1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 Introduction

1.1.1 The Ethics and Anti – Corruption Commission requested the Auditor- General for a forensic audit on allegations of irregular payment of daily subsistence allowances amounting to Kshs.13 million made to Members of the County Assembly (MCAs) of Homa Bay and staff of the County Assembly through a letter Ref: EACC.KSI.6/15/43 Vol.II/ (56) dated 25 March, 2022.

1.2 Audit Objective

1.2.1 The primary objective of the forensic audit was to confirm or dispel allegations on alleged irregular payment of conference facilities and daily subsistence allowances to Members of the County Assembly and County Assembly staff of Homa Bay County for a report writing retreat held in Mombasa.

1.3 Terms of Reference

1.3.1 The Terms of Reference of the forensic audit were to review the County Assembly's Budget and budgetary controls, procurement related issues on hire of conference facilities, and financial management and related issues on the report writing retreat on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney.

1.4 Scope of Work and Limitations

- 1.4.1 The forensic audit was limited to alleged irregular payment of daily subsistence allowances amounting to Kshs.13 million made to the Members of County Assembly (MCAs) and the staff of Homa Bay County Assembly in September, 2021. The audit covered the financial year 2021/2022.
- 1.4.2 Some of the challenges experienced by the Audit Team included;
 - i) Inability by the Audit Team to interview forty- two (42) Members of the County Assembly who were involved in report writing on vetting of nominees of positions of Chief Officers and the County Attorney and three (3) staff of the Mombasa Continental Resort.
 - ii) Failure by the Management of Homa Bay County Assembly to provide requisite documents including schedules and programme of activities.

iii) Failure by the Management of EACC and Homa Bay County Assembly to provide Bank statements for EACC's Asset Recovery Account and the Assembly's CBK account where refunds for the retreat were banked, respectively.

1.5 Audit Approach and Methodology

1.5.1 The Audit Team held entry and exit meetings with the Homa Bay County Assembly Management Team on 14 September, 2022 and 20 September, 2022 respectively. The Audit Team collected evidence through document reviews, analytical reviews, interviews among others.

1.6 Report Summary

Budgets and Budgetary Controls

Approved Budget and Budgetary Allocation for Financial Year 2021/2022

- 1.6.1 The hire of conference facilities, daily subsistence and travel allowances paid to Members of County Assembly (MCAs) and County Assembly staff were budgeted for in the Homa Bay County Assembly Service Board's recurrent budget for the financial year 2021/2022 amounting to Kshs.1,029,394,205.
- 1.6.2 The hire of conference facilities was factored in the approved procurement plan for the financial year 2021/2022 under the item hire of conference facility at a total cost of Kshs.2,500,000.

Procurement Related Issues

Need Analysis for Hire of Conference Facilities

- 1.6.3 Section 45 of the County Governments Act, 2012 stipulates that the Governor shall nominate qualified and experienced County Chief Officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board and with the approval of the County Assembly, appoint County Chief Officers
- 1.6.4 In this regard, the County Secretary vide letter referenced HB/CTY/CA/VOL.X/(42) dated 5 July, 2021 forwarded to the Speaker of the

- County Assembly, seven (7) nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney for seven (7) County Government's departments.
- 1.6.5 On 6 September, 2021, the Chairpersons of the selection Committees from the seven (7) departments wrote to the Clerk of the Homa Bay County Assembly requesting for facilitation for nine (9) days for a report writing exercise in Mombasa from 7 September, 2021 to 15 September, 2021.

Review of Approved Procurement Plan for Hire of Conference Facilities

- 1.6.6 Although the procurement plan for hire of Conference facilities was factored in the approved procurement plan for the financial year 2021/2022, review of documents provided for audit revealed that there was no justification why report-writing exercise was held in a Mombasa hotel and not in a facilities within Homa Bay County. This was contrary to Section VI of the Treasury Circular No. 20/2015 dated 4 November, 2015 that requires the Accounting Officer to ensure that all workshops and retreats with majority of participants drawn from one duty station are held within the precincts of the duty station.
- 1.6.7 In view of the above, the Homa Bay County Assembly incurred Kshs.13,263,600 by holding the conference in Mombasa as opposed to Kshs.1,131,000 which would have been incurred on sitting allowances to MCAs if the meeting was held within the precincts of the duty station resulting to a lost saving of Kshs.12,132,600.

Procurement of Conference Facilities

- 1.6.8 Three hotels namely Mombasa Continental Resort, Serena Beach Resort & SPA and Pride Inn Flamingo, all in Mombasa were invited to quote for the provision of full day conference services. It was therefore, not clear how the Management identified Mombasa as the only location for the Conference.
- 1.6.9 The Homa Bay County Assembly issued Local Service Order No.1883194 dated 7 September, 2021 to Mombasa Continental Resort for provision of full day conference services for seventy (70) persons for five (5) days at a total cost of Kshs.1,050,000. However, the schedule of the seventy (70) persons was not provided for audit review.

