7. **QUESTIONS AND STATEMENTS**

**a) Statement pursuant to Standing Order 52(1)**

Nominated Senator (Sen. Crystal Asige, MP) made a statement on commemoration of the World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims, observed on the 19<sup>th</sup> of November in every year.

In the Statement, the Senator conveyed deep concern over the global impact of road crashes, highlighting that according to the UN Global Road Safety Week report, submitted in May, 2023, over 1.35 million lives are lost annually worldwide due to road traffic accidents. The Senator further highlighted that of particular importance, is the distressing impact of road crashes on individuals aged between 5 and 29 years old.

Making reference to the local context, the Senator observed that a report by the Ministry of Roads and Transport revealed that 20,907 lives had been lost to road crashes in Kenya over the past six years, with an additional 2,319 casualties recorded in the current year. The Senator underscored the alarming fact that 90% of these accidents were attributed to human error, and called for immediate attention to this sobering reality. The Senator observed that despite global efforts to achieve the UN Sustainable Development Goal of reducing road traffic deaths by 50% by 2030, the Senator expressed dissatisfaction with the progress, deeming it inadequate.

The Senator urged for collaboration among stakeholders to address the concerning trend of increasing road fatalities in Kenya. She emphasized the need for a responsive legal system, incorporating comprehensive policy and legislative framework, particularly in road design and safety education. Additionally, the Senator announced sponsorship of amendments to various road-related legislation, seeking the support of the House to fortify roads and ensure the safety of citizens.
