3.1 Budget

3.1.1 Unconfirmed Funding of Covid-19 Vaccination Services

A review of the County's health services budget for the financial year 2021/2022 revealed that the county did not budget for the Covid-19 vaccination activities. Covid-19 vaccination costs including transportation, training and capacity building and procurement of auxiliary services such as syringes and safety boxes could not therefore, be traced to a specific budget, an indication that they were not budgeted for. This was contrary to Regulations 29(1) of the Public Finance Management (County Governments) Regulations, 2015 which require the accounting officer to ensure draft estimates relating to her or his department are prepared in conformity with the Constitution, the Act and these Regulations.

The Management however, indicated that the expenditures were met by Partner organizations, but this was not supported by way of any documentary evidence such as agreements.

3.1.2 Sources of Vaccines

The County received 644,495 vaccine doses between 27 April, 2021 and 31 March, 2022 from the National Government. A review of the County's Health Services Budget for the financial year 2021/2022 revealed that no vaccine roll out budget was provided for. Further, the Special Audit revealed the following anomalies as summarized in Table 3 below and detailed in Appendix 2:

3.2 Storage of Vaccines

According to World Health Organization (WHO) Guidelines (COVID-19 vaccination: supply and logistics guidance, 12 February, 2021) the COVID-19 vaccines should be stored as follows:

- Pfizer should be maintained at -80 °C to -60 °C in Ultra Low Temperatures (ULT) freezer, and for Undiluted thawed vaccine at +2 °C to +8 °C
- Moderna should be maintained at -25 °C to -15 °C in ULT freezer, and Unopened vials can be stored refrigerated between 2 °C to 8 °C for up to 30 days prior to first use.
- Oxford/AstraZeneca should be maintained at 2 °C to 8 °C
- Further, Centre for Disease Control (CDC) clinical guidance for Janssen COVID-19 Vaccine recommend storing of the vaccine at temperatures between 2°C and 8°C.

The storage conditions applied to the Regional, Sub- County and Facility Stores.

3.2.1 Storage at the Regional Store

A review of documents provided for audit and physical verification carried out at the Regional Store revealed the following:

- i. The building where the vaccines were stored had sufficient physical security to prevent loss/ pilferage of Covid-19 vaccines.

- ii. Precautions were implemented to prevent unauthorized persons from entering the storage areas.
- iii. Continuous temperature monitoring devices and systems had been installed and were verified to be in good working condition.
- iv. The store had sufficient capacity to orderly store the various categories of vaccines as well as handling of vaccines.
- v. All the vaccines at the cold rooms were stored off the floor as per the general storage requirements. This complies with Pharmacy and Poisons guidelines For Good distribution practices for medical products and health technologies in Kenya which state that Storage areas should be designed or adapted to ensure good storage conditions. In particular, they should be clean and dry and maintained within specified temperature and humidity limits. Medical products and health technologies should be stored off the floor and suitably spaced to permit cleaning and inspection. Pallets should be kept in a good state of cleanliness and repair.
- vi. The vaccines were issued on a first in, first out method guided by expiry. The store uses the FEO (First Expiry Out) method when dispatching the vaccines to the regional stores, sub-counties, or facilities.
- vii. The store had a contingency plan in case of power failure, equipment breakdown, or cold chain breach. In addition, the store has a backup generator in case of power failure, an emergency contacts list, security and fire contacts, and vaccines relocation sites.
- viii. The store was maintained at a temperature not exceeding 30 °C and relative humidity not exceeding 75% at all times, which is the generally accepted standard for storing vaccine storage conditions. The store had temperature monitoring devices that record the temperatures at every given time and send an alert in case the temperatures exceed the requirement.

- ix. The temperature monitoring is done at strategic locations and hot and cold spots identified from the temperature mapping process covering the stock containment areas. The data is recorded twice daily, and the records are maintained. These recordings are done morning and evening. In the event of temperature deviation outside the set standards and conditions, there were written procedures in the excursion response poster pinned on the store's walls on what should be done if a temperature alarm went off.

The Regional Store for the Covid-19 at Kenya Medical Supplies Agency in Kisumu was confirmed to have complied with the requirements in the Ministry of Health Standard Operating Procedures.

3.2.2 Storage at the Counties and Sub-Counties Stores

A review of documents provided for audit and physical verification carried out at the Kisumu County store and the Seven (7) Sub-Counties stores, revealed issues as detailed under **Appendix 3** and summarized in the table below:

From the foregoing, the Special Audit team confirmed that Kisumu County Stores and Kisumu Central Sub County Stores did not fully comply with storages conditions as per the Ministry of health Standard operating procedures.

3.2.3 Storage at the Facilities Level

A review of documents provided for audit and physical verification carried out at the 90 facilities revealed issues as summarised in the table 5 below detailed in **Appendix 4;**

3.3 Distribution of Vaccines

Distribution at County Level

Documents provided for audit revealed that Covid-19 Vaccines on arriving in the County ideally should be transferred to the Regional Stores where they are distributed to County Stores, to Sub- County Stores and Sub- County to Facilities. However, the ideal distribution was not the case on the ground as distribution occurred back and forth across different levels of stores and facilities.