Financial Management and Related Issues

Actual Attendance by the MCAs and County Assembly Staff

- 1.6.10 The request dated 6 September, 2021, by the Chairpersons of the selection Committees from seven (7) departments contained the number of MCAs who were to be facilitated for the conference, except for the Education and ICT departments which did not provide the details. Further, the schedule of County Assembly staff who were to accompany the seven (7) Committees to Mombasa was also not provided for audit review.
- 1.6.11 In the circumstances, the Audit Team could not ascertain the actual number of MCAs and County Assembly staff who were to be facilitated to attend the report writing exercise in Mombasa.
- 1.6.12 On 06 September, 2021, the Clerk approved the requests by the Chairpersons of the selection Committees from the seven (7) departments. Eighty- eight (88) persons comprising of fifty-one (51) MCAs and thirty-seven County (37) County Assembly staff were issued with per diems/daily subsistence allowances amounting to Kshs.12,213,600. However, the Audit Team could not establish the roles of the thirty- seven (37) County Assembly staff and thereby the need for daily subsistence and travel allowances amounting to Kshs. 4,787,600 issued to the staff.
- 1.6.13 In addition, no explanation was provided why a total of eighty-eight (88) persons were issued with imprest amounting to Kshs.12,213,600 when procurement of conference facilities was for seventy (70) persons. Further, there was no evidence provided for audit by Management of the County Assembly requesting the Hotel for additional conference facilities to accommodate the additional eighteen (18) persons.
- 1.6.14 Out of the Kshs.12,213,600 subsistence and travel allowances paid, Kshs.11,146,400 was paid to seventy-eight (78) persons through the Integrated Financial Management Information System (IFMIS) whereas the balance of Kshs.1,067,200 was paid to ten (10) persons outside IFMIS.
- 1.6.15 The explanation provided was that the ten (10) persons did not have payroll numbers as at the time of the imprest request. However, during the audit in

- September 2022, the Audit Team confirmed that three (3) out of the ten (10) persons had payroll numbers which were acquired in 2017 and in 2019 contrary to the explanation. The status of the remaining seven (7) payroll numbers could not be confirmed.
- 1.6.16 The Clerk approved imprest for a total of nine (9) days comprising of five (5) working days in Mombasa and four (4) travelling days for each person from Homa Bay to Mombasa and back to Homa Bay. However, the Audit Team established that the MCAs and County Assembly staff were entitled to eight (8) days being daily subsistence allowances for five (5) days and three (3) days for travelling from Homa Bay to Mombasa and back resulting to an overpayment of Kshs.1,170,400.
- 1.6.17 Review of attendance registers for the period 8 September, 2021 to 12 September,2021 provided for audit review revealed that the total number of MCAs and County Assembly staff who attended the report writing on vetting exercise and signed attendance registers varied between sixty-seven (67) persons and seventy-three (73) persons.
- 1.6.18 The Audit Team could not ascertain whether twenty-three (23) persons out of eighty-eight (88) persons who were paid imprest totaling Kshs. 2,425,200 but did not sign the attendance registers on various dates, actually attended the report writing retreat on those dates.
- 1.6.19 There was no documentary evidence in form of a plan or programme of activities that were undertaken by each Committee for the five (5) days in Mombasa.
- 1.6.20 In the circumstances, the Audit Team could not ascertain the actual number of MCAs and County Assembly staff who attended report writing retreat in Mombasa and the nature of daily activities that were undertaken by the Committees during those days.

Payment to Mombasa Continental Resort for the Conference

1.6.21 As noted earlier, Homa Bay County Assembly issued Local Service Order No.1883194 dated 7 September, 2021 to Mombasa Continental Resort for provision of conference services for seventy (70) persons for a period of five (5)

- days from 08 September, 2021 to 12 September, 2021 at a total cost of Kshs.1,050,000.
- 1.6.22 Mombasa Continental Resort raised an undated invoice No. 26585 amounting to Kshs.1,050,000 to the Homa Bay County Assembly for provision of conference facilities package for seventy (70) persons at the rate of Kshs. 3,000 per person per day, for five days. No explanation was provided on why the invoice was not dated.
- 1.6.23 The Kshs.1,050,000 was paid in two instalments through payment voucher No. 625 dated 07 September, 2021 for Kshs.390,000 and payment voucher No. 629 dated 10 September, 2021 for Kshs.660,000 respectively.
- 1.6.24 The Audit Team, through the Clerk of the County Assembly, made several attempts to engage the Hotel Management and to review records maintained relating to the report writing exercise. However, there was no response from both the County Assembly and hotel Management.

Irregularities in Management and Payment of Conference Facilities and Daily Subsistence Allowances

- 1.6.25 The payment voucher for Kshs.1,050,000 paid to Mombasa Continental Resort provided by Management of the County Assembly lacked detailed analysis of expenditure incurred and supporting documents, including the daily expenditure schedules indicating number of persons who were attended to and services offered to them.
- 1.6.26 The Homa Bay County Assembly did not maintain an updated imprest registers. As a result, the total imprest amounting to Kshs.12,213,600 issued to fifty- one (51) MCAs and thirty -seven (37) County Assembly staff was not recorded in the imprest registers.
- 1.6.27 The Audit Team noted that MCAs and County Assembly staff accounted for imprest using claims for travel and subsistence allowance vouchers instead of payment voucher and imprest surrender form outlined in Section 12.0 of the Homa County Assembly's Financial Management Policy, 2020.

- 1.6.28 All the claims for travel and subsistence allowances vouchers amounting to Kshs.12,213,600 provided for audit were not examined by the accountant for completeness and accuracy and were not authorized by the AIE holder as actual expenditure contrary to Section 6.6.4 (c) of the Homa Bay County Assembly's Financial Management Policy, 2020.
- 1.6.29 Further, the claims for travel and subsistence allowances vouchers were not supported by approved invitation/ facilitation letters, attendance registers/sheets, Agenda/Program, travel documents, approved work tickets, back to office reports and Certificates (in case of training) contrary to Section 6.6.5 (5) of the Homa Bay County Assembly's Financial Management Policy, 2020.

