- 1. The Senate assembled at thirty Minutes past Nine O'clock.

5. **QUESTIONS AND STATEMENTS**

QUESTIONS

- a) **Question 018** by the Senator for Turkana County (Sen. James Lomenen, MP) to the Prime Cabinet Secretary and Cabinet Secretary for Foreign and Diaspora Affairs on Inaction of the Kenyan Government to hasten the release of the Turkana pastoralists arrested in Uganda was <u>deferred</u> in the absence of the Cabinet Secretary.
- b) Question 059 by the Senator for Kirinyaga County (Sen. James Murango, MP) to the Cabinet Secretary for Energy and Petroleum on delayed repair and replacement of defective power transformers in Mwea Constituency, Kirinyaga County was <u>deferred</u> in the absence of the Cabinet Secretary.
- c) **Question 067** by the Senator for Meru County (Sen. Kathuri Murungi, MGH, MP) to the Cabinet Secretary for National Treasury and Economic Planning on the delay in the disbursement of funds to the National Health Insurance Fund which <u>was referred to the Cabinet</u>

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<u>Secretary for Health</u> was <u>deferred</u> in the absence of the Cabinet Secretary.

- d) **Question 074** by the Senator for Kisii County (Sen. Richard Onyonka, MP) to the Cabinet Secretary for Energy and Petroleum on terms of the Government-to-Government (G-to-G) agreement for the supply of fuel between Kenya and the Gulf countries was <u>deferred</u> in the absence of the Cabinet Secretary.