The 644,495 vaccines received at the County Store as of 31 March, 2022 were distributed to the Sub County stores and Facilities as summarized below detailed in Appendix 5:

					administering facilities.

According to the National Policy Guidelines on Immunization, 2013, storage and transportation of vaccines and diluents, at all stages of vaccine transportation; a cold chain monitor must always accompany all vaccines whether in cold boxes, vaccine carriers or portable fridges and the temperature reading must be maintained between +2°C and +8°C, including age of conditioned ice packs. Diluents need not be transported at +2°C to +8°C unless they are being transported for outreach activities.

The distribution of the vaccines was mainly supported by the county government and donor partners. The main mode of transport was motor vehicles. However, discussion with persons in charge of facilities revealed that in some instances, the facilities were forced to collect the vaccines from the Sub County store using their personal means such as motorcycles and public vehicles. The vaccines were carried in cooler boxes with fridge tags to ensure that the vaccines were delivered in the required state.

3.4 Utilization of Vaccines

Ordinarily, Covid-19 vaccines flow through four levels before being administered; National Vaccine store (NVS), Regional Vaccine stores (RVS), Sub County Vaccine Stores and Health Facilities. Utilization of vaccines including Covid-19 vaccines takes place at vaccinating facility.

Examination of records maintained at the Regional Store and data maintained in the Chanjo System revealed that as at 31 March 2022, 3,390,610 doses of Covid-19 vaccines had been received at Kisumu Regional Store, out of which 664,495 doses were distributed to Kisumu County Store.

Analysis of data maintained in the Chanjo System and physical verification revealed that there were ninety (90) vaccinating facilities that were not mapped in the Chanjo System and were using credentials for their Sub County stores whenever they administered vaccines.

Out of the total 644,495 Covid-19 Vaccine Doses received in Kisumu County, a total of 560,332 doses were administered as per the Chanjo system. 57,961 Vaccine doses were still in stock while the balance of 8,950 was either expired, damaged- or wasted as at 31 March, 2022. However, there was an unexplained variance of 17,262 vaccine doses.

The unexplained vaccine doses of 17,262 from the Chanjo system and the physical count at the facility level is at variance with the cumulative unexplained variance of 155,110 vaccine doses as captured under **Appendix 6** at the facility level which is as a result of none recording of administered doses at the facilities.

The facilities in Kisumu were using the credentials of Sub Counties to record in the Chanjo System doses received and administered. Thus, even though the utilization report from the system reflected under the sub-Counties that 560,322 doses had been administered, only 216,648 doses had been updated against the respective facilities at the time of the audit as detailed under **Appendix 6** and summarized in the table below an indication that the updating of records in the system was not timely;

3.4.1 Administered Doses

These are doses which had been administered to the Kisumu County citizens from 01 March, 2021 to 31 March, 2022. A total of 560,322 doses had been administered as per distribution ledger report from the Chanjo System as indicated in Table7 above while the utilization report from the system reflected a total of 535,571 as summarized below:

¹The records pulled from the Chanjo Systems indicates 235 second vaccine dose for Janssen. It could not be established how a second dose of the Vaccine could be recorded in Chanjo System as it is a single dose vaccine.

A variance was also noted from the figures extracted in the Chanjo System's reports on cumulative statistics and distribution ledger.

3.4.2 Expired Doses

These are doses that had not been administered by the use- by date amounting to 8,081 doses, out of which 5,320 doses had not been disposed by the time of the Special Audit in May 2022 while the balance amounting to 3,630 had been disposed.

The Special Audit Team also noted that some of the vaccines were received only a few days to expiry as indicated in the table below:

3.4.3 Damaged Doses

These were vaccines that were not administered as the vaccine vials had been damaged. All damaged vaccines had been disposed off by the time of the special audit in May 2022.

3.4.4 Wasted Doses

These were vaccine doses that were not administered due to failure to utilize within the stipulated timelines upon opening of the vial. Out of 869 wasted doses none had not been disposed by the time of the Special Audit in May 2022.

3.4.5 Unexplained Vaccine Variance

Documents provided for audit revealed that 644,495 vaccine doses were received in the County. However, reconciliation of the vaccines received, administered, in stock, expired, damaged and wasted revealed an unexplained variance (deficit) of 17,262 doses valued at Kshs.23,944,550.

The following weakness observed during the audit that could have contributed to the unexplained deficit variance: -

- a. Failure by the County not to use Chanjo System to update vaccine records in the facilities
- b. Wastages not reported at the facilities,
- c. Vaccines doses utilized during the outreaches or in facilities not defined in the Chanjo System may not have been subsequently updated, and
- d. Vaccination data was not entered accurately, causing over-administration in some batches and under-administration in others.

3.5 Disposal of Vaccines

The Special Audit noted that a total of 8,950 Vaccine doses had expired, were damaged or had gone to waste. Out of 8,950 vaccine doses, 3,630 doses had been disposed together with other hospital waste while the balance of 5,320 had been returned to the County store.