Refund of Imprest for Report Writing Exercise in Mombasa

- 1.6.30 On 4 February, 2022, the EACC vide letter reference EACC.KSI 6/16/43 Vol II (15) wrote to the Clerk of the Homa Bay County Assembly stating that there were irregular payments made to MCAs and staff during report writing for vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney in Mombasa. EACC further, stated that those willing to make the necessary refunds have to deposit the money in the Commission's Asset Recovery Account held at Kenya Commercial Bank Ltd and the Clerk was to forward to the Commission, proof of all such deposits.
- 1.6.31 As at 22 September, 2022, a total of twenty-five (25) MCAs and five (5) County Assembly staff had refunded a total of Kshs.1,559,500 comprising of Kshs.1,413,500 and Kshs.146,000 to the EACC's Asset Recovery Account held at Kenya Commercial Bank Limited and at Homa Bay County Assembly CBK's account respectively. However, based on the documents provided, the Audit Team computed Kshs.3,958,300 in respect of expected refunds from various persons resulting to Kshs.2,398,800 as outstanding refunds.
- 1.6.32 The Kshs.3,958,300 comprised of Kshs.3,385,600 on computed refunds and Kshs.572,700 on variances between recorded refunds of Kshs. 338,800 and actual refunds of Kshs.911,500 from eighteen (18) persons. The Kshs.572,700 is considered as self-confirmed evidence of additional unspent balances which supersedes computed refunds.

1.7 Irregularities, Weaknesses and Management Responsibility

1.7.1 Irregularities and weaknesses observed during the audit and the corresponding recommendations are as follows;

1.8 Conclusion

- 1.8.1 The objective of the forensic audit was to confirm or dispel allegations on irregular payment of conference facilities and daily subsistence allowances to MCAs and County Assembly staff for report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney.
- 1.8.2 The need for vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney arose following compliance with Section 45 of the County Governments Act, 2012 which stipulates that the Governor shall nominate qualified and experienced County Chief Officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board.
- 1.8.3 Eighty-eight (88) persons comprising of fifty-one (51) MCAs and thirty-seven (37) County staff were paid Kshs.12,213,600 for daily subsistence and travel allowances and Kshs 1,050,000 was paid for hire of conference services in Mombasa, all totaling to Kshs.13,263,600. No justification was provided by the Management why the retreat was not held in compliance with the Treasury Circular No. 20/2015.
- 1.8.4 Anomalies noted by the Audit Team included;
 - Failure to hold report writing retreats in accordance with Section VI of Treasury Circular No. 20/2015,
 - ii) Failure to provide details of the seventy (70) persons the conference facilities was procured for,
 - iii) Overpayment of daily subsistence allowances by Kshs.1,170,400 for nine (9) days instead of eight (8) days,
 - iv) Issuing imprest to some MCAs and County Assembly staff outside IFMIS System,
 - Payment of Kshs.2,425,200 to persons who did not sign the attendance registers,
 - vi) Failure to maintain an updated imprest registers,
 - vii) Absence of supporting documents and
 - viii)Outstanding imprest refunds amounting to Kshs. 2,398,800.

2. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

2.1 Introduction

- 2.1.1 Section 9 (1) (a) of The Public Audit Act, 2015 states that the Auditor-General, or an officer authorized for the purpose of the Act, shall have powers to conduct investigations on her own initiative, or on the basis of a complaint made by a third party.
- 2.1.2 The Ethics and Anti Corruption Commission requested the Auditor- General for a forensic audit on allegations of irregular payment of daily subsistence allowances amounting to Kshs.13 million made to Members of the County Assembly (MCAs) of Homa Bay and staff of the County Assembly through a letter Ref: EACC.KSI.6/15/43 Vol.II/ (56) dated 25 March, 2022

2.2 Background

- 2.2.1 Article 176 of the Constitution, 2010 establishes the County Assemblies which consist of members elected by the registered voters of the Wards. The County Assembly is the Legislative arm of the County Government responsible for formulation of any Laws that are necessary for, or incidental to the effective performance of the County Government. According to Article 185(3) of the Constitution, the County Assembly, while respecting the principles of separation of powers, may exercise oversight over the County Executive Committee and any other County Executive organs.
- 2.2.2 The Homa Bay County Assembly is headed by the Speaker and a total of 60 MCAs comprising of forty (40) elected MCAs and twenty (20) nominated MCAs. The County Assembly has ten (10) sectoral Committees and fifteen (15) select Committees as shown in Table 1 and Table 2 respectively:

- 2.2.3 Six (6) sectoral Committees and one (1) select committee were involved in report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of six (6) Chief Officers and the County Attorney in Mombasa between 08 September, 2021 and 12 September, 2021 are as listed below:
 - i) Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries, Food Security and Cooperative Development
 - ii) Education and ICT
 - iii) Energy and Mining
 - iv) Lands, Housing, Physical Planning and Urban Development
 - v) Roads, Transport and Public Works
 - vi) Trade, Industrialization and Enterprise Development
 - vii) Justice, Legal Affairs and Cohesion

2.3 Objective of the audit

2.3.1 The primary objective of the forensic audit was to confirm or dispel allegations on alleged irregular payment of conference facilities and daily subsistence allowances to Members of the County Assembly and County Assembly staff of Homa Bay County for a report writing retreat held in Mombasa.

2.4 Terms of Reference

2.4.1 The Audit Team was guided by the following Terms of Reference (TORs).

Budget and Budgetary Controls

- Review the approved budget and budgetary process for hire of conference facilities and daily subsistence allowances for report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney for the financial year 2021/2022.
- Establish the budgetary allocation during the financial year 2021/2022 for hire
 of conference facilities and daily subsistence allowances for report writing on
 vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney for
 Members of County Assembly and County Assembly staff and note any
 changes.

 Compare the hire of conference facilities and daily subsistence allowances for report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney in the approved procurement plan and approved budget for financial year 2021/2022 and note any variance.

