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(ii) Guidance on consideration of the Budget Estimates For FY 2023/2024

- 1. Honourable Members, Article 221 of the Constitution as read together with section 39 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, requires the National Assembly to consider the Estimates of Revenue and Expenditure of the National Government, Parliament and the Judiciary for each financial year. These Estimates, once approved by the National Assembly, form the basis for the annual Appropriation Act.
- 2. Honourable Members, as you may be aware, the Estimates have since been submitted and tabled before the National Assembly as required by law. Consequently, and pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 235, the Estimates now stand committed to respective Departmental Committees to consider and make recommendations to the Budget and Appropriations Committee within twenty-one (21) days. The Departmental Committees are required to engage with the relevant stakeholders to ensure the participation of all players in the process.
- 3. Honourable Members, it should be noted that the Budget and Appropriations Committee is required to discuss and review the Budget Estimates, and make recommendations to the House, taking into account the recommendations of the Departmental Committees, the views of the Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury, and the general public.
- 4. Honourable Members, noting the importance of the budget-making process, the respective Committees are required to urgently commence the consideration of the Estimates. I am aware that the Clerk has made appropriate arrangements to facilitate Committees to carry out this mandate. Indeed, Members will note that the House is scheduled to proceed for recess this week to allow Committees to embark on this activity. I therefore encourage Members to actively participate in the exercise to ensure that their views and those of their electorate are incorporated in the final national budget. The House is accordingly guided. I thank you!

6. **NOTICE OF MOTION**

The following Notice of Motion was given -

First Aid Training as a core subject in Schools

THAT, aware that first-aid training is a key component of Emergency Medical Response (EMR); further aware that first-aid response promotes a safer and healthier community by ensuring reducing accidents and injuries; noting that lack of first-aid training and skills among the general public has contributed to the aggravation of preventable injuries and accidents which, in some cases, has led to loss of lives; further noting that the current education system does not include first-aid training as a compulsory subject in the curriculum which deprives students of essential knowledge and skills necessary for their personal safety and that of persons around them; acknowledging that it is critical to equip students with the ability to assess and handle day-to-day emergencies in schools and at home; now therefore, this House urges the National Government through the Ministry of Education to develop and implement a comprehensive first-aid curriculum for schools across the country.

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7. <u>REQUEST FOR GENERAL STATEMENT PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF</u> <u>STANDING ORDER 43</u>

The Member for South Mugirango (Hon. Sylvanus Osoro) requested for a General Statement regarding closure of Nduru Level 5 Hospital in South Mugirango Constituency, Kisii County and its devastating impact on the residents of Kisii.

He noted that it was disheartening to note that the said hospital, which was built by the government in partnership with the World Bank, had been closed for almost three weeks causing immense suffering to the people of Kisii County. He expressed concerns that the closure resulted when on 12th April 2023, the county government sought to transfer medical equipment from the hospital to a different health care facility but members of the local community protested the move by the county government to transfer equipment outside of the sub-county. This incident resulted in some of the medical personnel being injured and subsequently led to the closure of the hospital due to safety concerns. As a result, the other medics at the hospital downed their tools and the facility was closed indefinitely.

He added that whereas the national government acted swiftly in restoring security, the hospital remains inoperable. This had adversely affected the most vulnerable, who have a difficult time accessing healthcare services.

The Member implored the county government to prioritize the healthcare and take prompt action to address the hospital's prolonged closure