A review of documents provided for audit revealed non-compliance with the disposal requirements as per Section 6.1 of the WHO Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) on waste management of COVID -19 vaccines vials and ancillary supplies. The procedure states that any used or discarded Covid-19 vaccine vials MUST be collected safely and separately from the rest of the waste. Both the empty vials and those with remaining vaccine doses discarded at the end of the daily vaccination activity shall be collected and safely stored until they are collected for final treatment and disposal. These vials should be counted and recorded by the responsible team for the purpose of vaccination activity analysis (e.g. utilization, coverage, wastage, etc.). Further, Section 6.6 provides that neutralized Covid-19 vaccine vials can be safely disposed in a manner that is not accessible or reusable, and neither being an environmental nor a health threat. The findings on disposal of vaccines are as summarized in Table 8 and detailed in **Appendices 8 and 9**.

The Audit team noted that the expired Vaccine vials had been collected from the 90 facilities and were being held up in the same room as Other useable vaccines at the Sub County stores. No official communication was available regarding collecting of the expired Covid-19 vaccine vials from different facilities by the Sub-Counties.

The County had five incinerators at Lumumba, Kombewa, JOOTRH and KCRH, of which only 1 Located at Lumumba Hospital was functioning. The capability and effectiveness the of Kisumu County government to collect and dispose of Sharps safely is not satisfactory.

The county presented an S1 serial No. 060499 dated 5/04/2022 which was half-filled by the county government for delivering sharps to Agrochemicals and Foods company, based at Muhoroni for disposal. No contract between the County government and Agrochemicals

& Foods company for incineration and disposal of sharps was availed to ascertain the terms and conditions, nor the resultant costs.

Section 8.7.1 of the National Guideline for safe management of Healthcare waste of 2011 requires that storage times of healthcare wastes should not exceed 48 hours during the cool season, unless refrigerated.

Delay of collection of wastes by the county Government leads to accumulation of sharp boxes in the facilities, which encourage the burning of sharps with regular waste. The audit team noted one facility where burns sharps with regular waste.

Instances of contravention of guidelines on separation of wastes, including failure to use standard colour codes (as specified in annexe 2 and 3 of the National Guideline for safe management of Health care waste of 2011) and use of rigid buckets without liners were noted 9 Facilities. In the 9 facilities, there was no clear labelling of waste buckets which may have led to mixing of waste.

The audit team also noted that burning pits in 2 facilities were flooded and could not perform the intended disposal function.

Based on the above contraventions, the audit team could not ascertain if wastes generated from the Covid-19 vaccines were correctly disposed.

3.6 Human Resource Matters

Training at County Level

The health care workers were to be trained and were required to be competent on; knowledge on Covid-19 disease; knowledge and skills in Covid-19 Vaccine demand creation, health facility preparation, safe vaccine administration, infection control practices, patient data management, adverse event reporting and management, documentation and monitoring of vaccine utilization and logistics, communication, waste management, mental health and multi-disciplinary teamwork.

According to the National COVID-19 Vaccines Deployment and Vaccination Plan dated February 2021, the training of health workers was to be organized in 3 phases. Phase 1 was for level 4-6 health facilities and was done through blended online/virtual training and face-to-face demonstration. The phase 1 trainings were to be recorded for later use in phase phases 3 and used to undertake TOT training. The 3 phases of trainings are summarized in the table below and detailed under **Appendices 10 and 11**:

3.7 Coordination of Players

A review of documents provided for audit at the Counties, Sub-Counties and Facilities revealed anomalies as summarized below and detailed in Appendices 12, 13 and 14.

From the foregoing, the coordination of various players in Covid-19 Vaccine roll out may not have complied with coordination of outreaches since no proper records of vaccines

issued to the facilities and returns were kept at the facilities. The health workers across the 7 Sub Counties had not received allowances for some of the outreach programs sponsored by Word Bank.

3.8 Monitoring and Supervision

Monitoring and Supervision at the County and Facilities Level

A review of documents provided for audit at the various levels of COVID – 19 management at the County revealed anomalies as detailed under **Appendices 15, 16 and 17** and summarized in the table below;

4.0 IRREGULARITIES AND WEAKNESSES IN MANAGEMENT AND INSTITUTIONS CONTROLS OF VACCINES

5.0 CONCLUSION

The objective of the Special Audit was to determine the efficiency and effectiveness of the Covid-19 Vaccine roll out in Kisumu County. Following the findings, the County should ensure that all Vaccinating facilities are defined in the Chanjo System and effective supervision of the activities at the County, Sub County and facilities on all matters relating to Vaccines receipts, issues and utilization. The above weaknesses resulted in an unexplained variance (deficit) of 17,262 Vaccine doses valued at Kshs.23,944,550 based on the average Vaccine cost during the period.

The County should also adhere to the cold chain and supply logistics guidelines as issued by WHO and MOH. In order to meet the increasing demand for health service, there is need to continuously assess the adequacy of health workers and build their capacity for effective service delivery to the Residents of Kisumu County.