Procurement Related Issues

- Establish whether there was need for procurement of conference facilities for report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney by the Homa Bay County Assembly.
- Review approved procurement plan for hire of conference facilities for report
 writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County
 Attorney and establish whether it was captured in the County Assembly's
 approved procurement plan and approved annual budget for the financial year
 2021/2022.
- Establish whether procurement of conference facilities for report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney was done within the laid down procurement laws and regulations.

Financial Management and Related Issues

- Confirm existence of the trip and actual attendance by Members of the County Assembly and County Assembly staff.
- Determine whether there were unbudgeted for, misclassified, unsupported and unrecorded amounts within the hire of conference facilities and payment of daily subsistence allowances for report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney.
- Establish whether the payment of conference facilities and daily subsistence allowances for report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney was in line with laid down accounting procedures or processes.
- Determine whether there were any irregularities in management and payment of conference facilities and daily subsistence allowances for report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney.

2.5 Scope of Work and Limitations

Scope

2.5.1 The forensic audit was limited to alleged irregular payment of daily subsistence allowances amounting to Kshs.13 million made to the Members of County Assembly (MCAs) and the staff of Homa Bay County Assembly in September, 2021. The audit covered financial year 2021/2022.

Limitation and mitigation

- 2.5.2 The Audit Team experienced challenges and limitations which were mitigated in several ways in order not to negatively affect the quality and result of the findings. The challenges included;
 - Forty- two (42) Members of the County Assembly who were involved in report writing on vetting of nominees of positions of Chief Officers and the County Attorney were no longer in office as detailed in **Appendix I.** It was therefore difficult to interview them.
 - ii) Three (3) staff namely the Manager, the Accountant and Chairperson of the Mombasa Continental Resort that provided conference facilities could not be interviewed since were no longer in office.
 - iii) The Audit Team relied on the documents provided by the Management including the conference attendance registers/lists. The Audit Team did not have a signature expert to confirm the authenticity of the respective signatures in the attendance registers/lists.
 - iv) Failure by the Management to provide the following documents:
 - A schedule of seventy (70) persons expected to attend a conference for five (5) days at Mombasa Continental Resort
 - Programme of activities that were to be undertaken by each Committee for the five (5) days in Mombasa.
 - Supporting documents including the daily expenditure schedules for the Kshs.1.050,000 paid to the Mombasa Continental Resort

- Supporting documents including Agenda/Program of activities for the Kshs. 12,213,600 imprest surrenders.
- Bank statements for EACC's Asset Recovery Account and Homa Bay County Assembly CBK's account where refunds for the retreat were banked.
- 2.5.3 To mitigate challenges i to iii, the Audit Team relied on documentary evidence provided by the Management. However, challenges number iv remained unmitigated.

2.6 Audit Approach and Methodology

- 2.6.1 The Audit Team held entry and exit meetings with the Homa Bay County Assembly Management Team on 14 September, 2022 and 20 September, 2022 respectively. In addition, the team held two more meetings with the Management Team from EACC on 12 September, 2022 and 22 September, 2022 respectively. During the entry meetings, the audit strategies were discussed and adopted which were then applied in the execution of the audit.
- 2.6.2 The Audit Team adopted the following approach and methodology in evidence gathering, analysis and reporting.

Document Review

2.6.3 The Audit Team reviewed documents which included County Governments Act, 2012, Public Finance Management Act, 2012, Public Finance Management (County Governments) Regulations 2015, Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015 and Regulations 2020, Homa Bay County Assembly 's approved budget for the financial year 2021/2022, IFMIS generated Vote book for the financial year 2021/2022, Homa Bay County Assembly Financial Management Policy, Homa Bay County Assembly Transport Policy, cash books, bank statements and IFMIS generated imprest and payroll records, payment vouchers, Vetting Committees Reports, Hansard reports of County Assembly's Plenary among other documents.

Analytical Review

2.6.4 Information and records from Finance and Procurement departments and the Clerk's office at Homa Bay County Assembly and EACC, South Nyanza Regional Office in Kisii were analyzed and results used to arrive at conclusions.

Interviews

2.6.5 The Audit Team interviewed six (6) senior officers from Homa Bay County Assembly and the lead investigator for EACC – South Nyanza Regional Office on 20 September, 2022 to clarify various issues to assist in making an informed report as listed in Table 3.

- 2.6.6 The Audit Team intended to interview the Management of the Mombasa Continental Resort. However, our request made through the Clerk of the County Assembly on various dates was not responded to.
- 2.6.7 The evidence obtained through various approaches and methodologies were further analyzed, authenticated and corroborated before being used as evidence in this report.

2.7 Report Structure

- 2.7.1 This report is presented in the following format:

- 2.7.2 The report should be read in its entirety in order to comprehend fully the approach to and findings of our work. The report covers analysis and facts as understood with the aim of informing the Ethics and Anti- Corruption Commission on status of alleged irregular payment for hire of conference facilities and daily subsistence allowances for report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney by Homa Bay County Assembly bearing in mind the challenges and limitations experienced.

3. DETAILED FINDINGS

3.1 Budgets and Budgetary Controls

Budgetary Process

- 3.1.1 Section 12 (1) of the County Governments Act, 2012 states that there shall be a County Assembly Service Board for each County Assembly. Further, Section 12, Sub Section 7(c) states that the County Assembly Service Board is responsible for preparing annual estimates of expenditure of the County Assembly Service and submitting them to the County Assembly for approval, and exercising budgetary control over the Service.
- 3.1.2 The Homa Bay County Assembly considered and approved budget estimates of the County Assembly Service Board for the financial year 2021/2022 amounting to Kshs.1,151,678,005 made up of recurrent and development votes of Kshs.1,029,394,205 and Kshs.122,283,800 respectively in accordance with section 131 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, which stipulates that County Assembly shall consider the County Government budget estimates with a view to approving them.

Approved Budget and Budgetary Allocation for Financial Year 2021/2022

3.1.3 The hire of conference facilities and daily subsistence allowances paid to Members of County Assembly (MCAs) and County Assembly staff who were involved in report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of six (6) Chief Officers and the County Attorney were budgeted for under the County Assembly Service Board's recurrent budget amounting to Kshs.1,029,394,205 under Vote Head 5123000500- Committee Services amounting to Kshs.28,500,000 as summarized in the Table 4.

3.1.4 The hire of conference facilities expenditure of Kshs.1,050,000 was included in the approved budget for Committee Services under sub vote 2210802- Boards, Committees, Conferences and Seminars amounting to Kshs.3,500,000.

Comparison of Approved Procurement Plan and Approved Budget for Hire of Conference Facilities for Report Writing on Vetting of Nominees for Positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney.

3.1.5 Review of the approved Procurement Plan for the financial year 2021/2022 revealed that conference facilities was planned for in the first quarter of the financial year as summarized in the **Table 5**.

3.1.6 The Audit Team established that the hire of conference facilities for report writing on vetting of nominees for the positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney amounting to Kshs.1,050,000 was within the approved procurement plan of Kshs.2,500,000. In addition, the procurement plan was within the County Assembly Service Board's approved recurrent budget for Committee Services (Hospitality Supply and Services) –item/ service code 2210802, Boards, Committees, Conferences and Seminars amounting to Kshs.3,500,000.

3.2 Procurement Related Issues

Need Analysis for Hire of Conference Facilities for Report Writing on Vetting of Nominees for the Positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney

3.2.1 Section 45 of the County Governments Act, 2012 stipulates that the Governor shall nominate qualified and experienced County Chief Officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board and with the approval of the County Assembly, appoint County Chief Officers. In this regard, the County Secretary vide letter referenced HB/CTY/CA/VOL.X/(42) dated 5 July, 2021 forwarded to the Speaker of the County Assembly, the nominees for positions of Chief Officers of the following departments.

- 3.2.2 Oral interviews of the nominees for positions of six (6) Chief Officers and the County Attorney were held between 4 August, 2021 and 6 August, 2021 by the Committees of the following departments led by the chairpersons:
 - i) Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries, Food Security and Cooperative Development
 - ii) Education and ICT
 - iii) Energy and Mining
 - iv) Justice, Legal Affairs and Cohesion
 - v) Lands, Housing, Physical Planning and Urban Development
 - vi) Roads, Transport and Public Works
 - vii) Trade, Industrialization and Enterprise Development.
- 3.2.3 On 6 September, 2021, the Chairpersons of the six (6) sectoral Committees and one (1) select Committee wrote to the Clerk of the Homa Bay County Assembly requesting for facilitation for nine (9) days for a report writing exercise in Mombasa from 7 September, 2021 to 15 September, 2021 in accordance with

- Section 9 (1) of Public Appointment (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 which provides that a Committee shall consider a nomination and table its report in the County Assembly for debate and decision.
- 3.2.4 The Audit Team therefore confirmed that the need for conducting interviews for the six (6) nominees for positions of Chief Officers and one (1) nominee of the County Attorney was within the Law.

Review of Approved Procurement Plan for Hire of Conference Facilities for Report Writing on Vetting of Nominees for Positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney

- 3.2.5 The hire of conference facilities was factored in the approved procurement plan for the financial year 2021/2022 under item numbers 156, 157 and 158 and service code namely Conference Facility per person per day at a total estimated cost of Kshs. 2,500,000 as detailed in Table 5 above.
- 3.2.6 However, review of documents provided revealed that there was no justification why the report writing exercise on vetting of nominees for positions of six (6) Chief Officers and County Attorney was not held in a facility within Homa Bay County.
- 3.2.7 As a result, the Audit team confirmed that the County Assembly violated Section VI of the Treasury Circular No. 20/2015 dated 4 November ,2015 that requires the accounting officer to ensure that all workshops and retreats with majority of participants drawn from one duty station are held within the precincts of the duty station
- 3.2.8 According to SRC Compendium of Remuneration and Benefits for Public Service Annexure (x)(d) Sitting Allowances rates for Committee Members in the County Assembly, requires that the Chairperson, Vice Chairperson and members of committee be paid sitting allowances of Kshs. 6,500, Kshs. 5,200 and Kshs, 3,900 each respectively for any committee meetings held at the County Assembly premises.
- 3.2.9 In view of the above, the loss incurred by the County Assembly of Homa Bay for holding the retreat in Mombasa as opposed to the County Assembly premises

amounts to Kshs.12,132,600 as summarized in **Table 7** and detailed at **Appendix II**

Procurement of Conference Facilities for Report Writing on Vetting of Nominees for Positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney

3.2.10 Review of procurement documents provided for audit revealed that on 17 August, 2021, the Homa Bay County Assembly invited three prequalified suppliers (hotels) namely; Pride Inn Flamingo, Serena Beach Resort & SPA and Mombasa Continental Resort to bid through the Request for Quotation No.HBCA/PR/PD/03/2021-2022 for supply of full day conference for 70 persons for five (5) days as required by Section 106(2) of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015.

3.2.11 The three quotations were within the stipulated threshold matrix contained in the second schedule of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Regulations,

- 2020 that states that the maximum level of expenditure for services under use of quotations method is Kshs.3,000,000 per request for quotation.
- 3.2.12 The Clerk of the Homa Bay County Assembly appointed the opening and evaluation committees vide an un-referenced letters dated 23 August, 2021 in line with Sections (78) and (80) of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act 2015.
- 3.2.13 The quotations were opened, evaluated and award done to lowest responsive bidder namely Mombasa Continental Resort at a cost of Kshs.1,050,000 on 24 August, 2021.
- 3.2.14 Both successful and un-successful bidders were notified vide letters referenced HBCA/PR/03/2021-2022 dated 24 August, 2021.
- 3.2.15 The Homa Bay County Assembly issued Local Service Order No.1883194 dated 7 September, 2021 to Mombasa Continental Resort for provision of full day conference services for seventy (70) people for five (5) days at a total cost of Kshs.1,050,000. However, the schedule of the seventy (70) people was not provided for audit.
- 3.2.16 Further, the Audit Team noted that all the three hotels that were invited to quote for the provision of full day conference services were from Mombasa County. It was therefore not clear how the Management of the County Assembly identified Mombasa as the only location for the conference.

3.3 Financial Management and Related Issues

Trip and Actual Attendance by Members of the County Assembly and County Assembly Staff

3.3.1 On 6 September, 2021, the Chairpersons of each of the six (6) sectoral Committees and one (1) select Committee namely Justice, Legal affairs and Cohesion Committee of the County Assembly wrote to the Clerk seeking facilitation for Members of Committees to take part in report writing exercise on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney for nine (9) days in Mombasa from 7 September, 2021 to 15 September, 2021 as shown in Table 9.

- 3.3.2 The request for facilitation by Chairperson of the Education and ICT Committee provided did not include details of Members of the Committee who were to be facilitated for the report writing exercise in Mombasa. Further, the schedule of County Assembly staffs who were to accompany the seven Committees for report writing exercise in Mombasa was also not provided for audit review.
- 3.3.3 In the circumstances, the Audit Team could not ascertain the actual number of MCAs and County Assembly staff who were to be facilitated to attend the report writing exercise in Mombasa.
- 3.3.4 On 06 September, 2021, the Clerk approved the requests by the Chairpersons of the six (6) sectoral Committees and one (1) select Committee for facilitation for

report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney in Mombasa and a total of eighty- eight (88) persons comprising of fifty-one (51) MCAs and thirty-seven County (37) County Assembly staff were issued per diems/daily subsistence allowances amounting to Kshs.12,213,600 as detailed in the Table 10 below and **Appendix III.**

- 3.3.5 Further, the forensic audit could not establish the roles of thirty- seven (37) County Assembly staff who were paid Kshs.4,787,600 to accompany the committee members in the report writing on vetting of six (6) nominees for the position of Chief Officers and a County Attorney nominee. The Audit Team could therefore not confirm the authenticity of the Kshs.4,787,600 spent by the County Assembly Management as detailed in **Appendix III**.
- 3.3.6 In addition, no explanation was provided why a total of eighty-eight (88) persons were issued with imprest amounting to Kshs.12,213,600 to attend the report writing exercise on vetting of nominees for positions of six (6) Chief Officers and County Attorney in Mombasa when procurement of conference facilities was for seventy (70) persons. There was no evidence provided by the County Assembly for audit requesting the Hotel for additional conference facilities to accommodate the additional eighteen (18) persons.
- 3.3.7 The Kshs.12,213,600 comprised of Kshs.10,533,600 and Kshs.1,680,000 paid as daily subsistence allowances and transport allowances respectively as shown in Appendix III. The Kshs.10,533,600 was paid to all the eighty- eight (88) participants at various rates while the Kshs.1,680,000 was paid to eight- four (84) participants excluding one MCA, the Speaker, the speaker's driver and security

- officer. The security officer is on secondment from Ministry of Interior and National Administration at a rate of Kshs.20,000 in accordance with Section 2.2 of the Homa Bay County Assembly Transport Policy, 2019.
- 3.3.8 Out of the Kshs.12,213,600 subsistence allowances and transport paid, a total of Kshs.11,146,400 was paid to seventy-eight (78) persons through the Integrated Financial Management Information System (IFMIS) whereas the balance of Kshs.1,067,200 was paid to ten (10) persons outside IFMIS through the County Assembly's Co-Operative Bank of Kenya Limited and Kenya Commercial Bank Limited bank accounts. The explanation provided was that the ten (10) persons did not have payroll numbers as at the time of the imprest request. However as at the time of audit in September, 2022, the Audit Team confirmed that three (3) out of the ten (10) persons had payroll numbers which were acquired in 2017 and in 2019 contrary to the explanation. The status of the remaining seven (7) payroll numbers could not be confirmed as detailed in **Appendix IV**.
- 3.3.9 The Homa Bay County Assembly issued Local Service Order No.1883194 dated 7 September, 2021 to Mombasa Continental Resort for provision of full day conference services for seventy (70) people for a period of five (5) days at a total cost of Kshs.1,050,000 from 08 September, 2021 to 12 September, 2021.
- 3.3.10 The Management of Homa Bay County Assembly explained that the nine (9) days approved for report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney comprised of five (5) working days in Mombasa and four (4) travelling days for each person from Homa Bay to Mombasa and back to Homa Bay. However, the Audit Team established that the MCAs and County Assembly staff were entitled to eight (8) days being daily subsistence allowances for five (5) days and three (3) days for travelling from Homa Bay to Mombasa and back to Homa Bay.
- 3.3.11 Review of attendance registers for the period 8 September,2021 to 12 September,2021 provided for audit review revealed that the total number of MCAs and County Assembly staff who attended the report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney and signed

attendance registers varied between sixty-seven (67) persons and seventy-three (73) persons as summarized in the Table 11 below and detailed in **Appendix V**.

- 3.3.12 The Audit Team could therefore not ascertain whether a total of twenty-three (23) out of eighty-eight (88) persons who were paid imprest totalling Kshs.2,425,200 to attend the report writing retreat in Mombasa attended the retreat as detailed in **Appendix VI.** In arriving at the Kshs.2,425,200, the Audit Team analysed the attendance lists provided by the Management. However, the Audit Team did not conduct a signature analysis to confirm the authenticity of the respective signatures.
- 3.3.13 In addition, there was no documentary evidence in form of a plan or programme of activities that were to be undertaken by each Committee for the five (5) days in Mombasa contrary to Section 6.6.5 of the Homa Bay County Assembly's Financial Management Policy, 2020.
- 3.3.14 In the circumstances, the Audit Team could not ascertain the actual number of MCAs and County Assembly staff who attended report writing retreat in Mombasa and the nature of activities that were undertaken by the Committees during those days.

Determine whether there were Unbudgeted for, Misclassified, Unsupported and Unrecorded Amounts

- 3.3.15 The Audit Team noted that the Kshs.12,213,600 paid to MCAs and County Assembly staff was properly charged under the approved budget item codes 2210301- Travel costs (airlines, bus, railway, mileage allowance, etc), 2210302- Accommodation- Domestic Travel and 2210303- Daily Subsistence Allowance and 2210304- Sundry items (e.g. airport tax, taxis, etc).
- 3.3.16 The hire of conference facilities for the purposes of report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of six (6) Chief Officers and the County Attorney was budgeted for in the County Assembly's Service Board's recurrent budget amounting to Kshs.1,029,394,205 under Vote Head 5123000500- Committee Services, sub vote 2210800- Hospitality Supplies and Services Boards, Committee, Conferences and Seminars amounting to Kshs.3,500,000.
- 3.3.17 The Kshs.1,050,000 paid by the County Assembly to Mombasa Continental Resort was charged under the approved budget item code 2210802- Boards, Committees, Conferences and Seminars.

Establish Whether Payment of Kshs.1,050,000 to Mombasa Continental Resort was in Line with Laid Down Accounting Procedures or Processes

- 3.3.18 As noted earlier, Homa Bay County Assembly issued Local Service Order No.1883194 dated 7 September, 2021 to Mombasa Continental Resort for provision of conference services for seventy (70) people for a period of five (5) days at a total cost of Kshs.1,050,000 from 08 September, 2021 to 12 September, 2021.
- 3.3.19 Mombasa Continental Resort raised an undated invoice No. 26585 amounting to Kshs.1,050,000 to the Homa Bay County Assembly for provision of conference facilities package for seventy (70) persons at the rate of Kshs. 3,000 per person per day, for five days from 08 September, 2021 to 12 September, 2021. No explanation was provided on why the invoice was not dated.
- 3.3.20 The Homa Bay County Assembly paid Mombasa Continental Resort a total Kshs.1,050,000 in two instalments being payment voucher No. 625 dated 07 September, 2021 for Kshs.390,000 and payment voucher No. 629 dated 10 September, 2021 for Kshs.660,000 respectively. The Kshs.1,050,000 was charged under the approved budget item code 2210802- Boards, Committee's, Conferences and Seminars.
- 3.3.21 The Kshs.1,050,000 was acknowledged by Mombasa Continental Resort through receipt No.17199 dated 10 September, 2021.
- 3.3.22 The Audit Team, through the Clerk of the County Assembly, made several attempts to engage the Hotel Management and to review records maintained by the Hotel Management relating to the report writing exercise. However, there was no response from both the County Assembly and hotel Management.

Whether there were any Irregularities in Management and Payment of Conference Facilities and Daily Subsistence Allowances

3.3.23 As mentioned earlier, the Homa Bay County Assembly paid Mombasa Continental Resort a total Kshs.1,050,000 in two instalments through payment voucher No. 625 dated 07 September, 2021 for Kshs.390,000 and payment voucher No. 629 dated 10 September, 2021 for Kshs.660,000 respectively. The

- Kshs.1,050,000 was charged under the approved budget item code 2210802-Boards, Committee's, Conferences and Seminars.
- 3.3.24 The Mombasa Continental Resort acknowledged receipt of the Kshs.1,050,000 through receipt No.17199 dated 10 September 2021. However, the payment voucher for the Kshs.1,050,000 for the provision of conference services was not supported by documents, including daily expenditure schedules indicating the number of persons who were attended to and services offered to them. The Audit Team could therefore not confirm whether the Kshs.1,050,000 was utilized as intended.
- 3.3.25 Review of the attendance registers and imprest surrender vouchers revealed that the eighty- eight (88) persons comprising of fifty-one (51) MCAs and thirty- seven (37) County Assembly staff who were involved in report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of six (6) Chief Officers and County Attorney in Mombasa were entitled to payment of daily subsistence allowances for eight (8) days being three (3) days for travelling from Homa Bay to Mombasa and back to Homa Bay and five (5) days for report writing and not nine (9) days that were approved by the Clerk on 6 September 2021 as per the approved imprest application and subsequently paid to MCAs and County Assembly staff as shown in **Table 12**.

- 3.3.26 As a result, all the fifty-one (51) MCAs and thirty- seven (37) County Assembly staff were overpaid daily subsistence allowances by one day, amounting to Kshs.1,170,400 as detailed in **Appendix VII.**
- 3.3.27 The Kshs.1,170,400 was therefore not utilized by the members and County Assembly staff and ought to have been surrendered by the Applicants as stipulated in Section 6.6.4 (b) of the Homa Bay County Assembly's Financial Management Policy, 2020, which states that Applicant returns unutilized imprest funds to the cash office and a receipt is issued.
- 3.3.28 The Homa Bay County Assembly did not maintain an updated imprest registers contrary to Section 93(4)(c) of the Public Finance Management (County Governments) Regulations, 2015 which states that the Accounting Officer will ensure that the Applicants' imprest has been recorded in the imprest registers including the amount applied for. As a result, the total imprest amounting to Kshs.12,213,600 issued to fifty- one (51) MCAs and thirty -seven (37) County Assembly staff was not recorded in the imprest registers.
- 3.3.29 The Audit Team noted that Members of County Assembly and County Assembly staff accounted for imprest using claim for travel and subsistence allowances vouchers instead of payment vouchers and imprest surrender forms contrary to Section 12.0 of the Homa Bay County Assembly's Financial Management Policy, 2020 under appendices 1 and 2.
- 3.3.30 All the claims for travel and subsistence allowances vouchers amounting to Kshs.12,213,600 provided for audit were not examined by the accountant for completeness and accuracy and authorized by the AIE holder as actual expenditure contrary to Section 6.6.4 (c) of the Homa Bay County Assembly's Financial Management Policy, 2020.
- 3.3.31 Section 6.6.5 of the Homa Bay County Assembly's Financial Management Policy, 2020 states that appropriate surrender of imprest includes a duly completed and authorized imprest surrender form, applicant's copy of imprest warrant and actual (authentic) expenditure.
- 3.3.32 The claims for travel and subsistence allowances vouchers provided for audit were supported by taxi receipts only contrary to Section 6.6.5 (5) of the Homa

Bay County Assembly's Financial Management Policy, 2020 which outlines supporting documentation for daily subsistence allowances for local travel as: approved invitations/ facilitation letters, Attendance registers/sheets, Agenda/Program, travel documents, approved work tickets, back to office reports and Certificates (in case of training).

Refund of Imprest for Report Writing on Vetting of Nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney

- 3.3.33 On 4 February, 2022, the EACC vide letter reference EACC.KSI 6/16/43 Vol II (15) wrote to the Clerk of the Homa Bay County Assembly stating that there were irregular payments made to MCAs and staff during report writing for vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney in Mombasa.
- 3.3.34 The letter further, stated that those willing to make the necessary refunds have to deposit the same in the Commission's Asset Recovery Account held at Kenya Commercial Bank Ltd and the Clerk was to forward to the Commission, proof of all such deposits.
- 3.3.35 The Management of Homa Bay County Assembly explained that various meetings were held between EACC officials and the affected MCAs and County Assembly Staff and it was during these meetings that the amount that was to be refunded by each person was arrived at.
- 3.3.36 A schedule of amounts refunded by MCAs and County Assembly staff as at 22 September, 2022 provided by the EACC and Management of Homa Bay County Assembly revealed that a total of twenty-five (25) Members of County Assembly and five (5) County Assembly staff refunded a total of Kshs.1,559,500 comprising of Kshs.1,413,500 and Kshs.146,000 made to the EACC's Asset Recovery Account held at Kenya Commercial Bank Limited and at Homa Bay County Assembly CBK's account respectively as summarised in Table 13 and detailed in Appendix VIII.

- 3.3.37 However, the Audit Team could not establish the basis of arriving at the Kshs.1,559,500 refunded by the respective MCAs and County Assembly staff. In addition, the bank statements for the two bank accounts were not provided for audit.
- 3.3.38 Further, based on the documents provided, the Audit Team confirmed Kshs.3,958,300 in respect to expected refunds from various officers resulting to Kshs.2,398.800 as outstanding refunds.
- 3.3.39 The Kshs.3,958,300 comprised of Kshs.3,385,600 on computed refunds and Kshs.572,700 on variances between computed refunds of Kshs.338,800 and actual refunds of Kshs.911,500 from eighteen (18) persons. The Kshs.572,700 is considered as self-confirmed evidence of additional unspent balance which supersedes computed refunds.

4 IRREGULARITIES, WEAKNESSES AND MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITY

4.1 The following were irregularities and weaknesses observed during the audit and the corresponding recommendations.

5 CONCLUSION

- 5.1 The objective of the forensic audit was to confirm or dispel allegations on irregular payment of conference facilities and daily subsistence allowances to MCAs and County Assembly staff for report writing on vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney.
- 5.2 The need for vetting of nominees for positions of Chief Officers and County Attorney arose following compliance with Section 45 of the County Governments Act, 2012 which stipulates that the Governor shall nominate qualified and experienced County Chief Officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board.
- 5.3 Eighty-eight (88) persons comprising of fifty-one (51) MCAs and thirty-seven (37) County staff were paid Kshs.12,213,600 for daily subsistence and travel allowances and Kshs 1,050,000 was paid for hire of conference services in Mombasa, all totaling Kshs.13,263,600. No justification was provided by the Management why the retreat was not held in compliance with the Treasury Circular No. 20/2015.
- 5.4 Anomalies noted by the Audit Team included;
 - Failure to hold report writing retreats in accordance with Section VI of Treasury Circular No. 20/2015,
 - ii) Failure to provide details of the seventy (70) persons the conference facilities was procured for,
 - iii) Overpayment of daily subsistence allowances by Kshs.1,170,400 for nine(9) days instead of eight (8) days,
 - iv) Issuing imprest to some Members of County Assembly and County Assembly staff outside Integrated Financial Management Information System (IFMIS),
 - Payment of Kshs.2,425,200 to persons who did not sign the attendance registers,
 - vi) Failure to maintain an updated imprest registers,

- vii) Absence of supporting documents and
- viii) Outstanding imprest refunds amounting to Kshs. 2,398,800.
